

'THE PROCESS WORKS:' TARIFF REFUNDS SLOW, BUT MONEY IS BEING PAID BACK TO AMERICAN BUYERS

When Matt Dorman spent 3,240,000 guineas on eight yearling fillies at last year's Tattersalls October Book 1, he pretty much accepted that he'd never again see the 10-15% tariffs he paid on the horses again.

The tariffs, a result of Donald Trump's invocation of the International Emergency Economic Powers Act (IEEPA) to implement taxes on goods being imported from foreign countries in 2025, included a 10-percent rate.

COLLECTED'S CALIFORNIAN MISSION IN THE COLLECTIVE INTEREST

A fairly quirky notion, perhaps, but let's just give it a little rein. Because it was in California that Collected reached his peak on the racetrack, including when beaten only by the Horse of the Year in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic; and it is also in California that he has been making his name in his second career. Is it conceivable, then, that his stock may be inheriting some aptitude peculiarly adapted to the demands of the West Coast theater?

Regardless, his cumulative resonance among Californian breeders certainly gives a lot of credibility to his transfer last winter from Kentucky to Rancho San Miguel. And the way he's been going in the meantime makes Collected look like some overdue good news for a state whose many talented and persevering horsemen surely feel demoralized by remorseless negativity about their future.

Among the stallions to have launched their first runners in 2022 only *Justify*, so prolific either side of the Atlantic, can beat Collected's cumulative 24 stakes winners--and Collected (6.7 percent) can very nearly match the \$200,000 Ashford cover (7.2 percent) when expressing those winners as a ratio of named foals.

The figure was levied on goods coming from the U.K., while 15 percent was assessed on other European Union countries.

That meant that American buyers at the 2025 European yearling and mixed sales who planned to bring their European purchases home would have to pay a tax of 10-15 percent on their purchases, depending upon whether they were English- or Irish-bred.

But when the Supreme Court ruled that the IEEPA did not grant the president the power to impose those taxes, the administration was forced to begin the repayment of \$166 billion in tariffs illegally collected from businesses.

Dorman was one of the first in line to apply for a refund of his money.

Imagine his delight when—just seven to eight weeks later—he was informed by his shipping agent, Mersant's President Chuck Santarelli, that he had received the first of the wires from the government that would ultimately total over a half-million dollars.

Dorman and his agent, David Ingordo, had made it a plan to go to Tattersalls to purchase and bring back fillies who would ultimately join his broodmare band. They did so despite knowing that they would pay a tariff.

"We're in it for the long term, and building out a quality broodmare band is our goal," said Dorman. "So the reason, point blank, for going was to get some of those European bloodlines back over here. There are some great stallions here, but there are also great stallions there, and as, as the breeding gets tighter over here, having those outcrosses, I think, is really important."

Dorman and his Determined Stables have campaigned **Citizen Bull** and Rodriguez in partnership with SF Racing, are the breeders of Grade II Santa Margarita winner Seismic Beauty, and campaigned homebred stakes winners Determined Driver and Determined Kingdom.

At Tattersalls, Dorman purchased fillies by **No Nay Never**, Too Darn Hot (GB), **Sea The Stars (Ire)**, Blue Point (Ire), **Frankel (GB)**, Baaed (GB), and Lope de Vega (Ire).

"I'm a fan of turf racing for various reasons," he said. "And so I don't mind bringing pedigrees that are a little turfy back over here. I think there's plenty of opportunity. David Ingordo has played a big role in this. I think we both came to it from similar viewpoints. The tariffs, believe it or not, limited what we did. But there were some really good horses and we just figured, you know, let's go ahead and get the horses. If we were right 50 percent of the time, that would be

great and the tariffs won't matter in the long run."

When the Supreme Court overturned the tariffs, said Dorman, "I was fairly happy, but I knew that it was going to take a long time. I contacted the entity and the individual that we used to handle all the importing, Chuck Santarelli. I asked him if I had to fill out forms or do whatever. And he said no, they would handle it."

"We have applied for the tariffs on behalf of any horse we imported from April 25, 2025 through February 24, 2026," said Santarelli. "Anybody that imported a horse, we unilaterally decided to apply on their behalf."

Think About It!

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One day this spring, watching his stepson's baseball game, he got the call that the first wire would arrive the following day. Both he and Santarelli were surprised at the speed of the refund.

Santarelli said that they had so far collected \$1.5 million on behalf of their clients, but that the speed of Dorman's refund wasn't the norm. "I currently have 12 uploads that still have not been processed, representing quite a bit of money. I have people asking me what's going on, but we haven't had one entry liquidated since May 18." And, said Santarelli, information from the government is hard to come by.

After the Supreme Court decision, Trump imposed global 10 percent import surcharges, which are set to expire July 24, before the Aug. 15-17 Arqana August Yearling Sale, or the fall Goffs and Tattersalls Yearling Sales. Santarelli said that he is doubtful that there won't be a tariff to replace them. The administration has already launched investigations under Section 301 of the Trade Act of 1974, which authorizes tariffs on goods from countries "engaged in unjustifiable, unreasonable, or discriminatory trade practices." It is possible that the current 10% global tariff will be replaced with Section 301 tariffs.

Until then, said Dorman, the refunds will only further more trade in the industry, musing that he would have potentially bought another horse or two with the half-million he paid in tariffs. He said that he and Ingordo would be back at the European sales this year. Ingordo added that the refunds, "are helping to open the doors to re-investment."

But first, you need to take the steps to ask for them.

"I just would encourage people to contact whoever does the importing for you and work with them, make sure they have all the information," said Dorman. "It's just reversing the transaction. There wasn't a whole lot of pain."

"It's good for the industry for people to know they're going to get the money back," he said. "It's good for the industry over in Europe for folks to know that the process works. It may go slowly, but it does work."

Among others to have excelled sufficiently to retail at much higher fees, **Good Magic** has 22 black-type winners at 4.7 percent; **Oscar Performance**, **Army Mule** and **Bolt d'Oro** all have 21, respectively at 6.4, 5.6 and 3.9 percent; and **City of Light**, 19

at 4.6 percent. And this is a stallion that retired to Airdrie at \$17,500, has been available at \$10,000 for the past three years, and was introduced to his new market at \$7,500.

Much as Collected did himself, moreover, his flagship talents similarly seem to be thriving with maturity--to the extent that he has just celebrated a breakout Grade I scorer, the 4-year-old Thought Process having won her fourth graded stakes in the Gamely Stakes at Santa Anita May 25. Even since then, moreover, the 5-year-old **Pass the Hat** has become Collected's eighth graded stakes winner in the GIII Poker Stakes.

"Pass the Hat is a perfect example," remarks Tom Clark, owner of Rancho San Miguel. "That was the first graded stakes he's been in. It was only his 10th race and he's just starting to get good. And I think the best days for Thought Process are ahead of her, too. I think she could be any kind this year."

"But really I think Collected's main attribute is his flexibility. His horses can run on synthetic, on turf, on dirt. You see them running short, long. He's getting a lot of good milers, with both speed and stamina. In California we rarely run past a mile-and-16th, and half the time on the grass, which I do think fits the profile of his offspring pretty well."

