

OH BABY! VINO ROSSO'S BABY VINO PROVIDES CONNECTIONS A SLEW OF FIRSTS WITH HASKELL WIN

OCEANPORT, NJ -- Less than a week ago, jockey Jorge Vargas, Jr. wasn't even slated to ride in the \$1-million NYRA Bets Haskell at Monmouth Park. Trainer Lindsay Schultz had never won, or even run, in a Grade I race. And relative newcomers to the game Cosmo Stables' Marcus and his father James 'Smoky' Osborn and Delta Squad Racing's Josh Isner had never banked a big one either.

Shortly after 6 p.m. on Saturday afternoon, **Baby Vino** (Vino Rosso) in one fell swoop realized all of his connections' dreams when earning a narrow victory over GI Preakness Stakes hero **Napoleon Solo** (**Liam's Map**) in a nail-biting renewal of Monmouth's marquee race for sophomores. The Haskell is a 'Win and You're In' qualifier for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Keeneland Oct. 31.

Overlooked at 28-1 despite having won his last two races, including a runaway victory in Monmouth's NYRA Bets Pegasus Stakes, Baby Vino, named by Marcus Osborn's wife Chrystal, broke smoothly from post three and was eased off the pace as Napoleon Solo, exiting the six hole at 7-2 odds, was sent to the front by Paco Lopez. **Cont. p3**

JOURNALISM OVERCOMES ABYSMAL START, WINS SAN DIEGO *by Jill Williams*

After facing just about every top horse in the country in his career, **Journalism** (**Curlin**) looked to be assigned his simplest task since he was a maiden in Saturday's GII San Diego Handicap at Del Mar. However, anyone who was thrilled by how he inexplicably overcame trouble in his GI Preakness Stakes win last year will remember he has a flair for the dramatic.

In what should have been a relatively straightforward win, Journalism had to do it by overcoming a terrible start. He appeared to anticipate the break and charge the gate, causing the assistant starter to hold tight just as the latch sprung. Journalism was instantly disadvantaged, leaving the stalls a good five or six lengths behind the others. The heavy favorite trailed the five-horse field by several lengths as GISP **Mirahmadi** (Into Mischief), who was making his first start since a runner-up finish in this race last year, set the early :23.34 and :47.47 pace.

The Goat (Chi) (**Midshipman**), a multiple Group 1 winner in his native Chile, bobbed his head in front going into the turn as Umberto Rispoli--aboard for the first time since a second in last year's GI Pacific Classic--floated Journalism out wide after edging closer, then circled the field with ease to take the lead with a furlong to go. From there, it was simply a procession as Journalism flicked his ears back and forth, holding off a hard-trying **Shea Brennan** (Tough Sunday) for the three-quarter length win as **Iron Man Cal** (Collected) nabbed third, another 2 1/4 lengths back, in his first dirt try. Journalism got the 1 1/16 miles in 1.42.65.

After the San Diego, Rispoli offered an explanation, "He was leaning forward, then he took a step back just as they popped the gate. He was away a little slow; I think he might have spotted those other horse maybe five or six lengths. But by the time we got to the first turn, I was comfortable. He had picked it up and I knew I had the horse under me. This horse has the class. You've always got to be careful in a race; anything can happen. But he was the best horse by far today. When it came time, he was there." **Cont. p6**

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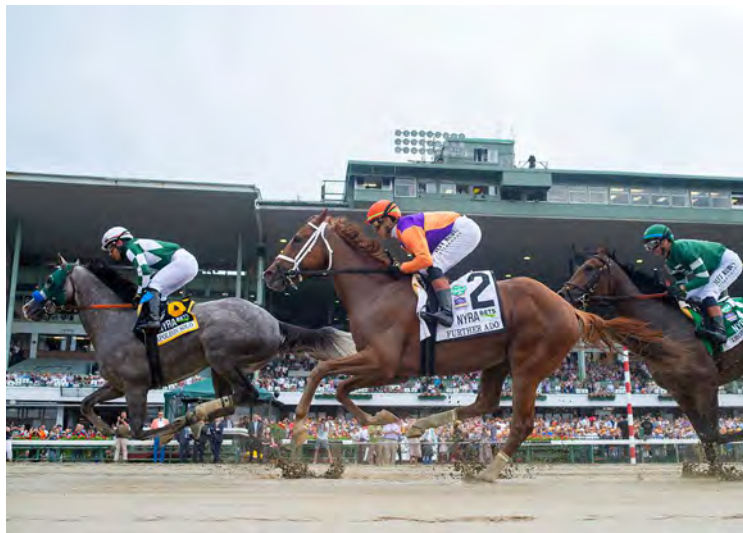

