

\$410K EARLY VOTING COLT LEADS STRONG OBS JUNE OPENER

Ocala, FL - With a colt by **Early Voting** topping the day's results, the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's June 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale concluded its first of three sessions Tuesday with an average and median ahead of last year's record-setting figures.

During Tuesday's session, 163 horses sold through the ring for a gross of \$9,066,000.

The average was \$55,620--up 26.5% from last year's opening session--and the median of \$30,000 was up 15.4% from the corresponding 2025 figure.

The cumulative average from last year's two-day June sale was \$51,107 and the median was \$25,000, both highwater marks for the auction.

From 327 catalogued juveniles, 239 went through the ring with 76 failing to meet their reserves for a buy-back rate of 31.8%. It was 25.5% during the first session a year ago and the 2025 two-day cumulative figure was 17.1%.

A colt from the first crop of GI Preakness Stakes winner **Early Voting** topped the session when selling for \$410,000 to trainer Greg Compton on behalf of MAG Racing Stables.

All those so avid to see how **Flightline** will fare in his second career should surely be gratified if he can prove as effective as the last champion to enter stud with anything approaching his freakish reputation.

Two new stakes winners last Saturday, one on either coast, took **Justify** past 50 from four crops. (His fifth, at this point, having barely entered the fray.) One, GIII Summertime Oaks winner Mizumi, became his 24th graded stakes scorer in the Northern Hemisphere; among which 10 have scored at the highest level, including in all three colts' Classics in Britain.

That latter distinction--an astonishing one, from such limited opportunity over the water--has not necessarily served to his advantage in a notoriously parochial domestic market. **Cont. p7**

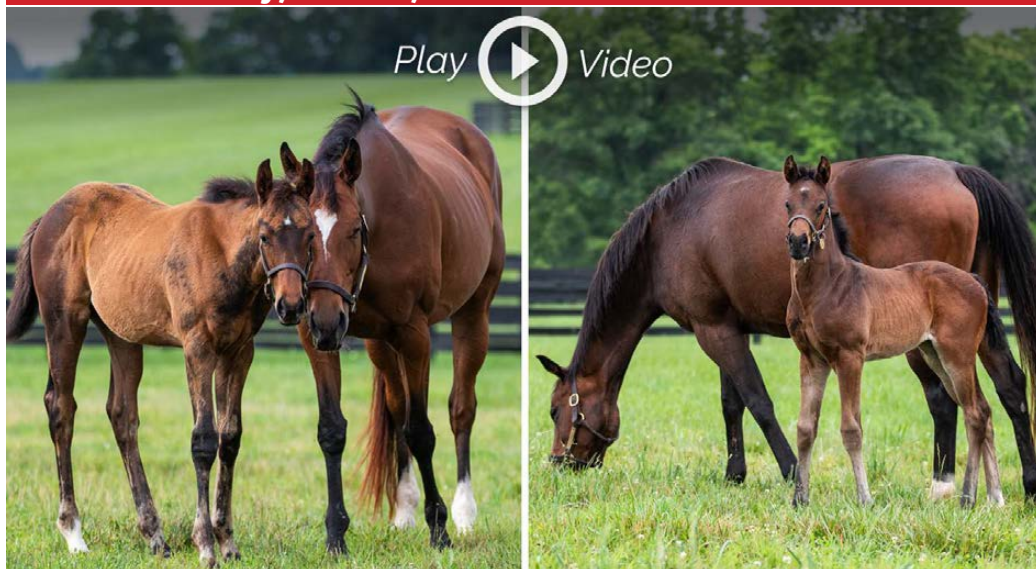

The juvenile was consigned by Julie Davies, whose past June consignments have included multiple Grade I winner Adare Manor (Uncle Mo) and multiple stakes winner Solitude Dude (Yaupon).

"I think if you bring the right horse here, if you bring a good horse, then there are plenty of people here to buy them," Davies said.

Donato Lanni acquired the session's top-priced filly, going to \$370,000 on behalf of Frank Fletcher for a daughter of Mo Donegal from the Envision Equine consignment.

"We've been very lucky at June," Lanni, who purchased Adare Manor for \$375,000 in 2021, said. "A lot of these horses were given the time to come here. But I do like June. It's a fun sale."

Bloodstock agent Sean Perl, who purchased a colt by Yaupon destined for the barn of trainer Mike Maker for \$270,000 early in Tuesday's session, said he saw plenty of upside in shopping at the June sale.

"I love the June sale," Perl said. "It's my favorite sale. It's all value. You never know which runner is going to be the one to step up to the plate. Usually the sellers are motivated to sell and we are here to buy."

The OBS June sale continues through Thursday with sessions beginning daily at 10:30 a.m. ET.

Early Voting Colt To Compton's String

A colt by **Early Voting** (hip 168) will be joining Greg Compton's Delaware Park-based string after the trainer bid \$410,000 to acquire the juvenile on behalf of MAG Racing Stables Tuesday at OBS.

"He's a good-looking individual and he had a great breeze," Compton said of the colt. "And the stud is off to a great start."

Consigned by Julie Davies, the dark bay colt is out of Cara Dura (**War Front**) and from the family of Exchange Rate. He worked a furlong in :10 flat at last week's under-tack preview.

"I stable at Delaware Park, so he will go up there," Compton said. "We race at Oaklawn over the winter, so he may get a little break for 30 days and then we'll get him back going again."

Of the colt's price tag, Compton added, "It was a little more than we thought, but he's a nice individual. It's been competitive and if you want a nice horse, you're going to have to pay for him. Things didn't work out for us in April or at Timonium, so we came to try to buy a few here."

MAG Racing is the racing partnership of Gregg Massanelli and Margaret Molleston. Massanelli is an orthopedic surgeon in El Dorado, Arkansas. Molleston is an executive with GeoSouthern Energy Partners, a petroleum and natural gas production company headquartered in suburban Houston.

Compton purchased G.W.'s Girl (**Munnings**) on behalf of MAG Racing for \$130,000 at the 2024 OBS March sale. The filly won last year's Mockingbird Stakes and Dixie Belle Stakes.

Davies purchased the **Early Voting** colt for \$52,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton October sale.

"He was just very athletic and he had a great walk," Davies said of the colt's appeal last fall.

Early Voting, winner of the 2022 GI Preakness Stakes, has gotten off to a fast start with his first horses to hit the track this year. The stallion has already been represented by four winners from seven starters and three of those winners earned the 'TDN Rising Star presented by Hagyard' moniker.

"I have been a fan of **Early Voting** since the yearling sales and I've been harping on about him all year," Davies said. "I am sure [his fast start at stud] helped [Tuesday's result], but this was a nice horse on his own. And he was fast."

Davies added hip 168 was always targeted at the June sale.

"He was because I had three **Early Voting** colts and I didn't want to put them all in the same sale."

\$370k Mo Donegal Filly To Frank Fletcher

A filly from the first crop of GI Belmont Stakes victor Mo Donegal (**hip 93**) topped early returns during the opening session of the OBS June sale Tuesday when bringing a final bid of \$370,000 from bloodstock agent Donato Lanni. Lanni was bidding on behalf of longtime owner Frank Fletcher and the filly will be trained by Bob Baffert.