It was on Californian dirt, however, that Collected himself got on his defining roll, winning a graded stakes by 14 lengths before turning over Arrogate himself in the GI Pacific Classic and then beating all bar **Gun Runner** at the Breeders' Cup.

That familiarity was one of the reasons Clark was interested in bringing the horse down US-101.

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"He was a well-known, proven commodity here," Clark says. "And we were looking for a proven stallion to add to our roster. So we spoke to Bret [Jones, Airdrie president] and he was open to the idea. And you really have to compliment Bret, and his vision, in that a lot of his motivation was to support the California horse economy. His belief is that if California fails, Kentucky will also suffer greatly. And he felt that this was a way in which he could make a statement, that the Kentucky people really need to look at this as a national sport and not just one localized to them."

Which is why the migration of Collected is no merely parochial tale. For there's no doubt that many of those contesting the rich purses nowadays within reach of Kentucky are culpably insular about the predicament of California. The fact is that no line of trenches can ever be given up without

bringing the gunfire closer. With such an affluent demographic on the doorstep of storied Santa Anita and Del Mar, nobody further east can afford to be complacent about California's

vicious circle of diminishing purses, fields and handle.

Unsurprisingly, a crucial contribution to the Collected deal was made by one of the Californian Turf's most reliable patriots in Marsha Naify.

"It's a lease arrangement," explains Clark. "The horse is owned by a syndicate, obviously including Airdrie and also Speedway who raced him. We wanted to buy the horse, but that group did not want to sell--which we found very encouraging, too! Instead we had the

opportunity to lease him for a period of time, and Marsha and ourselves went 50-50 in doing that. She's a loyal client of Rancho San Miguel and we've been good friends for years. **Cont.**

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"We were just thrilled that Bret was willing to work with us, and it really has paid off. We got a great response from the client base. So we benefited, Airdrie benefited, and the state of California has benefited from their willingness to do this."

And, actually, Collected has benefited too. He entertained over 90 mares this spring, and we all know that commercial breeders in the Bluegrass tend to neglect stallions that valiantly outpunch their fee in favor of glossy newcomers.

"In terms of breeding to race, that's affecting the industry everywhere, including Kentucky," Clark observes. "So even a horse as incredibly productive as Collected can get a little bit lost, because he's out there four or five years and everybody's looking for the new stallions coming along, with so much money being focused on the resale market for yearlings and 2-year-olds. But for us,

that created an opportunity. And we probably ended up getting more mares to him than he would have received in Kentucky."

It must be acknowledged that the commercial odds against Collected, in Kentucky, were compounded by the fact that he was not particularly built for the kind of people who are candidly more interested in breeding for the sales dais than the winner's circle.

"We tell people he's a typical City Zip," Clark says. "He's not too tall, 16 hands at best. But to me, great things come in smaller packages. And he's not small, that would be the wrong way to put it. He has great balance, a beautiful head. He's very correct, good bone, short fetlocks. He has a big hip on him, a broad shoulder, and is just very athletic. We were really impressed when he came. He just has a presence about him. He's very smart, doesn't abuse himself. **Cont.**

"He's very good in the shed, just a gentleman to be around, very kind and easygoing," he said. "And we really think he's passing along that good mind, and that athleticism, to a lot of his babies."

Clark's belief is infectious. He certainly doesn't sound like a man prepared to wave the white flag for California. In that context, then, he deserves the opportunity to clarify he recently put his farm on the market.

"That was not a statement about the industry in California," he emphasizes. "It's more a personal thing. I'm 71 years old. We have no heirs to take over the farm and we're really looking for someone to maintain and build upon what we've done to date. We have 25 employees, well over 50 people living on the farm. Most of them have been with us a long time, they're very loyal and really care about their horses. We want them to maintain their livelihoods and their lives."

"So we're really trying to make sure that there's a future for Rancho San Miguel. We don't want to end up like Harris Farm, where Mr. Harris passed away and the farm shut down and people lost jobs. Really the better way of putting it that we're just looking for a strategic partner, to build upon the vision that we've had for the last 25 years. We're in a very good location, halfway between San Francisco and Los Angeles and only about 25 miles from the ocean. So we get cool breezes at night and it's a great environment for Thoroughbreds, with rolling hills and good soil."

Naturally the 250-acre site could be adaptable to other breeds, and Clark's main priority is that it is never plowed over to become yet another vineyard or housing project. But his ardent hope is that the farm will prosper along with a Thoroughbred industry that rallies both within and around its Californian heritage.

"I'm hoping that there's a turnaround, that there are changes

that allow the industry to last and grow," he says. "We need some regulatory support, first and foremost, in the state of California. But I don't think we can do it alone. We need more incentives for people to breed to race, and that all starts with purses. So we've got to find ways in which those purses can be enhanced, whether that means historical racing machines or something of that nature. But it's as an industry that we need to pull together--trainers, racetracks, owners, breeders, farms--and as one unified group try to make our case and build a cohesive strategy going forward."

Pending that kind of collective endeavor, however, he is grateful at least to have those of Collected.

"We think we have an outstanding roster here," Clark says proudly. "From Sir Prancealot to young stallions like Brickyard Ride, Editorial, Mo Forza. With horses like that, we think we've a great future ahead of us. We just need client support, and state and industry support, to help maintain and grow the business. But we're very optimistic about the future."

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BISHOPS BAY RETURNS TO JERSEY SHORE FOR SALVATOR MILE TITLE DEFENSE

Bishops Bay (Uncle Mo) will be back to defend his title in Saturday's GIII Salvator Mile S., one of four stakes races on Monmouth Park's 10-race Haskell Preview Day card.

After bringing \$1.3 million from advisor Pedro Lanz on behalf of the Saudi-based KAS Stables at last year's Keeneland November sale, the 'TDN Rising Star, presented by Hagyard' was a game winner of the GII Cigar Mile H. Dec. 6 in his first start for his new connections.

A respectable fourth in the G1 Saudi Cup Feb. 14, the Brad Cox-trained 6-year-old followed with a second-place finish as the 4-5 favorite in the GIII Westchester S. May 3.

"We're looking to get him back in the win column," said Blake Cox, who serves as an assistant to his dad, Brad Cox. "He looks to us like he is as good as he was last year. We're really trying to get him going again and this looked like a good spot to get started on that."

The 9-5 morning-line favorite will face 2024 GI Claiborne Breeders' Futurity winner and 'Rising Star' **East Avenue** (Medaglia d'Oro) and GIII Ghostzapper S. winner **Grande** (Curlin). The duo finished fourth and sixth in the GII Alysheba S. at Churchill Downs May 1, respectively.

