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TDN Q & A WITH LUCINDA FINLEY: ANY POTENTIAL SUPREME COURT DECISION 'PROBABLY A YEAR' AWAY

Last week, the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit issued an opinion that reiterated a conclusion they had reached **two years prior**--that even though the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act (HISA)'s rulemaking structure is constitutional, its enforcement provisions are not.

It was nearly this time last year the United States Supreme Court **punted** the question of HISA's constitutionality back down the legal ladder, telling the Fifth, Sixth and Eighth Circuits of the U.S. Courts of Appeal to consider in their various HISA decisions a then-recent Supreme Court ruling in *Federal Communications Commission (FCC) vs. Consumers' Research*.

In that Supreme Court decision, a 6-3 majority of justices dismissed an argument that the agency delegated too much authority to a private company to administer the program.

The Fifth Circuit has reconsidered that ruling but hasn't changed its mind.

BAFFERT SPREADS HIS WINGS

The Week in Review, by Bill Finley

Since Bob Baffert made the shift from Quarter Horse racing to Thoroughbred racing in the early eighties, no one has been more loyal to Southern California racing. Especially when it came to stakes races, he filled the entry box like no other trainer. Consistency and quality were his trademarks. He has his critics and some have bristled at his dominance, but California racing has been lucky to have him.

But with things being what they are in California, even Baffert had to make what must have been a tough decision and follow the money.

Santa Anita, Del Mar and Los Alamitos are the last major tracks in the country that receive no revenue from gaming, which means their purses have fallen far behind those at other major tracks, particularly the Kentucky tracks. A maiden special weight race at Santa Anita goes for \$65,000. The purse for the same race at Churchill Downs is \$120,000.

"HISA's explicit division of enforcement responsibility empowers the [HISA] Authority with quintessential executive functions and gives the [Federal Trade Commission] FTC scant oversight until enforcement has already occurred," the Fifth Circuit wrote in its latest ruling, adding "such back-end review by the FTC does not subordinate the Authority."

The Fifth Circuit added that the FTC's general rulemaking power "provides no answer because executive rulemaking cannot amend the plain division of enforcement power laid out in HISA's text. Such a radical delegation [occurs because] the FTC lacks any tools to ensure that the law is properly enforced. HISA's enforcement provisions thus facially violate the private nondelegation doctrine."

A year ago, attorney Lucinda Finley foresaw such a possible scenario as played out this

week. Her prediction was partially grounded in the fact there was no enforcement issue in the FCC case the Supreme Court had just ruled on.

"There's nothing in that case that directly bears on the enforcement power given to the private entity," Finley told the *TDN* last year. She's the Frank Raichle Professor of Trial and Appellate Advocacy and director of Appellate Advocacy at the University of Buffalo Law School.

So, Finley added, "it is possible the same three judges of the Fifth Circuit that already found the enforcement power part of the HISA statute unconstitutional will say, 'we stick with our view. Nothing in the FCC case changes that.'"

Now that the Fifth Circuit has indeed taken that course of action, the *TDN* spoke once again with Finley to discuss what happens now.

TDN: Let's begin with a reminder of why the Supreme Court remanded this back down to circuit courts in light of the *FCC vs. Consumers' Research* ruling. If there was no enforcement issue at play in that ruling, what did the Supreme Court see in that FCC ruling that they thought would be relevant in the various HISA cases?

LF: I can assume the Supreme Court thought the *Consumers' Research* decision was relevant because they announced what

they see today as the guiding principle for any constitutional challenge arguing that too much rulemaking or enforcement authority has been delegated to a private entity.

The Supreme Court and consumers research reiterated the longstanding principle that, so long as the federal agency does have the review authority, the final authority to approve rules or approve fees or approve enforcement actions, then the

private entity is sufficiently subordinate to the agency, and there is no constitutional delegation problem.

TDN: In their most recent decision, the Fifth Circuit judges use the following theoretical example to argue why they think HISA isn't really subordinate to the FTC:

"Suppose the Authority sanctions a horse owner for a doping violation, but the sanction is later reversed by the FTC. Does that make the

Authority's enforcement power subordinate to the agency?

No, it does not. Consider everything the Authority was permitted to do up to that point: launch an investigation into the owner, subpoena his records, search his facilities, charge him with a violation, adjudicate it, and fine him. Each and every one of those actions is 'enforcement' of HISA."

How compelling do you think this and their overall argument is?

LF: First, let me point out that the Sixth Circuit directly disagreed with that conclusion of the Fifth Circuit. The Fifth Circuit seems to be saying that every single step of enforcement has to be approved separately, step-by-step, by the FTC--that it's not enough the FTC can review HIWU's conclusion and decide on its own, independently of HIWU's reasoning, whether to uphold it or reverse it.

The Sixth Circuit in contrast said that they read the U.S. Supreme Court decision on *Consumers' Research* as putting emphasis on whether the federal agency has the final or the ultimate reviewing authority.

As we've been seeing under the HIWU and FTC enforcement provisions, there are administrative law judges that have frequently been disagreeing with enforcement actions started by HISA. **Cont.**

Maybe to put it more succinctly, the Sixth Circuit read the Supreme Court decision on Consumers' Research as saying, 'It's okay for the private entity to start enforcement so long as the federal agency has the final say.'

The Fifth Circuit in contrast says, 'No, no, no, no. It's not okay for the private entity even to start enforcement. Only the federal agency can do that.'

That's the gist of the disagreement between the Fifth and the Sixth Circuits.

I also think it's important to emphasize for your readers that now every circuit court agrees that the rulemaking of HISA is constitutional. The only area of disagreement left is over how HISA's rules get enforced.

TDN: Last December, Congress authorized an amendment to HISA that includes new requirements for the Authority to seek Commission approval to issue a subpoena or commence a civil action under the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act. Did the Fifth Circuit address that amendment?

LF: Not that I'm aware of and not that they mentioned. The Fifth Circuit basically reissued their earlier opinion and added a section explaining why they didn't think the Supreme Court decision on Consumers' Research was relevant.

The Sixth Circuit basically reissued their decision and issued a section saying why they think consumers' research is relevant.

I think your next question is going to be, 'what happens now?'

TDN: Exactly! How long will this all take to play out? I know the Eighth Circuit still needs to rule on their case. How long could that theoretically take? And then how long for the Supreme Court to take this up?