"We wanted to buy a filly for Frank," Lanni said. "He and Bob are really good friends. They have a huge amount of respect for each other. So he wants to send this one to Bob. Bob is coming to Churchill and Oaklawn and Frank's an Oaklawn guy and he likes Churchill. We are going to look at running her there."

Hip 93, consigned by Envision Equine, is out of multiple stakes-placed Bakken Baby (Valid Expectations) and she shared the bullet furlong of :9 4/5 at last week's under-tack preview.

The filly, bred by Forever Spring Farm, was purchased for \$30,000 at last year's Keeneland September sale and sold for \$200,000 at the OBS March sale earlier this year.

"She has changed a lot," Lanni said when asked about the filly's progress from March to June. "She's gotten bigger and stronger."

The elder Garcia has over two decades experience in the industry, having served stints with trainer Nick Zito and legendary consignor Eddie Woods.

At the 2020 delayed June sale, Fabian Sales sold a colt by Shackleford for \$80,000 for the consignments previous high price. He had been purchased for \$3,500 at the previous year's Keeneland September sale.

'WE'LL JUST TAKE A SHOT': CHARLATAN COLT A CAREER SCORE FOR GARCIAS

Ruben Garcia and his father Fabian decided to take a chance on a colt by **Charlatan** (hip 56) who RNA'd without a bid in Book 4 of last year's Keeneland September sale, buying the youngster for just \$1,000. The chance paid off in spades when the juvenile, consigned by the family's Fabian Sales, sold for \$195,000 to D.J. Stable during Tuesday's first session of the OBS June sale.

"I didn't," Ruben Garcia said when asked if he had seen the colt go through the ring at Keeneland. "My cousin told me about him. He told me this is going to be a good horse and we should go look at him. We just decided we would take a shot and if it didn't work, we would race him. Since the beginning, we said June was going to be his sale. He sure proved it."

The dark bay colt is out of Always Aware (**Street Sense**) and from the family of Fed Biz, Minardi and Tale of the Cat. He worked a furlong during last week's under-tack preview in :10 1/5.

"He was a skinny foal," Garcia said. "So everyone just probably set him aside. And he's just turned out to be a great horse."

An emotional Garcia said this marked the highest sale result for Fabian Sales, which has been in business for about a decade.

"We were comfortable with \$75,000, but then at the last minute, my father said to put a \$100,000 reserve on him," Garcia said of expectations heading to the ring Tuesday. "And he past that easily. We were nervous. This is our first higher horse that we have sold."

TDN TAKEAWAYS

- First-crop sires continued to be in demand with juveniles by **Early Voting** and Mo Donegal topping the day's priciest lots. **Speaker's Corner** and **Jack Christopher** also featured in the top-ten hips.
- Tuesday's opening session saw 163 head sold compared to 243 from last year's abbreviated two-day OBS June Sale. So while gross dropped accordingly to \$9,066,000, the average and median both rose over last year to \$55,620 and \$30,000 respectively. 76 hips failed to meet their reserve.
- Tom McCrocklin finished as the day's top consignor with three sold for \$730,000. CHPR was the session's top buyer, picking up 20 hips for \$422,000.
- Last year's opening day was topped by a \$300,000 son of Yaupon. Tuesday's \$410,000 topper easily eclipsed that mark with a further 10 hips crossing the \$200,000 mark, bettering the mark of six last year.
- Four of the top fives hips sold were fillies, with only the session topper breaking up the monopoly. Included in that top five was a pair of Uncle Mo fillies both consigned by Tom McCrocklin after RNA'ing at earlier OBS Sales this season.

Breeding Digest *Justify*, cont. from p1

Yet *Justify*'s transatlantic impact surely extends the flexible dynamism that has branded his sire-line, at various points, as historic in its influence.

His sire Scat Daddy, grandsire Johannesburg (especially as a runner) and, beyond them, Storm Cat and Northern Dancer all displayed a genetic vigor that transcended local conditions. And here, remember, we are talking about a dirt paragon whose brawny build proved equal to the grail of the American sport; an assignment routinely treated, by trainers today, as beyond the competence of the modern Thoroughbred.

Justify has immediately vindicated the historic rationale for the Triple Crown format, as a tried-and-trusted measure of the kind of genes we should be looking to replicate. In the process, he has shown European breeders what they had almost uniformly been missing, over the preceding generation: namely, the dirt speed that supplies a gap in what they understand by "stamina."

It is this type of speed-the kind that can be carried--that has sustained those Classic winners through eight, 12 and even 14 furlongs. Yet the dismal reality is that the author of the latter success, Scandinavia in the G1 St Leger last September, will by many be perceived as actually damaging *Justify*'s brand if he can win another venerable prize at Royal Ascot this week: the G1 Gold Cup, for which he is hot favorite, being run over a distance (two and a half miles) to bewilder American horsemen.

But a relentless galloper like Scandinavia is simply deploying the same gusto as the ill-fated Ruling Court, who last year won the G1 2,000 Guineas over a mile; or Grand Job, who failed by just a nose to win a Grade I dirt sprint at Keeneland this spring; or Arabian Lion, the young Spendthrift sire who won the GI Woody Stephens Stakes.

Arabian Lion is out of a Distorted Humor mare, and so too is

Mizumi--who herself started out winning a dirt sprint before stepping up to an extended mile for her immediate graduation to graded company. It was over similar distances that her dam Sweet Opportunity (Distorted Humor) was repeatedly placed in minor black-type company before her acquisition, on retirement, by Baoma Corp. for \$190,000 at the 2017 Keeneland January Sale.

Her racetrack accomplishments were underpinned by the fact that she was out of an unraced sister to GII Lane's End Stakes winner Adriano (A.P. Indy). That pair also had a notable half-sister in graded stakes-placed Gold d'Oro (Medaglia d'Oro), dam of GIII Swale Stakes winner Strike Power (Speightstown). These, in turn, were out of a daughter of Mr. Prospector and Bet Twice's GI Santa Anita Oaks-winning half-sister Golden Treat (Theatrical {Ire}). Duly favored by some good covers, Sweet Opportunity's four previous starters have all won--but *Justify* appears to have given her a superior talent.

On the face of it, his other stakes winner on Saturday was of limited commercial service: Just a Touch made all in the Cape Henlopen Stakes at Delaware Park over 12 furlongs of grass. But while this horse's first black-type success is deserved to the point of being overdue, it hardly upgrades his form in some of the most resonant dirt races around: he was beaten only by *Sierra Leone* himself in the GI Blue Grass Stakes, for instance, and last year made the podium (albeit in a small field) in the GI Met Mile.