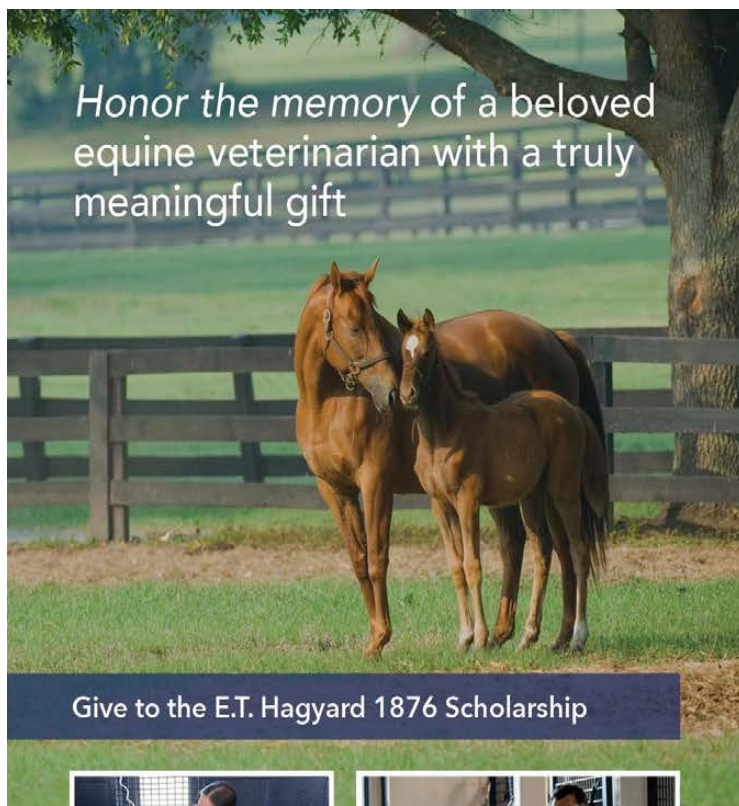
The Monmouth Park program also includes the GIII Eatontown S., headed by the race's 2025 winner and 8-5 morning-line favorite **Whiskey Decision** (Into Mischief); the NYRA Bets Pegasus S., the final local prep for the GI NYRA Bets Haskell S. July 18; and the grassy Monmouth S.

After winning last year's Pegasus with Bracket Buster (Vekoma), BBN Racing will look to put them back to back with the rail-drawn **National Charter** (Constitution), an impressive maiden winner going a one-turn mile at second asking for Rusty Arnold at Churchill Downs May 23.

"We really like this horse," BBN Racing's Bo Bromagen said. "He took a little while to come around, but he's always shown a lot of talent and ability."

"Very excited to see what he can do stepping up against stakes company," he added. "There are some nice horses in the race, but we think we fit well. He's coming back pretty quick since his last race, but he came out of it very strongly. Hopefully, we can repeat Bracket Buster's performance last year and win back to back in the Pegasus."

The field of six is headed by 8-5 morning-line favorite **Schoolyardsuperman** (**Practical Joke**), a big-figure runner-up for Chad Brown in an optional claimer at the Big A Mar. 29.

Sophomore fillies, meanwhile, will be in the spotlight in Saturday's GIII Delaware Oaks, GIII Summertime Oaks at Santa Anita and Monomoy Girl S. at Churchill Downs.

After placing in five straight stakes, including a runner-up effort in the GII Eight Belles S. May 1, **Luv Your Neighbor** (**Constitution**) will look to break through in the Delaware Oaks.

The Bob Baffert-trained **Mizumi** (**Justify**), a debut winner with a field-best 85 Beyer Speed Figure going 6 1/2 furlongs at Santa Anita May 2, is the 4-5 program favorite for her two-turn debut in the Summertime Oaks. She will face **Marjoram** (**Quality Road**), who returns to dirt following a last-to-first win sprinting in the grassy GIII Senorita S. May 9.

The Monomoy Girl is headlined by GI Central Bank Ashland S. winner and 'Rising Star' **Percy's Bar** (**Upstart**), a disappointing seventh in the GI Kentucky Oaks.

Saturday's graded stakes action also includes the GIII Robert G. Dick Memorial S. at Delaware Park and the GIII Daytona S. at Santa Anita. The 12-race Delaware Park program also features the \$300,000 Delaware Derby.

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MEDAGLIA D'ORO COLT SHARES FRIDAY BULLET AT OBS

A colt by the now-pensioned Darley heavyweight Medaglia d'Oro (**hip 824**) was one of two to share the fastest furlong time during Friday's penultimate breeze day ahead of next week's Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's June 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale.

Now named Bulmaro, this half-brother to MSP Naughty Lottie (Midnight Lute) was bred in Kentucky by the partnership of Jason Hall, Herschel Martindale, Joe Wheeler and David Branch and is consigned in Florida by Marcial Galan as agent. He shared a bullet in :9 4/5.

"Obviously the Medaglia d'Oro credential speaks for itself," co-breeder Jason Hall told OBS after the work. "The mare was one we claimed in West Virginia, she comes from a great big family and she won quite a few races for us after the claim. We've loved this colt from Day 1. About halfway through the winter, he bumped his forearm maybe just on a water bucket and developed a hematoma but that developed some bony growth and we had to go in and do surgery. So this colt has missed three months of training over the winter and he still did what he did today. So we're very pleased with him."

First dam Scarlet Emerald, who earned over \$159,000 on the track herself, is a half-sister to the dam of classy Florida-bred GSW Cookie Dough (Brethren).

"We think he would have stood out even in March or April," Hall continued. "But now that he was pushed back to June, I just think he's going to be a huge rockstar in this sale. Hopefully the buying public feels the same."

Medaglia d'Oro, while pensioned late last year, remains in the headlines this summer as the sire of dual-champion filly Nitrogen.

"You know he's been an elite, athletic looking foal from Day 1," said Hall. "I can't remember a phase that he went through where he wasn't a standout. He has a little bit more in the hind quarters and gaskin than a lot of the Medaglia d'Oro's do and that comes from his mother who was a pure sprinter. I think he's brought the best of both worlds to the table with Medaglia d'Oro's stretch and cardio and ability to get two turns and with a healthy dose of speed from his mother."

Also working in :9 4/5 was a filly by Yaupon ([hip 637](#)) consigned by Grade One Investments LLC.

A second pair was responsible for the fastest quarter-mile with 2-year-olds by [Aloha West \(hip 658\)](#) and [Tiz the Law \(hip 769\)](#) sharing the :20 4/5 bullet.

The under-tack show concludes Saturday with the final session beginning at 7:30 a.m. The OBS June sale will be held next Tuesday through Thursday. Bidding begins each day at 10:30 a.m.

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'LEXINGTON' AUTHOR KIM WICKENS ON BOUNDLESS

In the latest episode of The Boundless Podcast, Dr. Ferrin Peterson sits down with author Kim Wickens to discuss her acclaimed book *Lexington* and the decade-long journey behind bringing one of racing's most influential Thoroughbreds back into focus. The episode was taped at Airdrie Stud, Lexington's original home.

Wickens, a former criminal defense attorney turned author, shares how a passing curiosity about a horse she had never heard of evolved into a 10-year research pursuit spanning archives, libraries, historic racetracks, and hundreds of primary sources. That work ultimately became the national bestseller *Lexington*, a deeply researched account of the legendary stallion and the broader historical landscape surrounding him which garnered Wickens a Pulitzer Prize nomination.