LF: As I understand it, there's already been a petition for certiorari filed from the Sixth Circuit decision, and I would expect that HISA will file a petition for certiorari from the Fifth Circuit decision.

The Supreme Court term is wrapping up in a couple weeks, by the end of June, and they won't reconvene until the beginning of October. Lots of petitions for certiorari will accumulate over the summer and usually, sometime in September, the court reviews all of the pending petitions for certiorari that came in over the

summer, rejects some of them, grants some of them, just doesn't decide others and keeps them in the hopper of ones they still have to decide.

That's a long way of explaining that the earliest the Supreme Court might say whether they're going to take the case over the constitutionality of HISA will be in the beginning of October.

Given that there is no disagreement among the circuit courts

about the constitutionality of the rulemaking authority, I think that if the Supreme Court takes the case, they are likely to take it only to examine the delegation of authority between HISA and HIWU and the FTC when it comes to enforcing the rules because there's no reason for them to wade in on the making of the rules themselves when all the lower courts agree that the FTC has sufficient oversight.

If they are going to review the constitutionality of the enforcement provisions of HISA,

then it'll be a couple months before the parties' briefs are due and then they probably wouldn't hear oral argument until sometime in the winter. So, it would probably be a year from now before there would be a decision.

TDN: If they just look at it through that narrow lens of the constitutionality of the enforcement provisions, how do you expect them to rule?

LF: Any lawyer should be very careful about predicting what the Supreme Court will do.

I do think their Consumers' Research decision is a very strong signal that currently, a majority of the Supreme Court justices think that if the federal agency has the final say, has the authority to review either the rules or an enforcement action, then it is constitutional.

But here we are now, back in limbo. We're back to conflicting circuit court decisions on enforcement. What does that mean in the meantime? Well, what it means in the meantime is the status quo that's currently in place continues: that HISA cannot enforce its rules in the states within the Fifth Circuit.

It's a rather odd situation because you have the court saying the rules themselves are valid and the HISA statute says the federal rules preempt any state rules. But you have the Fifth Circuit, for the states within the Fifth Circuit, saying, 'but nobody can enforce them.' **Cont.**

The Fifth Circuit, interestingly enough in its opinion, also seems to indicate that it doesn't think that HISA contracting with the State Racing Commissions to enforce the rules is sufficient.

TDN: Is there a possibility the Supreme Court could, once again, remand this back down to the circuit courts to clear up?

LF: To consider the effect of the more recent congressional amendment?

TDN: Yes.

LF: Sure, potentially.

TDN: What does your gut tell you about what the Supreme Court will do?

LF: I'm going to say this somewhat facetiously but also somewhat seriously. Maybe the Supreme Court is saying, 'you know, if we just keep remanding it and Congress keeps tweaking the statute, maybe eventually these people will give up with their challenges and just accept the new reality, then we won't have to wade in.'

I go back to things I've said in previous Q & As with you: it just really doesn't seem to make a lot of sense that the national horsemen's organization is devoting so much time and energy trying to fight every aspect of this federal statute that's now been around for several years and the rulemaking authority has been upheld by every circuit court.

I know their press releases say things like, 'we care about the constitutionality and we don't want our horsemen governed by the decisions of some small group of elites.' I question that.

If they're a group that purports to represent the interests of horsemen, one would hope they also put the interests of horses very high on their values. All of the data shows the states that are subject to HISA's rules and enforcement have drastically lower fatalities, have better jockey safety records, and that racing is just better for the horses and humans that participate in it.

I also think if you poll the horsemen, ask them whether they cared about the constitutional principle known as non-delegation, they would look at you and say, 'Lady, what I care about is whether the carded fifth race next week that my horse is ready to run in is going to go.'

What do I think the ultimate result is going to be? The ultimate result is we're going to have uniformity and national rules.

We now have it in all but a very small number of states.

Congress seems very committed to it. Even when Senator McConnell leaves the Senate at the end of this year, I think there are other representatives that are very committed to it and will see that, if they need to make continued changes to the statute to satisfy judicial concerns, they will, and at the end of the day, the national uniformity of rules and standards will prevail.

It's the same with stakes races. Santa Anita ran two graded stakes Saturday and both had purses of \$100,000. Churchill ran two stakes races, neither of which were graded. Their purses were \$225,000 and \$175,000. Churchill has so much money at its disposal that it has raised the purse of the June 27 GI Stephen Foster Stakes to \$2 million.

So who could blame Baffert when he announced that he was setting up a permanent stable at Churchill? He has 34 stalls there. He also said he would be based at Oaklawn, which also has astronomical purses, when it opens later this year.

Baffert has not abandoned California. He won Saturday's GIII Summertime Oaks with the exciting filly **Mizumi (Justify)**. But he has cut his numbers dramatically, which has been just one more hit for the struggling circuit.

Through Saturday, he had made just 17 starts during the current meet, which ends Monday, and had won just three races. At the same meet in 2025, he made 35 starts and won 16 races. He's been more active at Churchill, where, through Saturday, he had made 27 starts with six winners. Baffert's overall numbers will likely increase once he starts to unveil his armada of 2-year-olds. **Cont.**

Baffert isn't alone. Phil D'Amato has made 17 starts at Churchill and Peter Eurton has made 22 starts there. Doug O'Neill has stalls at Keeneland and Peter Miller also had a string in Kentucky. All have been major players in California for years.

There's not much more that can be said about the struggles of California racing and Santa Anita in particular. The circuit needs help and there doesn't appear to be any on the way. When someone like Baffert has one foot out the door, you know things are bleak.

Will Walden Strikes Again

There may not be a hotter trainer in the country than Will Walden. He picked up still another stakes win Saturday when 'TDN Rising Star, presented by Hagyard' **La Rascasse** (Authentic) won the Monomoy Girl Overnight Stakes at Churchill. Considering that she was able to win a stakes in just her second career start, the \$750,000 Keeneland September purchase appears to have a bright future.

It was Walden's fifth stakes win this year, which includes a win in the GI Old Forester Bourbon Turf Classic Stakes with Rhetorical (**Not This Time**). Walden is 36-for-119 on the year, good for a winning rate of 30 percent, easily the highest of his career. Training only since 2022, he has quickly established himself as one of the top trainers in the sport. With \$3,353,367 in earnings on the year, he ranks 20th among all trainers.