And if the switch to turf was prompted by a rather disappointing effort as favorite for the GI Santa Anita Handicap, back in March, then let's not forget how that race was won in dominant fashion by another son of *Justify* in British Isles. **Cont.**

**Justify** | Coolmore

Just a Touch has now banked a few cents shy of \$900,000, confirming him an alert buy by Fergus Galvin for \$300,000 as a 2-year-old at OBS. He's out of GIII Comely Stakes winner Touching Beauty (**Tapit**), and by this stage his body of work is close to earning him a chance at stud. Who knows, for an enlightened program somewhere, his new metier may even increase his eligibility.

High Altitudes

Flightline may yet turn out to be the next Northern Dancer but for now, albeit with massive advantages in the caliber of his mares, he remains a blank slate in his new role. It is certainly an eloquent commentary on our times, then, that **Justify's** fifth crop of yearlings-while retailing at a perfectly respectable \$336,372-were last year valued at not quite half of **Flightline's** debut crop, which averaged \$737,274.

That, of course, simply makes **Flightline** a dramatization of the familiar, automatic treatment of all new sires by the commercial market. However high he can build, the first brick in his wall will always remain Demian, the \$1.7 million yearling who scored on debut in Japan at the weekend.

While this fellow's cost was plainly supported by his physique, it also reflected his page--and the help **Flightline** will have received from his mares. In fact, the September Sale catalogue could barely accommodate half the story. His unraced dam Mira Alta (**Curlin**), a \$200,000 Rock Ridge recruit in the same ring at the 2015 November Sale, had already delivered three graded stakes performers including GIII Peter Pan Stakes winner Promise Keeper (**Constitution**). And the rest of the page was consumed by other siblings out of Zenith (Roy), notably GI Breeders' Futurity winner Great Hunter (Aptitude); and the unraced Bernardini mare Aspen Light (Bernardin), as dam of multiple graded stakes winner Owendale (Into Mischief).

Since then, Aspen Light has additionally become dam of a Grade I winner in Shred the Gnar (Into Mischief). Even as it was, however, the wider dynasty spreading beneath Zenith's dam remained known only to those for whom her name will instantly have dominated the three-generation fishtail at the top of the catalogue page. The Keswick Farm matriarch Sequins (Northern Fashion) entwines many an active pedigree, not least as granddam of champion Stellar Wind (**Curlin**)--and therefore filling the same slot for Demian as he does behind leading sophomore Plutarch (Into Mischief).

Setting the Early Pace

These remain absurdly early days, of course, for all these young stallions. But if such are the games we must play, then can you imagine the hype if **Flightline** started in the same fashion as **Early Voting**?

The son of **Gun Runner** (out of a half-sister, remember, to none other than Speightstown) has so far fielded four winners from seven starters, three flamboyant enough to be anointed 'TDN Rising Stars, presented by Hagyard.'

The latest of these, Balloteer, saw off a well-fancied son of **Flightline** in :57 at Churchill last weekend, having first signposted his direction of travel when elevating a nice yearling return (\$170,000 at Fasig last July) to \$475,000 at OBS in March.

Balloteer is yet another out of a Distorted Humor mare. Though she finished last on her solitary start, and was subsequently sold for \$19,000, Just Joking has produced eight winners from nine starters: one graded stakes-placed, but generally modest enough from modest covers. She certainly offers embers to be stoked, however, as a granddaughter of champion sprinter Safely Kept (Horatius).

Early Voting's debut crop graduated from a book of 191 mares; and yet last year he covered 64 at half his opening fee (\$12,500 from \$25,000). Same horse, same semen; and, essentially, no more or less proven, other than having averaged a rock-solid \$129,485 with his first yearlings.

As always, then, we will only discover which agents and managers truly believed in him (as opposed to believing just in the market for new sires) if they feature among those to double down at lower fees, precisely as their "judgement" is about to be vindicated in the starting gate. Still a long a way to go, plainly, but those who kept the faith can only feel encouraged.

17 HORSES KILLED IN FIRE AT SARATOGA HARNESS

A **barn fire that broke out early Tuesday morning** has claimed the lives of 17 horses at Saratoga Casino Hotel, which sits off Nelson Avenue in Saratoga Springs and is directly across the street from the Thoroughbred track.

The barn housed a total of 18 horses and was completely destroyed. One horse escaped the barn and sustained minor injuries.

No people were hurt, according to the casino hotel and fire department.

The horses belonged to two trainers who stabled their horses in the barn. Trainer Robyn Mangiardi lost 11 horses, while trainer Timothy Benson lost six horses.

The fire was contained to a single barn and did not spread to adjacent structures. Security personnel from both Saratoga Casino Hotel and the nearby Saratoga Racecourse, along with emergency responders, acted quickly to evacuate horses from neighboring barns and secure the surrounding area.

Approximately 350 horses are typically housed on the backstretch.

"The loss suffered today is heartbreaking for our racing community," said Chief Executive Officer of Saratoga Casino Hotel Sam Gerrity. "Our thoughts remain with Robyn, Tim, their teams, the horse owners, and everyone affected by this tragedy. We are deeply grateful to the security personnel, first responders, and racing staff whose swift actions helped protect the horses and people in the surrounding barns."

Saratoga Casino Hotel is working with Saratoga Hospital to make grief counseling services available to trainers, caretakers, owners, and other members of the backstretch community affected by this tragedy. Information regarding counseling resources will be provided directly to those impacted.

"This is a sobering day in our industry, a horse person's worst nightmare. We express our deep condolences to all impacted and thank all emergency responders and track workers for their quick response," said President Saratoga Harness Horseperson's Association Henry Westbrook.

The area remains closed as investigators continue to determine the cause of the fire.

Tuesday's card at Saratoga Casino Hotel was cancelled.

"Our thoughts are with the horse owners, trainers, caretakers, and all those affected by this tragic loss," John Matarazzo, director of racing operations at Saratoga Casino Hotel, said. "We are grateful for the swift actions of our security, nearby NYRA personnel and the Saratoga Springs Fire Department, whose efforts helped save numerous horses and ensured there were no injuries to people on site."

Citing Sarah Burger, a city supervisor and lawyer for the Saratoga Harness Horseperson's Association who represents the harness track, the *Albany Times Union* first reported that 30 horses had died, then updated the number of deaths to 17.

Burger told the *Times Union* that she expects the probe into the cause of the fire will be a collaborative effort--but also a lengthy process.

Fire Chief Aaron Dyer told the *Times Union* that the fire was reported at 2:30 a.m. A video shared with the *Times Union* shows flames towering over one of the barns, while orange smoke illuminated by the flames below rose above several barns.

"Horse racing in New York is a community of hardworking people linked together by a shared commitment to the horses," said NYRA's President & CEO David O'Rourke. "This morning's tragic fire at the Saratoga Hotel Casino Harness Track will have a profound impact on that community, and NYRA extends our condolences to all those affected by this loss.

RESPONSIBLE TRANSITIONS FROM RACING CAN HAPPEN DIGITALLY

A recent article in the TDN, "[He Thought His Horse Had Been Retired, So Why Did It Show Up at Chippewa Downs?](#)" has attracted a lot of attention. It should. It's an unfortunate situation: an older Thoroughbred, sold for breeding purposes and believed by its owner to have been retired from racing ultimately returns to racing under new connections, raising understandable concerns about welfare and accountability.