The conversation explores not only Lexington's impact on American Thoroughbred history, but also the forgotten figures and stories tied to his era, including Civil War-era Kentucky, horsemen of the 19th century, and overlooked pioneers such as Abe Hawkins and Richard Ten Broeck. Wickens reflects on the parallels between legal practice and historical writing, emphasizing discipline, persistence and investigative rigor. **Cont.**

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JOCKEY COREY LANERIE TO RETIRE FOLLOWING CHURCHILL DOWNS SPRING MEET

Jockey Corey Lanerie will call it a career at the conclusion of the Churchill Downs spring meet Sunday, June 28 following 35 years in the saddle, the track announced Friday.

Lanerie will leave the sport having totaled more than 5,000 victories and earning north of \$172-million in prize money with at least 1,244 wins at Churchill alone. The mark ties him in second all-time behind Hall of Famer Pat Day, who claims 2,482 trips to the winner's enclosure in the shadow of the Twin Spires.

The Louisiana native began his career at Evangeline Downs in 1991, and secured his first win Apr. 19 that year aboard High Hopes Banquet (Banquet Table) for trainer Charles Delahoussaye. Lanerie would go on to success that included riding titles at Churchill, Ellis Park, Lone Star, Retama Park, and Sam Houston Race Park. His landmark 5000th career win came in April 2023 at Keeneland--a feat achieved by only 39 riders in North America.

Partner to several elite-level runners, Lanerie claimed three editions of the GI Ashland Stakes, his last being in 2017 with Sailor's Valentine (Mizzen Mast), and ran second that year in the GI Kentucky Derby aboard Lookin At Lee (Lookin at Lucky). He guided Cherry Wine to a runner-up finish in the 2016 GI Preakness Stakes after finishing third aboard the son of Paddy O'Prado in the GI Toyota Blue Grass Stakes the race prior. Other Grade I wins include the GI Derby City Distaff aboard Bell's the One (Majesticperfection) and the GI La Troienne Stakes with Molly Morgan (Ghostzapper) in the final start of her career.

The jockey found a fruitful home at Churchill since his first win at the venue in 2000. Behind only Pat Day's remarkable mark of 34, Lanerie claims 19 leading rider titles beneath the Twin Spires.

"I've been fortunate to do this for more than 35 years and make a living doing something I truly love," Lanerie said. "When I started riding as a kid in Louisiana, I never dreamed I'd win more than 5,000 races or have the opportunities I've had. I'm so grateful for everyone who's helped me get where I am today."

ROBERT B. LEWIS WINNER PLUTARCH BACK ON THE TAB AT SANTA ANITA

Plutarch (Into Mischief) worked for the first time Friday since winning the GIII Robert B. Lewis for 3-year-olds Feb. 7. He was timed going four furlongs 49.6 seconds at 'The Great Race Place.'

Trained by Bob Baffert, the colt out of champion Stellar Wind (**Curlin**) exited the Lewis with 'body soreness' that limited him to only light training prior to Friday's work.

Plutarch **won the Lewis by 3/4 length**. It was his first stakes victory. As a 2-year-old, Plutarch most notably finished third in the GI **American Pharoah** at Santa Anita.

Also working on the comeback trail for Baffert was **Gaming** (Game Winner). Not seen since last fall when he finished third in the Tokyo City Cup Stakes, the 4-year-old colt drilled five furlongs in 1:00.2. It was his sixth work since May 8.

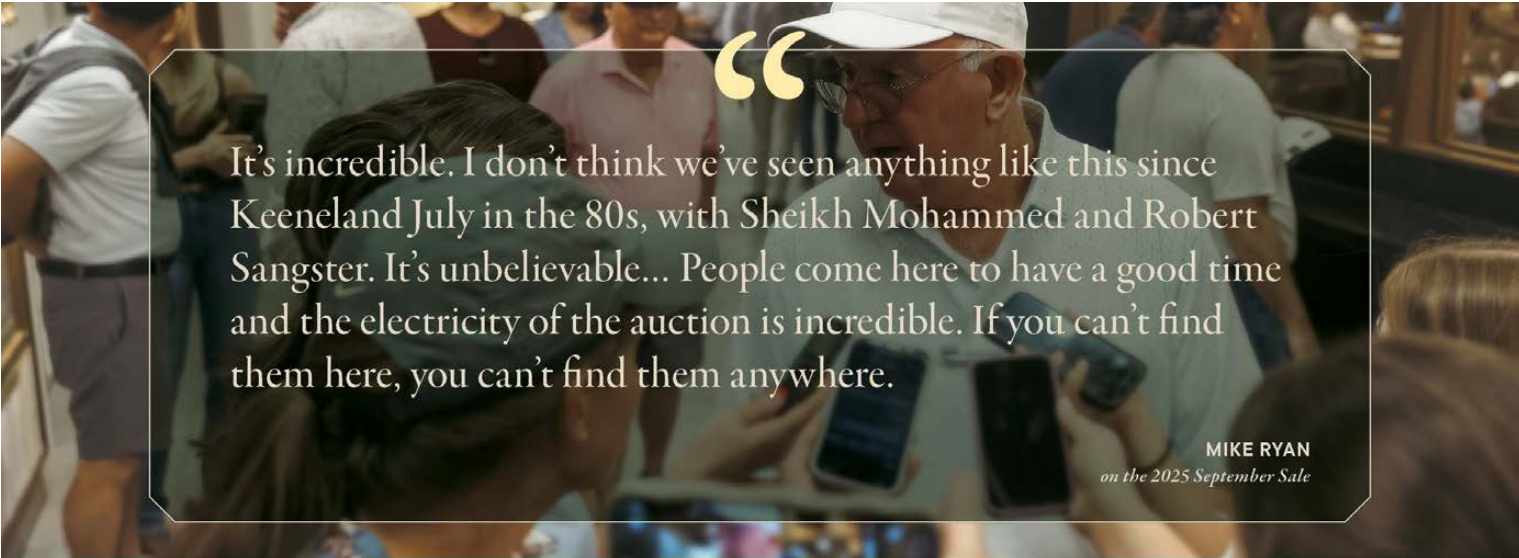

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EARLY VOTING'S BALLOTEER GOES GATE TO WIRE FOR 'RISING STAR' HONORS

All the buzz was on the highly-anticipated debut of the Flightline colt **Greenwell**, but it was **Balloteer** (**Early Voting**) who sped to the lead and never looked back to earn 'TDN Rising Star, presented by Hagyard' honors at Churchill.

Catching a flier out of the gate, the juvenile sped out to control the tempo through :22.43 and four panels in :45.06 coming off the bend, and entered the stretch with a clear advantage over even-money favorite Greenwell. Racing greenly on his left lead through the lane, Balloteer managed to keep all challengers at bay by two lengths on the line in a final time of :57 flat. Greenwell was a well-beaten second after inexperience also caught up with him.

Balloteer is a half-brother to Quick Release (Trappe Shot), GSP, \$199,677, who has since gone on to become a multiple winner producer in her second career as a broodmare. The victor also claims six other winning half-siblings, and is the last registered offspring for Just Joking after she missed a 2025 breeding and her 2026 Taiba was stillborn.