He continues to write one of the best feel-good stories in racing. His training career was delayed due to substance abuse problems, which are now part of his past thanks to his work with the Stable Recovery program. He has become the poster child for what that program can accomplish.

So Far So Good For the Flightlines

It's exciting to see the progeny of superstar **Flightline** begin to hit the racetrack. Clearly the star so far is **Demian**. A \$1.7-million Keeneland purchase, he won on debut Saturday at Tokyo Race Course.

Two other Flightlines ran in the U.S., and while neither won, both showed promise. The colt **Greenwell** was second Friday at Churchill Downs, losing by two lengths for trainer Mark Casse. The next day the **Flightline** filly **House Boat Party** was third in another maiden at Churchill for trainer Brian Lynch. The connections of both horses **said beforehand that they thought their horses would only improve with more distance.**

Then there's Zedan. Purchased for \$10.5 million by Amr Zedan at OBS April, the Baffert-trained colt has yet to have his first workout, but his debut will be one of the most anticipated races of the year. **Cont.**

Paco Lopez won six races at Monmouth Saturday. Through Saturday, he's winning at a 42 percent rate at Monmouth, where his 30 winners were 19 more than runners-up Sonny Leon and Luis Rivera, Jr. At Delaware Park, he is winning at a 44 percent rate and his 27 winners are 16 better than Julio Hernandez, who is second in the standings. Then there's Parx, where he has 22 winners.

A day after **nominations were released** for the much-anticipated GI Stephen Foster Stakes, to be held June 27 at Churchill Downs, prime contender and reigning Horse of the Year **Sovereignty** (Into Mischief) worked at Saratoga, breezing five furlongs Sunday in 1:02.61 in company under regular work rider Neil Poznansky. After splits of :25.25 for the first quarter and :37.24 for the three-eighths, Sovereignty galloped out six furlongs in 1:17.38. The Godolphin homebred and Bill Mott trainee is scheduled to work one more time before the \$2-million highlight of early summer.

Among those expected to join Sovereignty in the starting gate for the Stephen Foster, a 'Win and You're In' event featuring a berth into the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, are G1 Dubai World Cup winner **Magnitude** (**Not This Time**); 2023 Breeders' Cup Classic winner **White Abarrio** (Race Day), who beat Sovereignty in the

Apr. 18 GI Oaklawn Handicap; and Sovereignty's stablemate and last year's GI Pennsylvania Derby winner **Baeza** (**McKinzie**).

The Stephen Foster will mark the first time Sovereignty has raced at Churchill since he won the 2025 GI Kentucky Derby.

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A crowded winner's circle | Benoit

Agave Racing Stable, Little Red Feather Racing, Sterling Stables, and Marsha Naify's Gold Phoenix (Ire) added yet another feather to his cap Sunday with a win in the GIII San Juan Capistrano Stakes at Santa Anita, the longest turf race contested in Arcadia. It marked the 10th graded victory for the veteran gelding, all split between Santa Anita and Del Mar.

Twice past the stands and going 1 3/4 miles on the lawn, the San Juan Capistrano may not have the prestige it did during the years Charlie Whittingham won it 14 times (from 1957 to 1989), but Gold Phoenix did his part to bring some of the glory back to the turf fixture. The 8-year-old had plenty of patience and spent much of the race parked second to last as 25-1 Grog (Get Stormy) showed the way up front. After a quarter in :23.63 and a half in :47.41, Grog crossed the dirt in Santa Anita's unique configuration as Rimprotector (Point of Entry), who captured a 1 3/8-mile black-type race at Turf Paradise May 2, and Goldeneye, whose last win--at Saratoga last summer--was also at 1 3/8 miles, comfortably chased him. In advance of the mile in 1:38.05, Grog opened up by daylight on the field, but Gold Phoenix, still in the penultimate spot and the only graded winner in the field, was unconcerned while about a dozen lengths in arrears.

Gold Phoenix caught the eye leaving the backstretch as he shifted to the outside and looked like a fresh horse, passing his rivals with ease. Up front, Goldeneye tackled Grog, but couldn't withstand the Gold Phoenix onslaught. Under wraps, Gold Phoenix powered home effortlessly while five lengths the best. Goldeneye held second over American Hope, who was coming off a May 1 win in a nine-furlong optional allowance.

"I just loved the move he was making around the three-eighths pole," said winning trainer Phil D'Amato. "It looked like he was just kind of inhaling them. I felt really good by the time he got to the top of the lane." **Cont.**

D'Amato continued: "He looked like he was just in a gallop there. Ultra impressive. This is one of my most favorite races watching as a kid. It means a lot to me to win this race, especially with this horse."

Among Gold Phoenix's many accomplishments are wins in the GI Frank E. Kilroe Mile Stakes in 2023 and four consecutive victories--from 2022 to 2025--in the GII Del Mar Handicap. He's also made four consecutive appearances in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf, finishing fourth in 2023-24 and fifth last year in races that produced three of his four career triple-digit Beyer Speed Figures. The popular chestnut won the GIII San Luis Rey Stakes in March, then shipped to Churchill Downs, where he was last seen trying the GI Turf Classic Stakes on Kentucky Derby Day for the second consecutive year (he finished fourth last year and seventh this year after traffic trouble). Although he did win at the highest level at just a mile, some of Gold Phoenix's best races have come at a route: the San Luis Rey and Breeders' Cup Turf are each at 1 1/2 miles and those four consecutive Del Mar Handicaps were each going 1 3/8 miles.

Gold Phoenix will target a fifth win in the Del Mar Handicap this summer.

Pedigree Notes:

England's Bearstone Stud sold Gold Phoenix's sire Belardo (Ire) last August and the first-crop son of Lope de Vega (Ire) now stands at Turkey's Yigit Stud in partnership with the Jockey Club of Turkey. Belardo has 19 black-type winners and 11 graded winners, with his additional U.S. representatives including 2025 triple graded-winning Special Wan (Ire) and 2022/2024 graded-winning Bellabel (Ire).