Scenarios like this are preventable and can be addressed through an existing protocol.

Transferred as Retired from Racing (TRR)--a process available to all owners--should be viewed not as optional, but as a best practice. When properly recorded through The Jockey Club, a horse's Certificate of Foal Registration is clearly marked to prevent a return to racing and to notify racetracks accordingly.

The process is straightforward, can be completed digitally, and provides clarity for all parties involved--the seller, the buyer, downstream aftercare organizations, and racing offices. Most importantly, it helps ensure that horses retiring due to injury, age, or lack of competitiveness are not cycled back into racing.

At the same time, the designation does not limit a horse's future beyond the track. Horses with breeding potential can still transition into stud or broodmare careers, preserving both their breeding value and their welfare while eliminating the risk of an unintended return to competition.

As an industry, we must continue to emphasize responsible transitions from racing into second careers and new ownership. Wider adoption of the Transferred as Retired from Racing feature is a simple, practical step that meaningfully advances those goals and helps prevent exactly the kind of situation that happened to Nepal Up.

SANTA ANITA 2025-26 MEET CONCLUDES

After a delayed start last December, Santa Anita's 2025-26 meet concluded on Monday, June 15, the first time the meet has ended on a Monday in its 91-year history.

The on-track crowd totaled over 540,000 fans for the season and averaged more than 7,000 per day over the 77-day season, which included both the Classic and Hollywood meets.

All sources handle totaled \$708,112,231, with an average daily handle of \$9,196,263. It marked the sixth consecutive year daily handle has exceeded \$9 million for the Winter-Spring season.

"Santa Anita is one of the most magnificent racetracks in the world and an integral part of American racing over the first half of the calendar year," said Bill Nader, President of the Thoroughbred Owners of California. "The purse for a maiden allowance during the Spring meet was up more than 20% when compared to two years ago. We are perfectly positioned for another increase next year."

Among owners, Little Red Feather Racing and Madaket Stables won six stakes each, all with partners. The partnerships combined with the Estate of Brereton C. Jones on the ownership of Thought Process, who won both the GI Gamely and the GII Buena Vista Stakes in her two races this year.

Hall of Famer Bob Baffert just edged out Michael McCarthy to lead the trainer standings with 14 stakes wins.

Hall of Fame jockey Mike Smith also recorded his 5,800th win in the saddle this season, while Tyler Baze and Juan Hernandez both notched their 3,000th appearance in the winner's circle. Hernandez had 17 stakes wins to lead all jockeys.

The season got off Dec. 28, in front of the largest opening day crowd since 2016. It was the strongest Sunday curtain raiser this century. Despite record rainfall delaying the traditional Dec. 26 opener two days, wagering topped more than \$18.2 million, marking the eighth time in the last nine years that the opening day handle surpassed the \$18 million mark.

The meet's conclusion was also pushed back a day given the cancellation of four races because of loss of power issues at the Arcadia oval on June 12.

Santa Anita Handicap Day saw the largest crowd in attendance this decade wager 11% more on track than 2025, contributing to a total handle of nearly \$15 million. Santa Anita Derby Day checked in with the largest crowd in attendance since 2018, an increase of more than 9% over 2025. Total handle was \$18,670,017, the highest of the meet. More than 15,000 fans then returned to Santa Anita to watch the Kentucky Derby and wager more than \$17.3 million on the first Saturday in May.

"We are grateful to everyone who supported Santa Anita Park this past season, whether with their horses, their time, or their wagering dollars," said Nate Newby, SVP and General Manager of Santa Anita Park. "The energy that the big crowds bring to one of the greatest venues in the sport is a reminder of why this continues to be a special place."

Live racing returns to Santa Anita Park on Friday, Sept. 25 for the six-week Autumn meet.

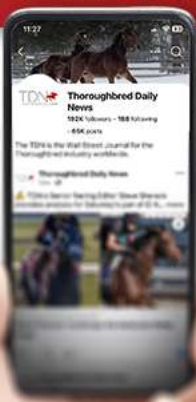

It may have been super-smooth at Newmarket, but Tuesday's G1 St James's Palace Stakes offered a different test to **Bow Echo** (Night Of Thunder) which he was able to pass and at the same time show his other side.

Whereas Billy Loughnane had enjoyed a trouble-free run through the 2,000 Guineas, this was a messy affair with some scrimmaging but the imperturbable rhythm of George Boughey's luminary saw him once again get there in front of **Gstaad** (Starspangledbanner). At the line, it was a short head this time but that tells only half the story.

"It was a very tactical race and not my finest ride, but he got me out of trouble," Loughnane said after registering his own landmark on the 5-6 favourite. "It was a little bit muddling and didn't work out how I imagined, but he's got sheer guts and showed how good he is today."

This renewal was in many ways shaped by the first 50 yards, as David Egan on **Power Blue** (Space Blues) broke faster than Ballydoyle's **Puerto Rico** (Wootton Bassett) and caused a concertina by sprinting down to his right from his wide stall.

Sandwiched between Gstaad and **Talk Of New York** (Wootton Bassett) as a result, Bow Echo showed his consummate professionalism by accepting the conflict while it got to Godolphin's colt who was lit up as a result.

After the early hassle, Ryan Moore was perhaps further back than planned on Gstaad while Bow Echo was out wide taking a trip that would undermine a lesser runner. Heading into the final turn, the former was forging up the inside gap created by Christophe Soumillon on Puerto Rico but Loughnane's body language was already speaking volumes and passing the two pole the contest looked resolved.

From there it was a case of either the winner's stamina ebbing away or him switching to idle, but Gstaad's devouring stride ultimately caused it to get tight as Talk Of New York paid for his earlier exertions backing out of the fight 1 3/4 lengths further behind in third.

"I didn't want to go on the fence and I got a horrible passage around Talk Of New York, but he showed his class," Loughnane added. "The first furlong was crucial and I got squeezed out so it was then a case of trying to manage things. He's a very determined horse with a great turn of foot and fantastic ability."

"You kind of have to adapt and it was a case of getting him back relaxed, breathing again and into his rhythm. Once he found that, he was powerful," he added. "Gstaad probably had a more economical route than we did and we wasted a lot of ground, but he's a very talented horse and was tough towards the business end." [Cont. p4](#)

He added, "I'm so lucky to be sat on a horse like this at the age of 20. I just wish Sheikh Mohammed Obaid Al Maktoum was here to see him, he was the apple of his eye as a two-year-old."

Masterminded through an unbeaten juvenile campaign which included Haydock's Ascendant Stakes and Newmarket's Royal Lodge, Bow Echo is testament to Boughey's data-informed approach to training with the two big three-year-old mile tests now in the bag.

"It's brilliant that he got it done--he was rolling around when he got to the front and huge credit to the runner-up who was

gallant today, but he's a superstar," the trainer said of the late Sheikh Mohammed Obaid's homebred sensation, who was making it a true red-letter day for Night Of Thunder who also had the one-two in the Queen Anne.