This is the female line of champion sprinter Safely Kept, whose daughters went on to create a branch of her family which yielded the likes of MGSW & GISP Venetian Harbor (**Munnings**). It is also the distant female family of GSW & GISP Santiva.

Early Voting has had a sensational start to his stallion career as Balloteer becomes his third 'Rising Star' and fourth winner from six starters. The GI Preakness Stakes hero is represented by his first juveniles this year.

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KENNYTEN A FIRST 'TDN RISING STAR' FOR DRAIN THE CLOCK

A pair of OBS March graduates lined up side by side in the gate at Santa Anita Friday but it was the longer shot of the two, 8-1 third choice **Kennyten** (**Drain the Clock**), who earned his diploma en route to becoming his freshman sire's (by **Maclean's Music**)

second winner and first 'TDN Rising Star, presented by Hagyard'.

Bred in Kentucky by Nicholas Lotz and just a \$20,000 Keeneland September yearling, Kannyten impressed in Florida earlier this year, selling to Holly and David Wilson for \$140,000 after breezing his furlong in :10.

Drawn outside his main rival, he had a naturally faster gear away from the gate, out-sprinting the 1-5 favorite and \$850,000 OBS March purchase for Zedan Racing Stables Nayar (**Tiz the Law**) to secure early position on the lead.

Once clear on the rail under jockey Ricardo Gonzalez, Kannyten set the cruise control and dared the three rivals closest to him to try and keep up. Calumet Farm runner Billy Goat (Vekoma) managed to stay alongside past the quarter pole and Nayar tipped out from third to try his luck but both runners failed to make an impact as Kannyten ran these colts off their feet through the final sixteenth, winning stylishly by 7 1/2 lengths while Gonzalez hardly drew his stick.

Nayar was a clear second and a further 6 1/2-lengths ahead of Boss Man Bolt (Bolt d'Oro) who came from last to finish third.

"We knew he was fast, didn't [know] if he was fit enough," trainer Vladimir Cerin told the TDN. "I was wrong! Michael McCarthy bought him for Holly and David Wilson. Michael has become such a force in thoroughbred racing, not only as a future Hall of Famer but also as someone who can buy yearlings, 2-year-olds and older horses with great success."

Bred in Kentucky by Nicholas Lotz, Kannyten is the second to the races and first winner for his Goldencents first dam. Owner Tony O'Gorman is adamant that Britannia Stakes-bound Bobby McGee (Mayson) is a Group horse in the making and says only "strong money" would see him part with the Noel Meade-trained improver at the Goffs London Sale next week.

Bobby McGee has won his last three starts for Meade, most recently when accounting for a field of highly-touted runners over a mile on Royal Ascot Trials Day at Naas.

That performance suggested that there can be even more to come for the now 93-rated Bobby McGee and O'Gorman says that he is more than happy to roll the dice in the Britannia Stakes himself with the gelding if his reserve is not met in the London Sale on Monday.

He said, "I really don't want to sell him but I am afraid it's looking likely that he'll go because Goffs tell me he's hot. There are a lot of buyers interested in him. The latter's assistant Charlie Duckworth said, "Joliestar had a gallop this morning over 800 metres, 15 seconds per furlong for the first two furlongs before quickening up under a nice hold for the last two furlongs. Today was more about having a look at the track, pre-parade ring and parade ring, just to familiarise her with the surroundings. It was a confidence-boosting piece of work rather than a gut-buster as she has only been in the country eight days."

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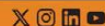

O'Gorman added, "I've been in horses all my life but, to be honest, I've no other interests outside of the game. You know the old saying, 'if somebody doesn't believe in something, they'll believe anything.' I am nearly retired now. I dealt in heavy machinery all of my life and I've had horses for years. I had a good few horses with Ferdy Murphy, God rest his soul. There's nothing new about me! We have Check This Out with Noel as well - he won two races last year - but Bobby McGee is probably the best horse I've ever had."

O'Gorman is unique in that he selects a lot of his own horses. It was at the Tattersalls Somerville Yearling Sale that he first spotted the potential in Bobby McGee and went to 42,000gns to secure his talents. That has proved to be 42,000gns well spent.

"I saw him the day before the Somerville Sale and loved him," O'Gorman recalled. "I couldn't make it to the sale myself on the day so I rang Paul Murphy, who is Ferdy's son, and I just said, 'get this horse bought'. We thought he was cheap - we thought we'd have to give more for him because he was a grand yearling. And the second he arrived back in Noel's, he loved him."

On how he first struck up a relationship with Meade, he added, "It can be difficult to find a trainer that you get on with but I can remember I was looking for a horse and Noel had Mick

Collins entered. I rang Paul and told him to ring Noel to see if the horse was for sale. We bought him over the phone and the horse went to Cork, where he had a bit of a mishap. Noel rang me afterwards to tell me that I didn't need to feel obliged to take him. It was only a verbal deal at the time, you see. I said, 'no, I bought the horse.' Anyway, we gave the horse a bit of time off and he came back and won two races." **Cont. p4**

While O'Gorman does not describe himself as a trading owner, he will approach the Goffs London Sale with his tail up after selling fellow Meade-trained jumpers Mick Collins and Messerschmitt for a combined £170,000 at the recent spring sale that was held by the same sales company in Doncaster last month.

"We're just tipping along," O'Gorman says. "Listen, it's a tough game but they made money and I got out alive."

On his expectations for Bobby McGee selling at the London Sale, O'Gorman concluded, "He'll have to make proper money to go. I enjoy having him with Noel and, listen, if he makes plenty of money, he'll be sold. If not, we'll roll the dice at Ascot ourselves. If we're drawn 20 or higher in the Britannia, I'd be very, very confident. Colin Keane will ride. That's 100 per cent. This is a Group horse. Noel said that to me when he was a two-year-old. Do we fancy him for the Britannia? We wouldn't be going over to Royal Ascot for the day out, that's for sure. I'd be very confident."

The owners of New Zealand's Cambridge Stud, the Lindsays were on hand at Ascot on Friday to watch their latest contender in action.

Joliestar has five Group 1 contests to her name in Australia, including the Thousand Guineas over a mile and two of Australia's premier six-furlong sprints – the 2025 Newmarket Handicap and 2026 TJ Smith Stakes. The 'Newmarket' has previously been won by Takeover Target, Miss Andretti, Scenic Blast and Black Caviar prior to their victories at Royal Ascot.

Duckworth continued, "Her form in Australia is rock solid. She has won her last three starts, including the TJ Smith Stakes against a really good field. She put them to bed quite well that day on a track that was probably softer than she likes, so I don't think she has been in as good a form. We are unsure how to marry that up against the opposition for next Saturday, but we are going off the fact that Nature Strip won the TJ Smith Stakes and was good enough to come here and do us all proud."

Sydney's dominant trainer Chris Waller has already tasted Royal Ascot success, having sent over Nature Strip to win the King Charles III Stakes in 2022.

Aussie Sprinters At Ascot Cont.