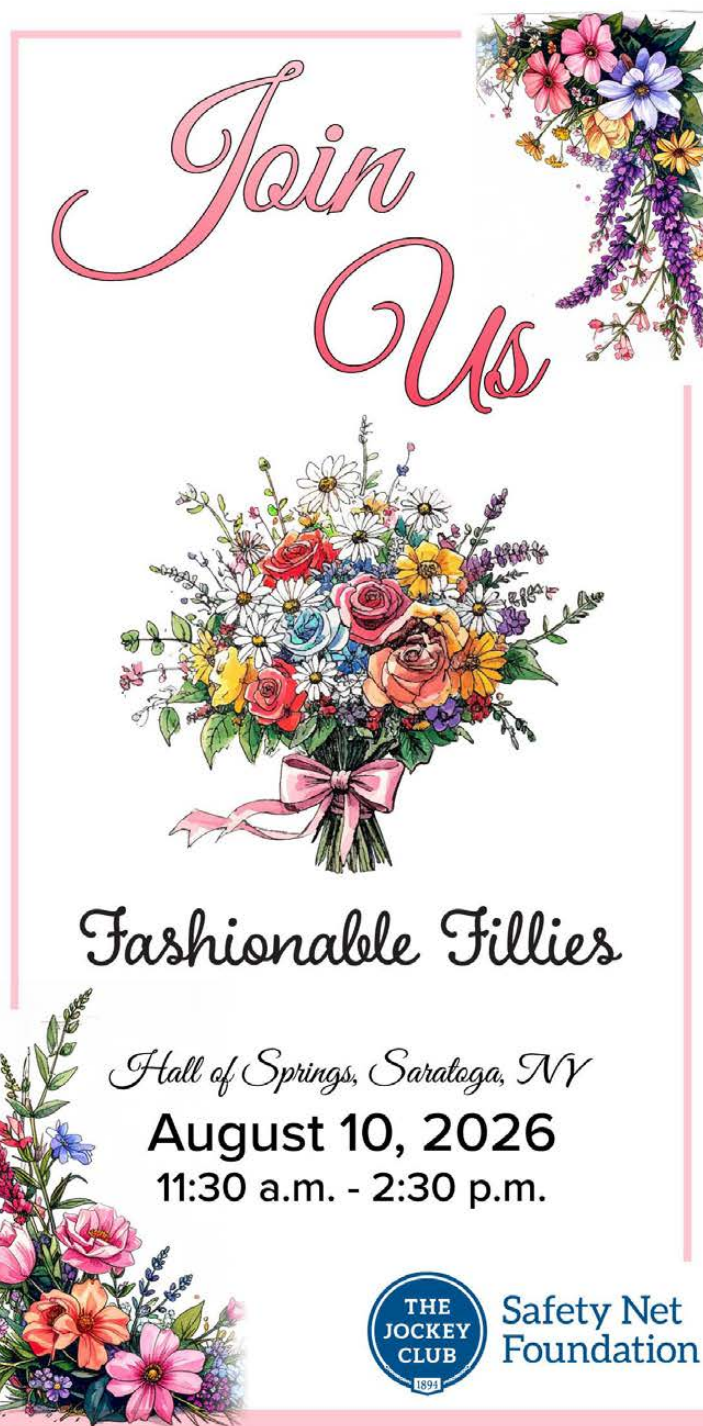
Magnifica, Gold Phoenix's dam, is a full-sister to Hong Kong Group 1 winner Sea Defence and to U.S. MGSW & GISP Jibboom. The latter is a multiple graded producer, whose offspring include 2024 GII Bed o' Roses Stakes winner Accede (Into Mischief). Magnifica's 2024 **Gleneagles (Ire)** colt died as a yearling; the mare has a yearling filly by Phoenix of Spain (Ire). The filly was a €36,000 RNA at the Goffs November Foal Sale in 2025.

Hark Theangelssing returned from seven months on the sidelines to earn her first stakes victory at Laurel Sunday. The gray filly chased pacesetter Gerrards Cross through a quarter in :22.19. She eyeballed the longtime leader in deep stretch and narrowly outfinished that stubborn foe to the wire.

Winning trainer Michael Trombetta didn't expect Hark Theangelssing to be close to the pace Sunday.

"I told [jockey Ismerio Villalobos] to break well and then let her settle," Trombetta said. "I watched the break. I didn't see her. I looked to the back. I didn't see her again. I wondered where she went, but she was outrunning [uncoupled stablemate Just Philtored], which really surprised me. I think she just had a nice break and fell out of there ready to run."

A debut winner last July over the turf at Colonial Downs, Hark Theangelssing was fourth in the Dolley Madison Stakes at that oval in August before winning an option-claimer over Sunday's course and distance Oct. 3. She went to the sidelines following a fourth-place effort in the six-furlong Stewart Manor Stakes at Aqueduct Nov. 7.

Asked where Hark theangelssing might start next, Trombetta said, "I think we'll take her to Colonial, and maybe she'll warrant a start at Saratoga."

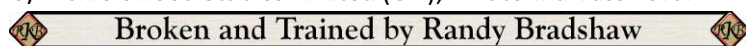
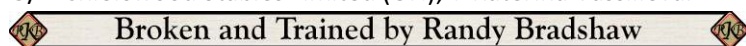

After making sure that Ballydoyle's 1-2 favourite **Diamond Necklace** (St Mark's Basilica) delivered in Sunday's G1 Prix de Diane Longines at Chantilly, Ryan Moore become the first jockey in history to win every English, Irish and French Classic.

This was far from straightforward, with the Poule d'Essai des Pouliches heroine pushed all the way to the line by the 34-1 outsider **Pink Panthera** (Chachnak), who nearly stole it for France under Tony Piccone, but Moore was in his usual unflinching mood to hold on by a short neck. **Inis Mor** (Galiway) was two lengths away in third.

For all that this represented a highly significant landmark for the jockey supreme, he was typically humble and quick to deflect while giving an insight into the mentality that made all this possible. "I'm very lucky that I ride for Aidan and Coolmore and they produce these horses and buy these horses," he said. "I'm delighted to win this and that she won, now I just need to go out and do it again next week."

Emulating the achievement of her sire in completing a French Classic double, Diamond Necklace also joins Allez France, Zarkava, Divine Proportions and Blue Rose Cen in winning the Prix Marcel Boussac, Poule d'Essai and this. [Cont. p3](#)

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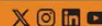

Helped by the demanding pace set by stablemate **Moments Of Joy (Justify)**, she was asked to stretch approaching two out and looked unhappy on the prevailing fast ground for a brief period as the early trailer Pink Panthera swooped on her outer.