"I think that was the first time he got into a proper battle and it was quite a scrap early doors, but I think we'll see a better horse now that he's been in a scrap like that," he added. "It's fine margins in this game and luckily he was on the right side of it. This is very much as far as this horse wants to go--I've thought that for a while--and I think being able to ride him a little bit colder in a straightforward, evenly-run race, hopefully we can see him continue to progress."

"It is a dream to be training horses like this, to be trusted with them, and to do it with Billy makes it even more special. He's like a younger brother, like a friend. We chat the whole time and to be able to have that affinity with a jockey is amazing. I've been lucky to have a lot of good riders ride for me, but he's an exceptional talent, both on and off the horse. He's meticulous in his planning and I think it's showing on the track. To be able to provide him with an unbeaten Guineas winner to come and win at Royal Ascot is as good as it gets." [Cont. p5](#)

"Plan A would be to go to Goodwood for the Sussex Stakes," he concluded. "He is taking his racing very well—he was ready to go a couple of weeks ago. He'll have had a race today, he'll know that, but it's very much all systems go for Goodwood."

Aidan O'Brien said of Gstaad, "I am delighted. Ryan gave him a great ride. The race was a little bit rough early for him and Ryan ended up a little bit further back than he wanted to be, but the

way he went to the line, we are over the moon with him. A furlong down, you would never say he was going to run that close and every stride to the line he was closing, closing, closing."

"The line just came a little bit quick. We are delighted that he is coming forward and are looking forward to him," he added. "We always thought he was a horse who was going to get further. I would say he will if we ever need to step up."

Charlie Appleby said of Talk Of New York, "I feel we've got a nice horse that is going to progress with his career. He still showed signs of inexperience there. It was a bit rough for the first furlong or two and he just ran as though he got a bit frightened in amongst it. We are not too far off them."

At the line, there was half a length between the Night Of Thunder duo, with Opera Ballo sticking to his guns a head away in third.

In fourth was **Zeus Olympios**, remarkably the third Night Of Thunder in the race meaning that Dubawi's sire sons dominated the first four places. Ironically, his own son **Notable Speech** was again disappointing at Ascot, finishing a tame sixth as the 9-4 favourite in this "Win and You're In" for the G1 Breeders' Cup Mile in the autumn.

"He travelled superbly and I didn't think we were going over-quick, but he cruised into it so easily," Shoemark said of the winner, who had last been seen winning the Tattenham Corner Stakes at Epsom on Derby day. "He is clearly thriving and in a good frame of mind. I'm somewhat surprised, but he's turned up where it mattered and I feel very fortunate to be part of that team."

Campaigned mainly over seven furlongs, the lightly-raced winner had flown under the radar despite finishing third and a head in front of More Thunder in the Prix de la Foret on Arc day. His latest win at Epsom came in the renamed and rescheduled John of Gaunt Stakes which he had also won 12 months earlier in its final guise at Haydock and in many ways he entered this a stronger candidate than this race's recent surprise packages Accidental Agent, Lord Glitters, Triple Time and Docklands.

Ten Bob Tony, who has having his first try at this trip in two years, has the distinction of being the longest-priced winner of this since Garrick in 1950.

"It is just an amazing story. Ten Bob Tony was Simon Sadler's first-ever horse and now he's got more than 50 in training worldwide," stated Walker, whose recent record at this meeting was standing up to close inspection even before this race. "The miracle happened. This horse is just a legend. We rode him cold

and, as can happen here at Ascot, it all fell apart in the final furlong. We've got a good team, but it's so tough and that's what makes this so special."

"It is beautiful ground out there. I always think at Ascot you can get away with horses that need a bit of dig on the straight course," he added. "It's like a carpet out there, so it's very forgiving quick ground. We thought after Epsom we'd return to France for the Foret, but then we started thinking about what we'd do between now and then and as we were already in this race we thought we'd have a go. You can't win sitting at home."

Sadler added, "This horse is named after my dad. That was his nickname because he used to run a 50p--or 10 bob--stall on the market in Blackpool. Dad's not here today as he's not in the best of health, but I'm sure he watched it and I'd bet he had more on the horse than I did! I am blown away. I am shaking." [Cont. p8](#)

"There are tears running down my face. Never in a million years did we think this would happen. Now Ed's going to be in a lot of trouble because we probably should have been running him over a mile for the past two years rather than seven furlongs!"

More Thunder's trainer William Haggas said, "Frustrating, but there we go. We ran a very good race and, to be fair, I probably would have taken second place this morning but we always like to win. Full credit to Ed. I don't know where he's sprung that one from, but there we are."

Charlie Appleby said of Opera Ballo and Notable Speech, "As Billy [Loughnane] said, there's a headwind out there and it's tough to do what we tried to do. He said the horse jumped a little keen for the first two furlongs before getting into a nice rhythm. He felt he was breathing well and doing everything right, but it was always going to be difficult into that headwind."

"To be fair to him, he stuck at it. We know what this horse wants--the Sussex is tailor-made for him and we've always felt that was the case. But we had to come here and let him take his chance and, at the end of the day, he's run a creditable race to finish third."

"As for Notable Speech, I'm afraid you've got to say it's something to do with Ascot. He just doesn't seem to turn up here as the same horse. We know what he can do--normally William is sitting still from the three to the one-pole, but he was asking the horse to try and pick up two furlongs out today which is never a good sign. He just doesn't turn up here, so we will probably head to France for the Prix Jacques le Marois before his usual travels to North America."