Meanwhile, 11-10 favorite **Further Ado** (**Gun Runner**) and the rail-running longshot **Star Sweeper** (Rock Your World) took up chase right behind the leader. Throwing down a :24.15 quarter, Napoleon Solo continued to show the way as Baby Vino lingered in an unhurried fifth, about five lengths behind the leader.

Asked for more by Vargas while skimming the paint, Baby Vino found daylight inside as both Star Sweeper and 'TDN Rising Star, presented by Hagyard' Further Ado appeared to struggle to keep up while Napoleon Solo remained in front a couple of paths off the rail.

Reaching even terms with the Classic winner at the quarter pole, Baby Vino took a slight lead and while Napoleon Solo fought back bravely to his outside, Baby Vino had the most left in the tank and he proved a half-length best at the wire. Napoleon Solo was 3 1/4 lengths clear of **Iron Honor** (**Nyquist**) with **The Puma** (**Essential Quality**), making his first start since the Mar. 28 GI **Curlin** Florida Derby, was fourth. Further Ado, Parx invader Star Sweeper and the maiden **Ocelli** (Connect) followed them home.

An inquiry to review the stretch run was launched by the Monmouth stewards, however, there was insufficient evidence for a disqualification.

"This horse can make a run from anywhere," said Schultz. "We thought the way it set up there would be a lot of speed and he'd sit behind it. But there wasn't as much speed as we thought and Jorge made that call early in the race."

Garnering her first Haskell victory in her first try, Schultz also became the first female trainer in history to win the New Jersey fixture. The victory also represented Schultz's first win at the Grade I level.

"Hopefully, there will be more to come," she said. "It's huge for our stable. It's a really big deal. It's so great for this horse. From the moment he started working, we just loved this horse, and to really show what he has is what we do it for." **Cont. p4**

Vargas earned the mount this past Monday after Tyler Gaffalione took off to ride Kentucky Derby third Ocelli instead.

The direct beneficiary of the ill-advised decision proved to be 31-year-old Vargas, who was also winning his first Grade I race.

"That never bothers me," he said of Gaffalione's last-minute decision to take off of Baby Vino. "I understand the business. I've been around long enough. Trainers want those big-name riders in races like this. I get that. Lindsay has owners who want name jockeys. I understand that. I work horses for Lindsay all of the time. We were lucky enough to win two races last weekend. When Tyler made his decision, I was lucky enough to get the mount."

The hard-working Vargas who rode in Monmouth's last two races on the card, later offered a breakdown of his Haskell win.

"I didn't like where I was behind Star Sweeper," he admitted. "I didn't think he had too much of a shot and I was worried about when he was going to stop. Flavien Prat [aboard Iron Honor] was keeping me in and I'm thinking 'he's riding me.' He opened up the rail a little bit and I just let my horse ride through it. He got to the lead and when he got to the lead I was feeling good because he was fighting."

Regarding the bumpy stretch duel and the subsequent inquiry, Vargas added, "It's race riding. Paco obviously was doing his job. If I was in his position I would have done the same thing."

The victory represented the largest Haskell win payout (\$58) since Skip Trial paid \$73 in 1985.

While Schultz did not confirm what was next for the colt, she did say that everything remained in play.

"Both [the Travers Stakes at Saratoga and the Breeders' Cup Classic] are far away but we're thrilled for the opportunity," she said. "He's a nice horse, but this was his biggest effort today. It's a really big deal to do it in the mud, a surface he's never been on. We're over the moon."

Following the race, Napoleon Solo's trainer Chad Summers commented on his colt's narrow defeat.