The shock runner-up's surge from rear meant that she finished fastest over the last three furlongs, but Diamond Necklace with her extra big-race experience was able to dig in and take control

inside the final 100 metres and earn this the hard way. The winning time of 2:03.778 just missed the 2:03.77 race record of Treve in 2013, when Diamond Necklace's half-sister Chicquita was second.

Aidan O'Brien, who was collecting a seventh Classic in 2026, was overwhelmed in the immediate aftermath. "I'm lost for words! She's an incredible filly, very natural, very nimble and quick and gets the mile and a quarter," he said. "She's just very easy and very natural."

"Ryan gave her an unbelievable ride--she's never run on ground that quick, but he said it was no problem," the Ballydoyle handler added. "It was an evenly-run race and she does quicken very well, but when she gets there she doesn't do much. We know that she handles soft ground, she's a great traveller and all class, so the sky's the limit."

There is always talk of the Arc after a French middle-distance Classic and O'Brien was not ruling it out. "It's possible she could return for an Arc trial before," he said. "No matter what distance she works over at home, she comes there easily and then waits. We feel there is a good chance she'll stay 2,400 metres, but you'll have to be patient with her. She's always been so similar to St Mark's Basilica, even from the first day and he didn't want further than ten furlongs so maybe she'll be the same. We won't rush her anyway--everything is coming naturally to her at the moment and we're in no hurry." [Cont. p4](#)

Ryan Moore added, “She has an exceptional mind and I always felt she was going to win. I’m still getting to know her—this was only the second time I have ridden her, but she is such a straightforward filly that I feel she only ever does what is necessary. She oozes class throughout a race in everything she does. She is a top-class filly who travels strongly, quickens easily, understands what is asked of her and responds immediately.”

Like the Prix du Jockey Club hero **Constitution** River bred in France, Diamond Necklace was watched by Ecurie des Monceaux’s Henri Bozo who said, “It is a particularly emotional moment, with this first victory in the Prix de Diane as breeders. We had secured several placings over the years, but had never won it so this success holds a very special meaning for us and is the result of many years of hard work.”

“This victory is the culmination of many years dedicated to this maternal family, which we developed alongside Lady O’Reilly who was deeply attached to this bloodline,” he added. “Today, our thoughts are especially with her, as well as with Patricia

Boutin, who is following us from the United States. Beyond the sporting achievement, this success is a reward for the commitment, passion and perseverance of our entire breeding team.”

For Pink Panthera’s trainer Patrice Cottier, the result was a major boost. “It’s incredible what she achieved today,” he said. “She has improved with every race and this kind of ground is exactly what she wants. If the ground is much softer, she’s really not comfortable. She was beaten by

a filly with much more experience, so it’s a wonderful performance.”

Nicolas De Watrigant, representing the runner-up's co-owner Alain Jathiere, added, "I think we all believed in her. She has been managed exceptionally well by her team--we avoided tough battles in the trials and instead ran her against the colts in the Derby du Midi and she put up a remarkable display in Bordeaux. She covered the final 100 metres there in 10.47 seconds, reaching a top speed of 71 km/h so we felt that if she recovered well the Diane would be a realistic target."

"Her main weakness is that she lacks early speed and that's what cost her the race," he added. "She has a huge heart. I could definitely see her over 2,400 metres in the Prix Vermeille, why not? We'll discuss it further with Mr Jathiere, Mr Dubois and Patrice Cottier, but she is a fast-ground filly so Arc conditions would probably not suit her. We also have her sister at stud for Mr Jathiere--it's a tremendous family--the family of Peintre Celebre and I'm so pleased for Mr Jathiere. He invests enormously in the sport and deserves success."

David Menuisier said of Inis Mor, who was closest to the fast early pace, "She enjoyed a perfect trip, but Oisin [Murphy] feels that with a little rain she might have gone even closer. Everything went her way. We were worried about the pace, but she really showed how good she is and we are very proud of

her."

"We now need to decide whether she remains around 2,000 metres or steps up to 2,400 metres," he added. "She will stay at Group 1 level. We've always believed she was capable of competing at the highest level and she confirmed that today. Obviously she won't run in all of them, but options include the Nassau Stakes, the Prix Jean Romanet, the Yorkshire Oaks or the Prix Vermeille."

Pedigree Notes

Diamond Necklace's dam Prudenzia (Dansili) has a total of six Stakes performers under her auspices at present, with Galileo's globe-trotting MacKinnon Stakes heroine Magic Wand and Montjeu's aforementioned Irish Oaks heroine Chicquita joined by Philomene (Dubawi) who like Chicquita was also runner-up in this Classic. Chicquita is in turn responsible for three Stakes performers including Dubawi's Curragh Cup winner Emily Dickinson and **American Pharoah's** American Oaks runner-up and Irish Oaks third Nicest.

The Listed-winning Prudenzia is a daughter of Fittocks Stud's Platonic (Zafonic) and therefore a half to the Group 3-winning Pacificque (Montjeu), who is the second dam of Night Of Thunder's dual Group-placed three-year-old filly Skydance and Dubawi's Prix Niel third Parachutiste. [Cont. p6](#)

Ending a 13-year drought in Chantilly's G3 Prix du Lys Longines on Sunday, Andre Fabre was back where it matters with **Space Waltz** (**American Pharoah**) to extend his record in the mile-and-a-half contest to 16 wins. Up in trip after finishing runner-up in the Prix Noailles in April, the Niarchos Family's homebred relished the stamina test to beat **Victoire Magique** (Victor Ludorum) by 3 1/2 lengths, with his stablemate and 11-10 market-leader **Rumoriste** (**Frankel**) another seven lengths away in third.

"He's a colt that I've always liked," jockey Stephane Pasquier said of the 17-10 second favourite, who produced an 11.09 penultimate split and a closing three-furlong sectional of 34.26 on his favoured fast surface. "Also, he's Maria [Niarchos] horse and I love her horses more than anything. This colt has magnificent balance. He did some impressive fractions last time off a slow pace and today it was easy. He still needs to learn, but he has a great mentality and will be one of the favourites for the Grand Prix de Paris now."

Fourth in the Jersey at this stage last term, Sheikh Ahmed Al Maktoum's four-year-old was toughened in competitive handicaps during the summer before ending his campaign with a win in Newbury's Dubai Duty Free Cup and starting this one with a third in Ascot's Paradise. Sticking close to the leader **Elastic** (Lope De Vega) with the pace tepid, the 19-5 shot gradually asserted from 300 metres out to score by half a length.