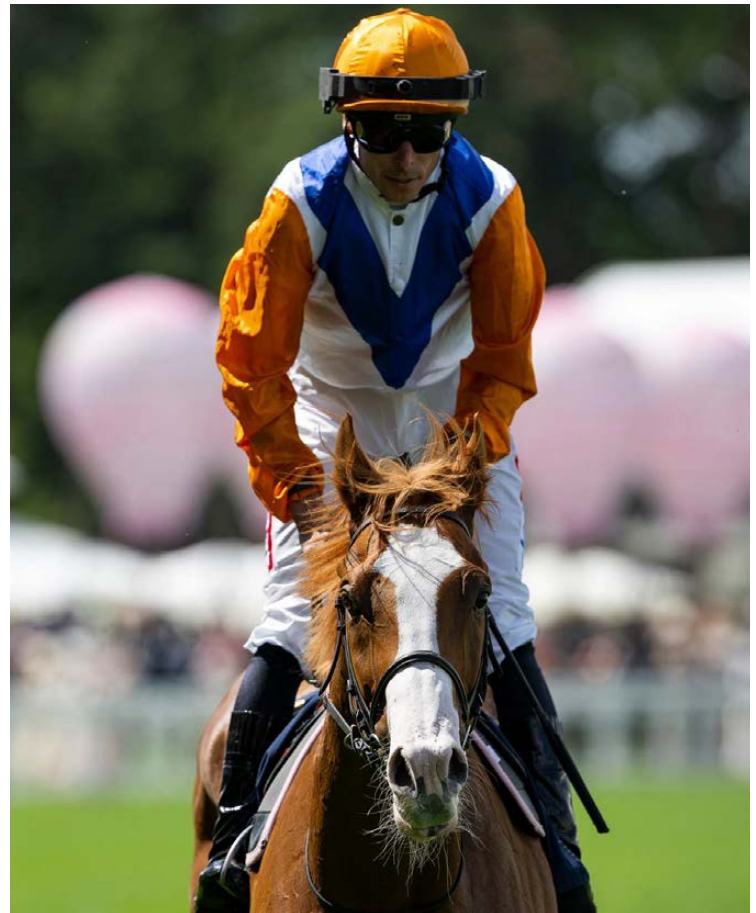

AIDAN O'BRIEN COMPLETES ROYAL ASCOT FULL HOUSE WITH MISSION CENTRAL

Aidan O'Brien's pattern-race resume at Royal Ascot had yet to include the G1 King Charles III Stakes and the Ballydoyle maestro completed the set when Ryan Moore produced the gelded three-year-old **Mission Central** (**No Nay Never**) fast and late to follow up Great Barrier Reef's Coventry success and secure a quickfire double for his sire in the five-furlong charge. The race is a "Win and You're In" for the G1 Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint at Keeneland in the autumn.

"They went hard, which suited him, and Ryan [Moore] gave him a brilliant ride," the winning trainer said. "He's a very fast horse, he's unbeaten this year and has progressed with every run. Ryan obviously knew they were going really hard, he really motivated him inside the final furlong and it was incredible. He is a horse that could suit The Everest at the end of the year, so he's a very exciting horse."

Coolmore's Tom Magnier concurred and added, "It was very impressive what Mission Central did today and we have a slot in The Everest. It is a great race, it's one we'd love to win and it would be great to think about it, but obviously it's up to Aidan. We will see how the horse pulls up, but it would definitely be a race that you could put on the radar for him."

Moore continued, "I thought I'd won, but it's always hard when you're so wide and far apart. Aidan can do anything and Mission Central is a progressive horse. They went hard, he got into a nice rhythm and he just landed there. It worked out beautifully. I am lucky to ride for Ballydoyle and Coolmore, and everything they run this week is going to have a chance."

This term's Listed Woodland Stakes and Listed Naas Sprint winner was alert from the stalls and found a rhythm in midfield initially before slipping back towards the rear approaching halfway. [Cont. p10](#)

With **Overpass** (Vancouver) taking over from the trailblazing **Jakajaro** (Too Darn Hot) up front with a quarter-mile remaining, the 14-1 chance began his charge down the stands' side and he found extra gears under a final-furlong drive to nail TDN Rising Star **Rayevka** (Blue Point) by a head on the line.

Overpass paid a heavy price for engaging with furious early fractions and finished 3/4-of-a-length further adrift in third.

Reflecting on the near miss of Rayevka, Francis Graffard commented, "She has an amazing turn of foot over that distance and, when she came, she really came strongly. I thought it was in the bag for us, but on the line I knew we were beaten. Dropping back in distance was key for me. In Dubai she showed that six furlongs was too long for her, so five furlongs on fast ground was a race for her. She was in top

form and proved it today on the track. You can't be frustrated, it was a fantastic run and hopefully we will be able to win a Group 1 this year."

Overpass, who is still entered in Saturday's G1 Queen Elizabeth II Jubilee Stakes, looked set fair to become Australia's ninth Royal Ascot win passing the furlong pole, but was overhauled nearing the post. "He went super and did us very proud," said trainer Bjorn Baker. "He's not quite a champion in terms of Australia, but he's our champion and delivered for us again. It is special to be here and I personally want to get back competing. When you're from Woodville in New Zealand like me and you're training in Sydney and living the dream, we always look at the positive and we beat 23 others.

He is a war horse to travel over, but we were always a little bit worried about the rise [to the line]." [Cont. p11](#)

Said Baker, "Maybe that was the difference between winning and losing. He didn't quite nail the gate like we thought he would today and I am pretty confident we often get that right back home. I've been beaten by two of the best trainers in the world and I want to beat them next time. We love an underdog in Australia and we'll have a try. Trust me, I haven't bought this [top] hat for nothing."

Mission Central, who becomes his sire's 11th Group 1 winner, is the first of two foals out of the unraced Thar She Blows (Zoffany), who is a full-sister to G1 Falmouth Stakes victrix and G1 1000 Guineas runner-up Prosperous Voyage.

After taking up the rare position of bystander for the Queen Anne, Aidan O'Brien was back in business two races into Royal Ascot 2026 as **Great Barrier Reef (No Nay Never)** conquered the G2 Coventry Stakes.

Partnered by Wayne Lordan with Ryan Moore on the sire's **Confucius**, the 6-1 shot who had taken the Marble Hill last month navigated his path from stall three far away from the stands' side to bring up a 12th renewal of the race that launched the trainer at the meeting in 1997.

“Confucius is the better worker at home, but this horse is obviously one of those who just minds himself,” the trainer said after greeting his 97th Royal winner and giving his usual Oscar acceptance speech thanking everybody else. “He will get seven and could get a mile as a three-year-old.”

This was a strong renewal full of highly-regarded types and on the face of it, Great Barrier Reef had it to do from stall three but his experience from the Curragh Group 3 last time stood him in good stead as he had been on the wing there too. Hitting the front inside the last 50 yards, he forged a half-length margin from the Hugo Palmer-trained Royal Ascot Two-Year-Old Trial winner **Adaay Of Scarlett** (Mehmas) to extend that sire’s winless run at the meeting. There was a neck back to Wathnan’s €800,000 Arqana May Breeze-Up purchase **Royal Heritage** (Blue Point), who had only debuted at Hamilton six days previously. Confucius was sixth as the 2-1 favourite.

“Wayne gave him a lovely ride,” O’Brien added. “He said he

was finishing off very well, while Ryan felt they went plenty hard on his side. From where he was drawn, Ryan got sucked into it and had to keep going. Wayne was in the other group on the far side and they were finishing well because the near-side group had gone so hard, perhaps.”

Lordan added of the TDN Rising Star, “I got a lovely lead and it was a good performance. He is very straightforward, he has pace and stays well. He was looking for company late on, but hit the line well so he feels like he can step up trip.”

Hugo Palmer said of the runner-up, “I have to apologise to everyone I had lunch with because I told them, ‘I’m sorry, Adaay Of Scarlett is a lovely horse, but I don’t think he’s good enough stepping up in class today’ but he has been. We have stepped him up in trip and it opens up so many options--the July Stakes, the Richmond Stakes, the Phoenix, and so on. There are plenty of options. It is brutal to get beaten, but it’s only a short margin and we’re obviously delighted he’s run so well.”

Royal Heritage’s rider James Doyle said, “I am very proud of him. He’s had a lot thrown at him in a short space of time and it was only last week that he was running at Hamilton. It was a great run.”