Lady Jo Lindsay said, "Chris had the idea of bringing Joliestar to Royal Ascot last year, but she wasn't quite ready. She has matured since then and comes here having won three Group 1 races over the course of our season. Being favourite brings a bit more expectation, which is not nice because we are already nervous."

"When Hello Youmzain won, we couldn't be here because of Covid, so we watched on the sofa at three o'clock in the morning. We had a quick glass of champagne and then went back to bed. We alternated the colours with Haras d'Etreham and it worked out that he carried our colours that day, which made it extra special. Royal Ascot is one of the great carnivals, so we are delighted to be here this time and take in the whole experience."

Her husband added, "We have invested a fair bit of money into Cambridge Stud and the broodmare band. We have Charyn coming down to stand with us this year, which is a real coup, and we also have a Guineas winner in **Chaldean** as well. What happens with Joliestar after this race has not been decided, but hopefully we will be back here again in the future."

Overpass, who has won back-to-back renewals of the G1 Winterbottom Stakes and was fourth to Joliestar in the TJ Smith Stakes, will be the first runner at Royal Ascot for Bjorn Baker.

He said, "We wanted Overpass to get two things out of today. Firstly, a little bit of fitness with a good hit-out ahead of the race on Tuesday. Then we wanted to give him the raceday experience, coming around the mounting yard and paddock."

Hopefully, that will help him relax better come raceday, which is an important part of what we do.

"Overpass has been a remarkable horse. He is very much best fresh, which means we space out his runs. He ran very well in the TJ Smith Stakes, albeit on a track that was probably too wet for him. The options were Brisbane or here, so given that we want to sell the dream worldwide, we decided to come here. Royal Ascot is one of the great carnivals, while the King Charles III Stakes is a very prestigious race. Added to the fact Australian sprinters have run very well here in the past, that gives us a bit of confidence."

"I guess the stiff, straight five furlongs here is a little bit of a question mark. Overpass has raced three times down the straight at Flemington, including winning a sales race comfortably enough as a three-year-old. It is hard to know if he is a worthy favourite."

Overpass was ridden by his regular jockey Josh Parr, who added, "I was really happy with him. I am glad he came here this morning to have a look around. He seemed to take everything in while handling the rise in the straight really well. He had a nice blow pulling up, which gives me confidence that it was enough work to have him ready for Tuesday."

"If moments like this do not get you excited, you are probably in the wrong business. I was very eager to come this morning, just to get that final feel for him. In the past, his final gallop before a race has proved a true guide of how he will perform in the race. To see him stretching out so well and reaching a significant speed suggests that he is in good shape for Tuesday."

AL SHIRA'AA HOMEBRED FOLSOM BLUES A NEW TDN RISING STAR

Having shaped with real promise at The Curragh last month, Al Shira'aa Racing's **Folsom Blues** (Blue Point) showed more of his raw material to become a TDN Rising Star, Presented by Hagyard at Gowran on Friday.

Sent off the heavily-supported 4-9 favourite for the seven-furlong maiden won by the fellow Joseph O'Brien-trained subsequent Moyglare Stud Stakes heroine Intricately in 2016, Al Shira'aa Racing's homebred made all for a power-packed 7 1/2-length success.

"He's a lovely horse who shows plenty at home and the key was to get him to relax the first day," jockey Dylan Browne McMonagle said. "He was very straightforward there, he relaxed good and is learning on the job. I think he can only get better and he'll go further as well so he's definitely one to look forward to."

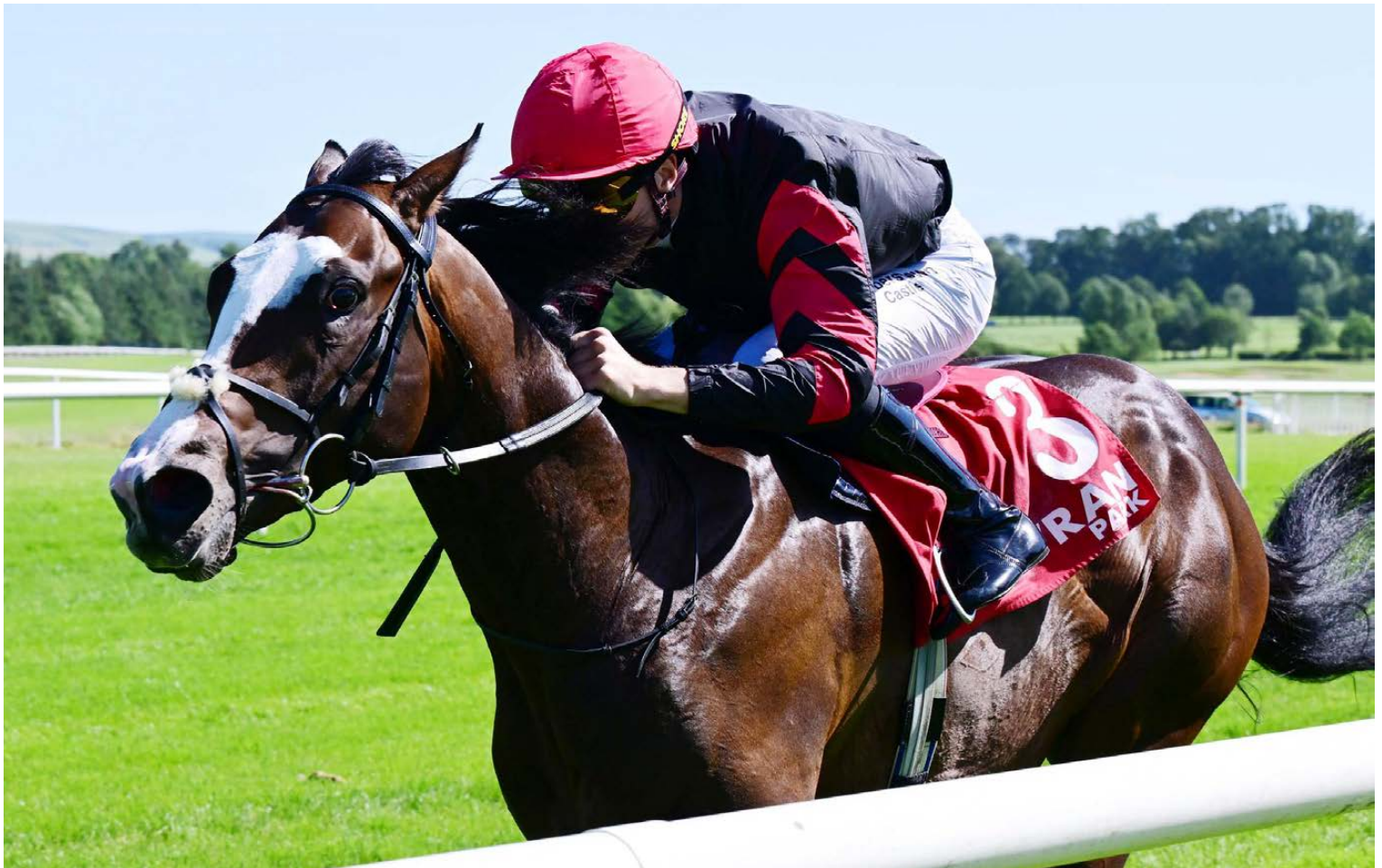
Followed home by the Jessica Harrington-trained debutante **Lunar Empress** (Zoustar), with his own stablemate **Wo Wo Never** (Wootton Bassett) beaten over 11 lengths in third, Folsom Blues becomes Blue Point's fifth TDN Rising Star with the

Group 1 winner Kind Of Blue among them. This maiden was also won nine years ago by Ballydoyle's Irish Derby runner-up Rostropovich and this son of the Italian Group 3-placed Liwa Palace (Oasis Dream) is held in high regard at Owning Hill.