"It was a little bit messy early, but he picked up well and Callum [Rodriguez] struggled to pull him up," trainer Owen Burrows said. "Probably a mile is his trip and we've always liked him. We set him a couple of big tests in handicaps last year and physically he's done well and turned into a Stakes horse. I saw this was cutting up on nice ground and it worked out great. There's the Summer Mile and the Celebration Mile and I'm sure we'll have a look at a Group 1 at some stage."

Pedigree Notes

Remmooz, who becomes the 13th Group winner for his sire, is the first foal out of the Listed winner and Premio Regina Elena (Italian 1,000 Guineas) runner-up Lady Ramon (Ramonti). The family includes the Flower Bowl heroine and Stakes producer Gaily Gaily (Cure The Blues), Gay Burslem (Burslem) who captured the Premio Parioli (Italian 2,000 Guineas) when it carried Group 1 status and the Falmouth heroine Giofra (Dansili).

IRISH OAKS CALLS FOR BOLGER'S UNBEATEN

SPARAN NUA by Tom Frary

It has been a while since Jim Bolger had a real top-flight prospect and so it was welcome sight that greeted Cork's faithful on Sunday when his unbeaten filly **Sparan Nua** (**Dawn Approach**) took the G3 Darley Munster Oaks.

After Newtown Anner Stud's recent acquisition had mastered her elders in the mile-and-a-half contest, her breeder and trainer was looking at next month's Curragh Classic. "She is still learning on the job and was green enough there today," Bolger said of the 11-4 favourite, who was stepping up after winning over a mile at Naas and nine furlongs at Gowran. "I wasn't certain today upping in trip and taking on the older horses, but she has a good attitude and I'd say the Irish Oaks is where we'll go now. I'll talk to Maurice Regan and see what he wants to do, as she'd need to be supplemented."

"We didn't get after her last year as she was a little bit weak and today it was only her third run," the trainer added. "Before she ran this year, we did a couple of bits of work with her but I wasn't sure where she fitted--I said we'd give her a run to find out and that's why she was 25-1 the first day. There is a lot of improvement in her and it's nice to have one like that. The last real one we had was four years ago."

Needing to stay well here, with last year's Preis der Diana third **Nyra** (Isfahan) in determined mood, Sparan Nua gave her all for jockey Nathan Crosse close home to forge a half-length winning margin with **Bosphorus Rose** (Golden Horn) a further 2 1/4 lengths away in third. Entered in the Ribblesdale on Thursday, the winner will not be heading to Royal Ascot.

"I only entered her in that for cover in case something went wrong today and she won't be going," Bolger said. "There is always France later on and the Ascot race later in the year. She seems to handle soft well, so she has more options at the back-end."

Pedigree Notes

Sparan Nua's dam Sparanai (Lesroidesanimaux), who also has a yearling full-brother to the winner, hails from the family of the Moyglare Stud Stakes and Phoenix Stakes heroine and 1,000 Guineas third Saoirse Abu (Mr. Greeley) and the smart Stakes-winning Make A Challenge (Invincible Spirit) and She's Quality (Acclamation), with the latter also placed in the King George and Temple at Group 2 level. The dynasty features two Curragh Classics winners in the Irish Derby scorers Balanchine and Sovereign, as well as the Prix de Diane heroine West Wind (Machiavellian) and also includes the likes of Thunder Snow (Helmet) and Coroebus (Dubawi).

The son of Dandy Man has won three of his five starts for Karl Burke, including an impressive display in the G3 Greenham Stakes before finishing a decent fifth in the Irish 2,000 Guineas.

Federico Barberini is both bloodstock agent and racing manager to Al Shehhi, and he recalls the first time he set eyes on Alparslan, before buying him for €75,000 at the Tattersalls Ireland September Yearling Sale.

"The attraction was really just himself because he was the most gorgeous individual," says Barberini. "He was a very obviously incredibly good-looking horse. Then he happened to be by Dandy Man, which obviously made him even more attractive to us, given the fact that we have been lucky with the sire. But to be honest, I would have loved to buy him whoever he would have been by."

Indeed, among other horses to have carried Al Shehhi's colours to success are the Dandy Man colt Arabie, who won the G2 Prix Robert Papin and G3 Prix du Bois, while recently the first-time-out winner Wateera has joined the successful throng. She too is by the late Ballyhane Stud sire and is trained by Burke.

Of Alparslan, Barberini continues, "It's a cliché but I'd say Karl really liked him from day one. Last spring, the signals were good, and the horse ran probably even earlier than we thought he would. He was hugely impressive first time out. And being a Fairhouse graduate, we thought the best route would have been going to the sales race.

"Then we slightly threw him in at the deep end in the Dewhurst but the horse was working very well at home, so we didn't think we were too ambitious putting him in there. And he actually ran a great race in the Dewhurst but he probably didn't enjoy the track's undulations. But his form in the Dewhurst was backed up as a three-year-old. He reversed the form with Zavateri [in the Greenham], and he wasn't too far away from Distant Storm in the Dewhurst, and he wasn't too far away from

Distant Storm in the Irish Guineas either."

Alparslan led early in the Irish 2,000 Guineas, continuing to make the running until well within the final furlong.

"He ran a brilliant race," says Barberini. "We rode him with confidence and he ran very well, possibly just paid the price for being up there. He was probably 50 yards away from finishing second - he really just faded in the last 50 yards."

At Royal Ascot, Alparslan has options over six furlongs in the G1 Commonwealth Cup and over seven in the G3 Jersey Stakes, and his trainer has already been looking further into the season at some potential overseas travel.

Burke said on Friday, "The racing programme offers plenty of options for a colt of his profile. He holds entries in both the Jersey Stakes and the Commonwealth Cup at Royal Ascot, and also in the Group 1 Prix Jean Prat in Deauville on July 12.

"Looking further ahead, the G1 Maurice de Gheest on August 9 and the £600,000 City of York Stakes on August 22 are good options as the season progresses.

"Ultimately I see Alparslan as a serious candidate for the \$10-million Golden Eagle at Randwick in late October."