Back at Royal Ascot 12 months after finishing fourth to Ombudsman in the Prince of Wales's Stakes, Map Of Stars had it all fall into place and showed off his raw material to return to winning ways. Gelded in the winter, the Prix Exbury and Prix d'Harcourt winner and Prix Ganay and Grosser Dallmayr-Preis runner-up was reverting to his optimum trip after two substandard displays at a mile and a half, was sporting first-time cheekpieces and had the services of James McDonald for good measure.

Held up towards the rear throughout the early stages, he delivered an impressive surge to overwhelm Wimbledon Hawkeye a furlong out and provide Wathnan with their first winner of the 2026 meeting. "He travelled really relaxed and, when he's like that, he has an amazing turn of foot," trainer Francis Graffard said. "This horse has let us down a few times, but when he's on one of his good days he is a great horse."

"I said to Richard Brown, 'I have a lovely Listed race in the middle of France if you want to bring him back into the winner's enclosure' and he said, 'No chance, you're coming to Ascot.' I think he was right! I am happy for James as well. It's really nice to team up with a legendary jockey like him and he rode him perfectly. He is just a horse you need to let do what he wants," he added. "If you try to dictate to him, he can get upset and then he can't accelerate."

Brown said, "That was very exciting to watch. He gave him a great ride. I feel sorry for James [Doyle], but he couldn't leave Haatem because he's been a legend for us the last twice. This is massive--our first winner of the meeting. We can breathe now!"

James Owen said of Wimbledon Hawkeye, “For a minute there, I thought it was our first Royal Ascot winner. It was a fantastic run and it’s lovely to see him back into form. He has had a nice break, strengthened up a lot and come on for his debut run. We can do anything with him now. We’ll just see and reflect on today, whether he has one more run before he goes travelling.”

Map Of Stars is the second foal out of the Prix Vermeille heroine Bateel (Dubawi), whose four-year-old daughter Tajlina (**Kingman**) captured the Prix Penelope and was runner-up in last month’s Prix Allez France. A daughter of the Pretty Polly Stakes runner-up Attractive Crown (Chief’s Crown), she is related to the Prix Exbury winner Court Canibal (Montjeu). Bateel’s yearling colt is by Wootton Bassett, while she also has a colt foal by **Frankel**.

Sent forward off the home turn, the 25-1 chance tackled Defiantly (Kameko) approaching the quarter-mile marker and stayed on resolutely under a drive to deny that stablemate by a head after a ding-dong tussle.

“We didn’t get into the Fred Winter [Hurdle at Cheltenham], unfortunately, and this was obviously the next target for him,” explained Joseph O’Brien. “Kizlyar is off the back of a good win last time and I’m delighted to win such a good race with him. I am so delighted for Margaret [Heffernan] and her family. They lost Dr Andrew Heffernan, Margaret’s husband, a few months ago and I feel like Kizlyar had a little extra push in the final 100

yards. It looked like Defiantly maybe had outbattled him at one stage, but he battled back hard in the final furlong. He might be one to go abroad with, but we’ll see what the handicapper does and go from there.”

Heffernan, who set up the HOS Syndicate for her grandchildren, added, “Today is special because I lost my husband Andrew 12 weeks ago and this was his week. The idea of the syndicate with the grandchildren was really his. He believed in it and he believed in Joseph so much. I’ve been in horses all my life, but never had the luck like we’ve had since the syndicate started and it’s fantastic for the grandchildren. We had two winners last year at Ascot, but this year is obviously very special and we have more grandchildren than ever. I have two groups of grandchildren, older and younger and, for the older ones especially, it has been such a success. Some of them had never come racing before and it’s brought us all together. They’re at different stages of their lives, all parts of the world, and they’re all here today.”

Kizlyar is the latest of three foals and lone winner out of a half-sister to G3 Loughbrown Stakes victrix Kastasa (Rock of Gibraltar) and Listed Cairn Rouge Stakes third Kassaba (Charm Spirit). **Cont. p15**

DAIQUIRI BAY (GB) (g, 4, New Bay {GB}--Strawberry Martini {GB} {SW-Itly & SP-Ger}, by Mount Nelson {GB}) was a length too good for Gamrai (Lope De Vega) in a May 2 Newmarket handicap over 12 furlongs last time and defeated the same rival once again in this Copper Horse Stakes. Shuffled back to race in rear after the early exchanges, the 6-1 chance made headway into sixth turning for home and stayed on relentlessly under a drive inside the final quarter-mile to deny his old foe by a head in a bobbing finish.

"I've got my jump jockey on the phone and I think he wants to know if this horse is going hurdling," joked trainer Alan King. "We had a bad draw [in 12] today and were much further back than we wanted to be. I was slightly worried the ground was as quick as we'd want it, but we got away with it. The horse has really improved and he will go jumping. If you think you've got a good Flat horse, I don't like going jumping with them as three-year-olds and I give them another year on the Flat. I think he could be quite exciting, but that's for another day. He's not slow

and he could easily drop back to a mile-and-a-half. My old boss David Nicholson brought me here 30 years ago and I think I've only missed one, when it was at York. This is a special place and I adore it."

Daiquiri Bay is the fifth of six foals and lone scorer thrown by Listed Premio Giovanni Falck winner Strawberry Martini (Mount Nelson), herself a half-sister to stakes-winning G2 Superlative Stakes third Tony Curtis (Rock Of Gibraltar) and to the dam of G3 Hobart Cup winner Strawberry Rock (Rock Of Gibraltar).

His second dam Strawberry Lolly (Lomitas) is a multiple-winning half-sister to the dual Group-winning dual G1 Sun Chariot placegetter Strawberrydaiquiri (Dansili). WHEN YOU'RE BREEDING HORSES, THIS IS WHERE YOU WANT TO BE': ROYAL ASCOT DELIGHT FOR O'LEARY AND HAYES

They walked around the paddock one behind the other, like a little brother following his big brother around. The swaggering Gstaad led the more demure Bow Echo, looking as though at least a year separated them in age.

But when the time came to tussle there was no brotherly love lost as the pair fought with each stride to the line, delivering the battle royal we had hoped to see but perhaps had not dared to dream would happen. Whichever way the photo went, a Guineas winner would be crowned in the St James's Palace Stakes and, after his less-than-perfect passage though the first furlong then having been all but clawed back by the rallying Gstaad on the rail, it was Bow Echo who would remain

unbeaten. Just.

When he came back in after winning the 2,000 Guineas at Newmarket the hero's welcome had felt extra raucous for the local boys done good - George Boughey and Billy Loughnane winning a Classic almost in their back yard. The roar this time was no less euphoric for a horse, his trainer and a young jockey who are on their way to becoming box office.

"A true superstar," was Loughnane's emphatic description of Bow Echo after the gongs had been handed out, and certainly he has lit up the season to date, twice beating Gstaad, who would clearly be a standout colt in any other year.

When it comes to standouts, Gstaad's trainer Aidan O'Brien had up to that point continued his merry romp up the charts of the Royal Ascot all-time greats by collecting the Coventry Stakes and - perhaps to his surprise as much as anyone else's - showing the Aussies how it's done in the day's top sprint, the King Charles III Stakes. King Charles was there himself to welcome John Magnier to the rostrum, actual royalty greeting bloodstock royalty with a warm grin and a chat before the trophy was handed over to swell the bewildering collection of silverware at Coolmore.