"He was an eyecatcher the first day and we were happy that he was ready to go to seven," Joseph O'Brien said of the winner, who had been third over six furlongs on debut behind Ballydoyle's Windsor Castle-bound Sergei Diaghilev and the evening's Fairyhouse winner Switching Sides last month. "I thought he was very impressive really and I think he's a smart colt. I suppose the Tyros would be an obvious stepping stone for him from here. Lots to look forward to, hopefully."

Liwa Palace, who unfortunately died last year after producing Folsom Blues's full-brother, was also responsible for the stable's Killavullan Stakes winner and Champions Juvenile Stakes-placed Atlantic Coast (Kodiac) and dual Listed-placed three-year-old colt Greek Mythology (Pinatubo). The third dam is the Fillies' Mile heroine and 1,000 Guineas runner-up Aqaarid (Nashwan), descended from the outstanding producer Violetta III (Pinza) who is the ancestress of numerous top-class runners such as the Classic winners Teenoso, Sir Percy, Rule Of Law, Give Thanks and Harayir.

GREENHAM STAKES WINNER ALPARSLAN ADDED TO GOFFS LONDON SALE

Two wild-card entries have been added to Monday's Goffs London Sale, including G3 Greenham Stakes winner **Alparslan** (Dandy Man).

Trained by Karl Burke, Alparslan beat subsequent German 2,000 Guineas winner Title Role, as well as Albert Einstein and Group 1 winner Zavateri when making his seasonal debut in the Greenham at Newbury. He was subsequently fifth, beaten just 1 3/4 lengths by the runner-up, in the Irish 2,000 Guineas.

Twice a winner at two, Alparslan holds entries in both the G1 Commonwealth Cup and G3 Jersey Stakes at Royal Ascot next week.

Burke said, "Alparslan is a high-class colt with an exceptional mind and plenty of natural ability. He's a beautiful horse who

continues to improve every day, and we have an exciting programme mapped out for him for the remainder of this season and into next year.

"The racing programme offers plenty of options for a colt of his profile. He holds entries in both the Jersey Stakes and the Commonwealth Cup at Royal Ascot, and also in the Group 1 Prix Jean Prat in Deauville on July 12.

"Looking further ahead, the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest on August 9 and the £600,000 City of York Stakes on August 22 are good options as the season progresses."

He added, "Ultimately I see Alparslan as a serious candidate for the A\$10-million Golden Eagle at Randwick in late October."

Joining Alparslan as a late entry is the David Marnane-trained **Redemption Road** (Without Parole). Rated 100, the progressive three-year-old finished runner-up to Power Blue and Secret Adversary in the G3 Red Rocks Stakes at Leopardstown and was third again in Thursday's G3 Ballycorus Stakes at Leopardstown behind Audience and Native Warrior.

The Goffs London Sale, which takes place in Kensington Palace Gardens on Monday evening, also features the G2 Prix Robert Papin winner and Group 1-placed filly **Green Sense** (Starman) among 19 horses to be offered.

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RYAN MOORE AND KIRSTEN RAUSING NAMED IN KING'S BIRTHDAY HONOURS LIST

Jockey Ryan Moore and noted owner/breeder **Kirsten Rausing** have both been named in the King's Birthday Honours List.

Coolmore/Ballydoyle's retained rider, Moore has been awarded an MBE for his services to racing and British sport. He was aboard Queen Elizabeth II's Estimate (Monsun) when the filly landed the G1 Gold Cup in 2013. Currently he has ridden 92 Royal Ascot winners and also has 18 British Classic victories. Moore has also ridden four Derby winners: Workforce (2010), Ruler Of The World (2013), **Auguste Rodin** (2023) and **City Of Troy** (2024).

Moore's father Gary, a former jockey who is now a trainer alongside another of his sons, Josh, told the *Press Association*, "It's well deserved and I'm very surprised. I know I'm his father, but he does a lot of good things behind the scenes as well as what he does out on the track and this is fantastic. I'm obviously very proud.

"I know he was very well liked by the [late] Queen and she had a huge respect for Ryan. I was fortunate to meet her a few months before she passed away and I was amazed by how she spoke about him.

"I think Ryan will be proud deep down, even though he won't probably show it. I think he will be very shocked as well as much as anything. It's another great moment in his career." **Cont. p8**

Richard Lyttle, former manager of Downpatrick Racecourse in Northern Ireland, has also been awarded an MBE.

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BENVENUTO CELLINI UNDER CONSIDERATION FOR THE KING EDWARD VII

The Coolmore partners' **Benvenuto Cellini** (**Frankel**) could make a quick reappearance in Royal Ascot's G2 King Edward VII Stakes on Friday, June 19, according to trainer Aidan O'Brien.

Favoured in the G1 Betfred Derby, the colt finished 10th before being **declared a non-runner** after getting a hind foot caught in the stalls. Fellow Ballydoyle runner **Christmas Day** (**Camelot**) would go on to win the Blue Riband.

O'Brien told Kevin Blake in an *attheraces.com* stable tour, "There's a chance he could run in the King Edward. We have to see how he is in the coming days, but we're working back from the King George with him and we are worried that the ground for the Irish Derby could come up too soft for him.

"If everyone is happy with him in the coming days we might just send him to Ascot as we know he'll get his favoured firmer ground there."

The master of Ballydoyle currently needs just four victories to reach a century of Royal Ascot winners. He fields G1 Irish 2000 Guineas winner **Gstaad** (**Starspangledbanner**) and Group 1-winning stablemate **Puerto Rico** (Wootton Bassett) in the G1

St James's Palace Stakes as they face off against the likes of Bow Echo (Night Of Thunder), Talk Of New York (Wootton Bassett) and French Guineas scorer Rayif (Sea The Moon).

On the distaff side, G1 1000 Guineas heroine **True Love** (**No Nay Never**) locks horns with **Precise** (**Starspangledbanner**), who won the Irish equivalent, in the G1 Coronation Stakes the same day as the King Edward VII.

Among the older horses, dual Oaks heroine **Minnie Hauk** (**Frankel**) steps up in the G1 Prince of Wales's Stakes against her Arc conqueror Daryz (**Sea The Stars**).

O'Brien said, "The Prince Of Wales's Stakes has been her aim. We feel that the Tattersalls Gold Cup just didn't play out well for her and we are prepared to forgive that run.

"She obviously stays further and a well-run race suits her well. Ascot should suit her well and we're looking forward to seeing her in action."