Of the owner's decision to put the colt forward for the sale, Barberini explains, "There has been interest in the horse, unavoidably, after the Greenham and the Guineas, and it's worth a try. We have had a lot of fun with him. We're not selling because we are not happy, we're selling because it could make financial sense to sell. Sometimes you hate having to do that because of many more races you could win in the future, but it's a normal cycle in the business.

"The owner, Mr Al Shehhi, is a fantastic supporter. Every year he loves buying his yearlings and trying to spin the wheel again.

"With Alparslan, there's real potential there for stepping into Group 1 company. He's shown he's a Group 1 horse and he's not a finished article. The horse has plenty of scope even to be a four-year-old." **Cont. p12**

RAYIF TO MISS ST JAMES'S PALACE STAKES, AS SIX GO FORWARD

French 2000 Guineas hero **Rayif** (Sea The Moon) will not take part in the G1 St James's Palace Stakes as he is not 100%, according to Aga Khan Studs' racing manager Nemone Routh.

A winner of the G3 Prix Francois Boutin and third in the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere at two, the Francis-Henri Graffard trainee was a smart winner of the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains in May. He will not take on the English and Irish 2000 Guineas winners **Bow Echo** (Night Of Thunder) and **Gstaad** ([Starspangledbanner](#)), respectively, on opening day of Royal Ascot. The G1 Prix Jean Prat has been floated as a new target for the Aga Khan Studs'

homebred.

Routh said, "It is nothing serious it is just that overnight he didn't eat up and then this morning he had a mild temperature so we felt we couldn't put him on the truck tonight because he was due to leave with Rayevka [(Blue Point) runs in the King Charles III Stakes].

"He is sound, he's got no issues it is just that this has fallen at the wrong time. If he hadn't had to be shipped tonight we might have declared and see how he was in the morning but because he had to get on a truck tonight we just felt it wasn't the right thing to do for the horse so Francis decided not to declare him.

"She goes [Rayevka] and everyone else is fine. We think it is pretty minor and if it is we will reroute him to something like the Jean Prat or something like that [at Deauville on July 12]."

The St James's Palace Stakes will feature the aforementioned Guineas winners, as well as Charlie Appleby's **Talk Of New York** (Wootton Bassett).

Bow Echo's trainer George Boughey decided to skip bidding for a second Guineas and explained, "He was doing a nice piece of work on the Friday morning some horses were shipping over to Ireland and having a hard race, so he's been able to build up and hopefully peak on Tuesday.

"It's a long game with this horse, I hope. He's a horse who is going to keep on improving, there's big days ahead of him and I had more confidence of having him right for Ascot by not going to Ireland.

"I would have fancied him on the day knowing how he worked on the Friday morning, but I thought for the longevity of the horse it was more important that he had the break."

Besides Gstaad, Aidan O'Brien also runs **Puerto Rico** (Wootton Bassett), a dual Group 1 winner as a juvenile last season. Robson de Aguiar's **Power Blue** (Space Blues) and **Lord Britain** (Universal), who is trained by Ismail Mohammed and Jose Santos, have also been declared.

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IRISH THOROUGHBRED INDUSTRY HOSTS VAUTMANS AND CASSART

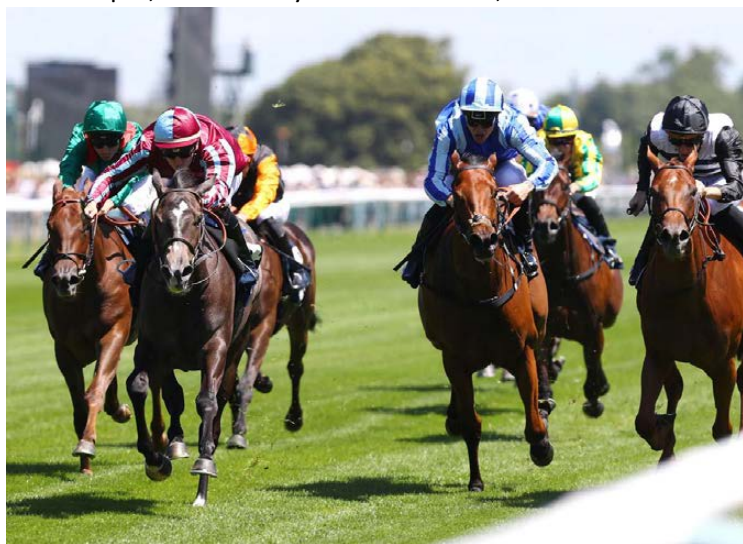

MEISHO TABARU DOUBLES THE FUN IN TAKARAZUKA KINEN *by Heather Anderson*

Legendary jockey Yutaka Take bettered his own record when winning his sixth G1 Takarazuka Kinen and second aboard **Meisho Tabaru** (Gold Ship) at Hanshin on Sunday. The 57-year-old previously claimed the race with **Inari One** (1989), **Meijiroy McQueen** (1993), **Marvelous Sunday** (1997), and **Deep Impact** (2006).

The "Win and You're In" for the G1 Breeders' Cup Turf at Keeneland in October featured a full field of 18, and, shortly before the bell, a deluge turned the course from good to firm to yielding. Second in the betting at 29-10 behind 2025 Japanese Derby hero **Croix Du Nord** (Kitasan Black), the Yoshitaka Matsumoto-owned five-year-old kept a close eye on frontrunner **Cosmo Kuranda** (Al Ain) from the bell while well off the fence.

A touch eager behind the runaway leader, Meisho Tabaru settled in a good rhythm for the backstretch run as the rain continued to come down.

Edging closer past 1600 metres in 1:36.50, the eventual winner collared Cosmo Kuranda at the furlong grounds before fending off the late lunge of Croix Du Nord by a neck for the win. 2024 Japanese Derby victor **Danon Decile** (Epiphaneia) closed resolutely from well of the pace for third, another 2 1/2 lengths behind the top pair. G2 Nikkei Sho scorer **My Universe** (Rey De Oro) was pulled up in the straight. He later died from heart failure, according to the Japanese Racing Association.

"When it started raining just before the race, I felt as though the late owner Yoshio Matsumoto had sent it down from heaven," said Take. "Since races are unpredictable, I stayed flexible and settled in second position, and we were able to race in good rhythm. When Croix du Nord closed in before the wire, I thought, 'Please, not this time!' I felt that Meisho Tabaru was in really good form and the strongest today. I think we can head to France with our heads held high."