Darley's Night Of Thunder may have claimed two of the Group 1 contests of the day when Ten Bob Tony streaked to a 50-1 upset in the Queen Anne Stakes before Bow Echo's triumph, but Coolmore was at the double too, with a pair of Group wins for **No Nay Never**, himself a Royal Ascot winner in the Norfolk Stakes of 2013 and represented on the opening day by his sons Great Barrier Reef and Mission Central.

"Now, I won't do the race planning for them," said breeder Eddie O'Leary as he launched into a helpful suggestion for Aidan O'Brien as to where he should be campaigning Mission Central. "But he's a lovely little horse to go to The Everest." [Cont. p17](#)

With Ka Ying Rising set to return to Sydney for the A\$20 million contest, it may sound more like Mission Impossible but Tom Magnier, who runs Coolmore's Australian division, did not dismiss the idea of the three-year-old gelding taking up Coolmore's slot in the race come October.

"He's definitely a horse we'd have a look at. It would be great fun to get Aidan and the team down there," Magnier told Australia's Channel 7.

That will have been music to the ears of O'Leary, who runs Gigginstown House Stud for his brother Michael alongside his own Lynn Lodge Stud operation. With Mags O'Toole he had shelled out a decent sum - 400,000gns to be precise - for Mission Central's dam Thar She Blows (Zoffany) in 2022. If that seems a lot to pay for an unraced filly, she was by that stage a full-sister Prosperous Voyage, who handily won the G1 Falmouth Stakes in the months prior to the Tattersalls December Mares Sale. There's also the matter of the influential mare Monroe back there as Thar She Blows' third dam, and anyway, it wasn't long before she started repaying the O'Learys in the sales ring when Mission Central, her first foal, sold for 625,000gns at Book 1.

"When you're breeding horses, this is where you want to be," said Eddie O'Leary from the paddock at Ascot.

"He's a beautiful horse. I'm glad the boys got him and I'm glad he's turned out to be a good horse. He was a fantastic yearling and he made plenty of money. I'm glad he's a racehorse because he's the mare's first foal, so it's great."

Declaring that Thar She Blows will now be "married to **No Nay Never** for a while", he added, "She has a **Kingman** yearling colt who is going to Book 1 and her foal is a full-sister to [Mission Central]."

'We'll Drink Plenty of Champagne!'

O'Leary was not the only Irish member of the Irish bloodstock fraternity celebrating a Group 1 victory on Tuesday. Ten Bob Tony may have raised a few eyebrows after striking in the Queen Anne just ten days after his muddy triumph in the G3 Tattenham Corner Stakes at Epsom, but for followers of the descendants of the great Kilrush matriarch Mill Princess it would perhaps have been less of a surprise. Blood will out, after all.

Nobody is more familiar with that family than Brendan Hayes, the former manager of Kilrush who bred Ten Bob Tony under his Knocktoran Stud banner. Knocktoran has subsequently changed hands but Hayes and his wife Anne-Marie are still very much in the game through their Cotton House Stud.

"That's the third Group 1 winner that we have had out of that family," Hayes told TDN's Brian Sheerin on Tuesday. "Last Tycoon was a long time ago - he won the King's Stand back in 1986 and then Immortal Verse won the Coronation Stakes in 2011. Now this fella has won the Queen Anne. It's brilliant - we'll drink plenty of champagne! It's thrilling."

He added, "We get huge satisfaction out of this. More than ever, to be honest. Okay, he was 50-1 but his form is very good and Ed Walker told me from a very early stage that this was a very smart horse. He always seemed to be ground dependent - he needed it soft - but he really smashed that theory to pieces today."

Recalling his introduction to the family, Hayes continued, "We bought Mill Princess, a daughter of Mill Reef, from Moyglare Stud back in 1977. She won for us in France and we bred from her. She was a very good broodmare and Coolmore got the better daughters out of her down through the years."

He added, "Beauty Is Truth, who is the dam of Hydrangea, is out of Zelding, who is a granddaughter of Mill Princess and then they got Immortal Verse as well, who is out of the Sadler's Wells mare Side Of Paradise. So it has been a fantastic family and we have seen how well it has done for Coolmore. I have got the sweepings of the lodge and fortunately we have managed to turn it into something worthwhile."

Ten Bob Tony's dam Hug (Dark Angel) is a granddaughter of Mill Princess and she is not in foal this year after being covered by **St Mark's Basilica**.

"She did have seven pregnancies in a row, which was very good," said Hayes, who described the young Ten Bob Tony as "big and square and he'd a lovely mind". With a foal by **Little Big Bear** foal and a Bayside Boy yearling, there is still plenty to look forward to when it comes to Hug's offspring, however.

"The Bayside Boy is quite smart. Ed Sackville bought that and he also has her Space Blues two-year-old. We kept the mare after we saw Ten Bob Tony. Hug is relatively young and we also have her daughter, So Close, who is by Oasis Dream. She showed a bit of form in France and she has a colt foal by Space Blues, so we repeated that mating. She's in foal to Maranoa Charlie. We went for him because he is by Wootton Bassett and, of course, Wootton Bassett has done very well with a branch of this family given **Henri Matisse** is out of Immortal Verse."

He added, "We have a lot of the family and have three daughters out of Hug's mother, Tender Is Thenight (Barathea), one being Besotted (Dutch Art), who has got off to a very good start. She has a foal by **Frankel** this year and is happily in foal to **Camille Pissarro**. Then we also have a mare called Lights Out (Make Believe), who is a lesser mare, but is in foal to Kodi Bear. We have about a dozen mares all told but you do need numbers at this game."

JURYOKU PIERROT TO SKIP THE ARC AND TARGET SHUKA SHO

Juryoku Pierrot, who **carried Seina Imamura to victory in the Japanese Oaks in May**, will not take up her entry in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe this autumn, according to trainer Ryo Terashima.

The daughter of Happy Value (Zenno Rob Roy) will instead target the third leg of the Japanese Fillies' Triple Tiara, the G1 Shuka Sho at Kyoto on October 18 prior to a run in the November 15 G1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup. Imamura is expected to retain the ride. **Cont. p22**

Terashima told *Net Keiba*, “We’ve decided to stay domestic this year. Her win in the Listed Wasurenagusa Sho was so impressive that we pushed from our side just to get her entered, but even watching her in the paddock, she’s not an easy horse. Her ability is extremely high, but for this year, we felt it was better to proceed in order, first against her own generation in a Group 1 and then against older horses in a Group 1.”

He added, “At the moment, we’re planning to go straight to the Shuka Sho and then on to the Queen Elizabeth II Cup without using a prep race. If she still has something left, the owner and I have also discussed possibly targeting the year-end Arima Kinen. From a pedigree standpoint, there is a desire to challenge a race like the Arc. We’d like to produce the kind of results in Japan that make people say, ‘Maybe we should have gone after all,’ and then perhaps consider that kind of opportunity again next spring.”