Godfrey Wilson's homebred **Run To Freedom** sustained a fatal injury during trackwork on Thursday ahead of a start at Royal Ascot next week, according to a report in *The Mirror*.

Trainer Henry Candy told Mirror Racing, "Run To Freedom fractured a pastern just doing a routine bit of work on the gallops. It was too bad to repair. He's been a great servant and a tremendous character."

The eight-year-old intact son of Muhaarar won the G3 Abernant Stakes at Newmarket in April ahead of an intended start in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II Jubilee Stakes on Royal Ascot's final day, June 20. He was still placing in Group 1s at the ripe age of seven, as he was third in the July Cup Stakes in 2025. He also earned placings in the 2022 G1 British Champions Sprint Stakes and in the 2023 July Cup Stakes.

The son of Twilight Mistress (Bin Ajwaad) is a half-brother to sires Twilight Son, a winner of the G1 Diamond Jubilee Stakes and G1 Sprint Cup Stakes, as well as Music Master, a multiple group winner who was third in the Sprint Cup. He is also a half-brother to the stakes winner Spring Flight (Assertive), while another half-sister foaled G2 July Stakes and G3 Commonwealth Cup Trial victor Jasour (Havana Grey), third in the 2024 G1 Commonwealth Cup Stakes.

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JAMIE OSBORNE HANDED SUSPENDED THREE-MONTH BAN BY BHA

Trainer Jamie Osborne has received a three-month suspension of his licence, suspended for six months, after taking a photograph of a woman's 'clothed bottom' at a racecourse last year.

The 58-year-old was caught taking the photograph in the paddock before a race at an evening meeting last summer, and was reported to stewards on the day. The Group 1-winning trainer initially denied taking the photograph, but then admitted to doing so when confronted, subsequently deleting the image.

Osborne apologised to the woman, referred to in a disciplinary panel ruling published on Friday as 'Person A', who was attending the meeting alongside her partner, 'Person B'.

The written reasons for a plea agreement between Osborne and the BHA were released on Friday afternoon, and read: "On a single date in summer 2025 Mr Osborne was present at a racecourse in the parade ring for an evening meeting in his capacity as a licensed trainer and racehorse owner.

"He met Person A and her partner; Person B. Friendly conversation took place. Person A and Person B observed Mr Osborne taking photographs of Person A on his mobile phone including one photograph of her clothed bottom without her consent.

"A heated discussion ensued between Person B and Mr Osborne which drew the attention of a member of the racecourse staff, to whom Person B reported what he and Person A had witnessed. Mr Osborne initially denied taking any photographs and refused to show his telephone, however, he subsequently admitted that he had taken photographs and deleted them when he was asked to do so. He showed his telephone to Person A and Person B as he was doing this to confirm that the photographs had been deleted from his phone. Person A, Person B and the racecourse employee could see that at least one of the photographs was of Person A's clothed bottom.

"Following receipt of advice regarding reporting of the incident, Person A and Person B made a report to the stewards and an inquiry took place the same evening in which all parties participated. Mr Osborne apologised for his actions and confirmed that any photographs had been permanently deleted. He was not asked by the stewards to give access to his telephone.

"The incident caused substantial embarrassment and upset to Person A and Person B. Each of them felt that the initial response of Mr Osborne was to seek to downplay the conduct, and both stated that they would not wish for any other participant in the sport of horseracing to have this happen to them, particularly a young woman." **Cont. p11**

The statement continued, “Both expressed the view that it was not conduct to be expected of a respected trainer in the industry.”

When interviewed by the British Horseracing Authority (BHA) three weeks after the incident, Osborne revealed that the image was taken with the intention of sharing it on a WhatsApp chat group of which he was a member which had a name of ‘Great Bums’ or similar.

Besides his suspended ban, Osborne was asked to make a £3,000 donation to racing charities, provide a written apology to Person A and Person B and undertake a number of courses, including one on sexual harassment in the workplace.

CROIX DU NORD AIMING FOR FIFTH GROUP 1 IN TAKARAZUKA KINEN

Now carrying four stars on his saddle cloth for each lifetime Group 1 victory, **Croix Du Nord** accumulated the most votes for Sunday's 2200-metre G1 Takarazuka Kinen at Hanshin.

The 2024 Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby) victor is riding a two-race winning streak, having defeated the re-opposing **Meisho Tabaru** (Gold Ship) in the 2000-metre Osaka Hai in April. Upped to 3200-metres for the first time on May 3, he won the G1 Tenno Sho (Spring) as well. The son of Kitan Black will earn a berth in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Keeneland this October if he prevails.

"He got a win last time in the Tenno Sho, even if it was just by a nose," said trainer Takashi Saito. "He went to the farm after that, and came back to the stable on May 20. More than being tired, he was just a bit loose, but he's coming on for his work and should be in good condition just before the race."

Meisho Tabaru is no stranger to top-tier company, as he won this race last year and bounced back after two troubling efforts to be second in the Osaka Hai. Booked in stall 16 versus Croix Du Nord's five, the five-year-old will be ridden by veteran Yutaka Take, who has won five of these (1989, 1993, 1997, 2006, 2025). Only two other horses have delivered two editions of the Takarazuka Kinen: Chrono Genesis (2020/2021) and Gold Ship (2013/2014).

Trainer Mamoru Ishibashi said, "The first half of the Osaka Hai

was run in :58.1 seconds. The start of the 2000-metre race at Hanshin is near the first corner, so I think instinctively the jockey went to the front, and he did so quickly. Despite it being a bit of a frantic pace, the horse still did well. There's an furlong extra this time, but it's back to the distance he won over last year."

To give a snapshot of this edition's quality field, Croix Du Nord isn't the only Japanese Derby hero lining up, as **Danon Decile** (Epiphaneia), the 2024 winner, is booked in stall one. Besides a victory in the 2025 G1 Dubai Sheema Classic, he has been very consistent when third in his last three starts: the G1 Japan Cup to Calandagan (**Gleneagles**), **Museum Mile's** G1 Arima Kinen in December and in the aforementioned Osaka Hai.

By Leontes and set to exit stall two, Museum Mile has yet to grace the racecourse in 2026, his last appearance being a victory in the Arima Kinen, 300 metres longer than Sunday's contest.

"The Arima Kinen was a good race for him," assistant trainer Yuichi Tomomichi said. "He was supposed to go to Dubai, but with the situation in the Middle East we cancelled. We then thought about Hong Kong, but it might have been that he wouldn't have passed the vet inspection. He's therefore had a spell at the farm, with the Takarazuka Kinen in mind for him next. Just recently he hasn't had his engine working full throttle, but that's always the pattern with him."

Three-time Group 1 scorer **Regaleira** (Suave Richard) lines up next to Meisho Tabaru in stall 17 with Christophe Lemaire in the irons. The 2025 G1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup heroine hasn't made her 2026 bow either, as she ran fourth in the Arima Kinen.

Assistant trainer Yu Ota said, "She's sometimes not so good at the gate, and her condition last time meant she couldn't do so well in the Arima Kinen, which was a bit regretful. She was pretty tired after that race, but now after time, things have been good with her back at the stable. She's worked well over a distance and clocked a good time."