A winner at two and successful in the G3 Mainichi Hai and later the G2 Kobe Shimbun Hai at three, Meisho Tabaru hit a career high when taking the 2025 edition of this race. Sixth in the G1 Tenno Sho (Autumn) coming back off a break in November, he ran 13th to Museum Mile (Leontes)--ninth here on Sunday--in the G1 Arima Kinen in December. He finished second by a nose in the 2000-metre G1 Osaka Hai to rival Croix Du Nord on April 5 and is one of **seven Japanese horses** entered in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe.

Pedigree Notes

Dual classic winner Gold Ship was the first horse to win two editions of the Takarazuka Kinen in 2013/2014. His son is the third horse to accomplish that feat after Chrono Genesis (Bago) in 2020/2021. At stud, Gold Ship has 10 stakes winners (nine group scorers). Meisho Tabaru is his most decorated runner, and he is also the sire of G1 Yushun Himba (Japanese Oaks) heroine Uberleben.

Out of Meisho Tsubakuro (French Deputy) who won at three and four, Meisho Tabaru counts G2 Kyoto Daishoten hero Meisho Kampauk (Grass Wonder) in his family.

Since foaling the winner, his dam has four-year-old gelding Meisho Hinkaku (Roger Barows), three-year-old filly Kimigahama (Dee Majesty), a two-year-old colt by Al Ain and a yearling full-sister to the winner. She was bred to Titleholder last spring, but did not get in foal.

The outcome of this will depend on the pace that Billy Loughnane goes on **Opera Ballo**, who showed how much he appreciates being allowed to bowl along in front in the Sandown Mile. While the beauty of that willingness to dictate means that he is in here with his own agenda, it is impossible to escape the fact that a strong tempo is exactly what his illustrious stablemate **Notable Speech** needs and exactly what he didn't get when fourth in this 12 months ago. Also undone by slack early fractions in the 2024 St James's Palace, the often-brilliant Notable Speech comes into this contest which has seen winners return at 33-1, 14-1, 33-1 and 14-1 in recent years as a short-priced favourite who regardless of excuses is zero from two visits here. While Opera Ballo, who will sport the Godolphin blue with the white cap so often successful in this in the past, is no pacemaker he should also set things up perfectly for **More Thunder**. Campaigned initially over 10 furlongs by Sir Michael Stoute before being transformed into a six-furlong sprinter by William Haggas, he has gradually moved back up in trip with menace and his first start over this trip last time in the Lockinge saw him finish faster than the winner Notable Speech. This could be a renewal for the big favourites, with last year's surprise package **Docklands** unlikely to enjoy the same pace scenario and fast ground counting against the QEII shocker **Cicero's Gift**, but if there is one to cause a minor upset it could be **Damysus** who will be much more at home at Ascot than he was at Newbury on his first try at the trip. Bar the absent Rayif, this epic renewal of one of the week's best races sees all the main actors at the trip converging with **Bow Echo** very much the leading man on his impressive 2,000 Guineas success. One of the finest to grace that Classic, *full stop*, he faces a different test here over this stiff mile where it could be that he is put into the red for the first time by **Puerto Rico** and **Gstaad**. He's so good it's hard to find any weak spot, but from stable reports it could be that he is getting faster all the time and he might be more vulnerable here than elsewhere due to the track's demanding nature. Gstaad is one of Ballydoyle's best milers of recent times and it is worth noting that he recorded a time nearly a second faster than Field Of Gold's in the Irish 2,000 Guineas last year and we all know what that Juddmonte celebrity went on to do here. Reported to have come forward from both runs this year and having enjoyed the perfect preparation, Gstaad has to do it here if he is ever going to put one over his Newmarket conqueror. So impressive from late summer onwards in 2025, Puerto Rico can be expected to step up from his comeback in the Poule d'Essai des Poulains and loves being allowed to dominate in front, while the impressive Heron Stakes winner **Talk Of New York** is a strong stayer at the trip who will greatly benefit if the pace is overdone. Draw may be a big factor in this renewal, with the Australians **Overpass** and **Asfoora**, last year's winner **American Affair** and Ballydoyle's **Mission Central** all racing towards the stand's rail which can be heavily favoured on the straight track. Seven of the last nine winners came from double-figure stalls, with only the top-class Blue Point and Bradsell overcoming being drawn in the low numbers so the recent revelation **Night Raider** could be up against it from stall six. As usual in the world's best sprints, Ka Ying Rising dominates the conversation and the fact that Overpass could get within two lengths of him in the Everest probably stands him in good stead here. Time and again, the Australian sprinters have been able to overwhelm their Northern Hemisphere counterparts and it will be no surprise if this becomes the latest chapter in the ongoing saga. Drawn favourably in 15, **Rayevka** is of interest having run only twice over this trip including when winning the Prix de Saint-Georges last time. She showed when third to **Time For Sandals** in last year's Commonwealth Cup that she appreciates this track, as did Mission Central when taking the inaugural British Champions Day Two-Year-Old Conditions Stakes over six furlongs in October. If there is one at a huge price who could make an impact it is **Aspect Island**, third in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint and still unexposed over this trip. [Tom Frary].

Again the draw could be a factor here, with Ballydoyle's first-string **Confucius** towards the stands' rail in 20 and stablemate **Great Barrier Reef** in three. The fact that Aidan O'Brien holds the record with 11 renewals is no coincidence, with his juveniles conditioned to run hard and take the pain even at this fledgling stage of their careers. Both this year's contenders have exhibited that "hardiness" he often talks about already, with Confucius super-strong on Naas's established Royal Ascot Trials Day and Great Barrier Reef taking the Marble Hill and while the betting suggests the former is well ahead it is impossible to be certain. Eve Johnson Houghton has done well at this meeting in recent times and her adoration of the unbeaten **Night In Vegas** is notable, while Richard Hannon is following on from his father in targeting this with one of his cracks. **Cut A Dash** is another of those exciting **Starspangledbanner** progeny that seem to be popping up everywhere at present and the way he went over York's flat five suggested this will suit him ideally. Any analysis of a two-year-old race at Royal Ascot wouldn't be complete without including a Karl Burke runner and Wathnan's impressive Ayr winner **Ruler's Pride** looks to be made of the right stuff. He's a Mehmas too, so a win for him would carry extra import as he would remarkably be the sire's first at the Royal meeting. [Tom Frary].