"My initial reaction is disappointment. You want to win races like this," Summers said. "Obviously, going into this race we had a lot of respect for Lindsay and Baby Vino and the work she has done with him. Paco Lopez has been telling me about this horse for a long time now, about how good the horse is."

He continued, "The race unfolded the way we thought it might. I thought Irad [Ortiz Jr. on Further Ado] floated us wide in the first turn, just kind of race riding a little bit. [Napoleon Solo] ends up running second by a half-length after a ding-dong stretch battle where he was bumped two or three times in the stretch and it was enough that the stewards wanted to look at it. He beat a really nice group of horses behind him. To me, this was one of the deepest groups in the Haskell that I can remember from top to bottom. You're beating some accomplished horses. And we were a clear second, so I'm proud of him. I don't think he necessarily loved this track but I don't want to make excuses because we all had to run over it."

From Humble Beginnings

The top-level win was also a first for both co-owners, who are relatively new to the sport. Isner bought a share in the colt after his impressive victory in the Pegasus. The Osburns' Cosmo Stable was started in 2024 with a handful of horses and Baby Vino is their first stakes winner. The 78-year-old James 'Smoky' Osborn had horses in partnerships in the 1980s at Oaklawn Park but they were all claiming horses. His son Marcus decided to get back into the game a couple of years ago for the family to be able to enjoy together.

Bred by Lisa Parks in Kentucky, Baby Vino was purchased privately by the Osborns as a yearling along with his dam. He also has a year-younger half-brother Maximum Velocity (Classic Empire), who is also slated to join Schultz. **Cont. p5**

Baby Vino debuted at Oaklawn Park last December, finishing second in a six-furlong test before failing to fire when a well-beaten ninth over that track and trip in February. Stretched to two turns at that venue on Mar. 1, he was an improved third before finishing runner-up next time when stretching to nine furlongs. Fifth time proved a charm when he closed from just off the pace to score by 2 3/4 lengths in Hot Springs on May 1. Sent off at 29-10 for a Haskell prep in the NYRA Bets Pegasus, the Kentucky-bred himself seemed to sprout wings as he flew home a 10 3/4-length winner.

And while some of the bettors at Monmouth on Saturday may have been surprised the colt won, his trainer certainly was not.

"From what he has shown us in the mornings, if he was able to get to this step we were going to take it," she said. "I thought we were competitive in this field. You never know until you're there, but I thought he belonged. After his last race [in the Pegasus], we thought this was the right place to try. When this horse broke his maiden you think about what he could do down the line so [a race like the Haskell] was definitely on our minds at that point."

How does it feel to win the Haskell while facing horses of quality?

"It means so much more," Schultz said. "You can't say he beat an average crowd. These are real solid horses."

Pedigree Notes:

Spendthrift Farm's Vino Rosso secured his second top-level winner with Baby Vino's Haskell victory, joining his daughter Bottle of Rouge and her GI Del Mar Debutante Stakes win last summer. The son of **Curlin**, named 2019 Eclipse champion older male the same year he captured the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, sports three graded winners and 12 black-type winners as he sends his fourth crop to race this season.

Baby Vino is also one of three stakes winners as a broodmare sire for GI King's Bishop Stakes winner Discreetly Mine, a Mineshaft stallion who originally stood at Lane's End before moving to Uruguay in 2016.

Trainer Michael McCarthy added, "His class won out."

Until Saturday, exactly one year separated Journalism from his last trip to the winner's circle, which came in the 2025 GI Haskell Stakes at Monmouth Park. Fittingly, as the sport enjoyed the 2026 Haskell on Saturday, Journalism issued notice that he remains one of the generation's best horses in training. His trio of Grade I scores includes the 2025 Santa Anita Derby and while he hasn't won in a year, he has dodged no one, winning or placing in every lifetime start save his fourth in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Classic behind Forever Young (Jpn) (Real Steel {Jpn}). In fact, with the exception of highly regarded MGSW and 'TDN Rising Star, presented by Hagyard' Knightsbridge (Nyquist), only Eclipse champions and/or Breeders' Cup winners have finished in front of Journalism since he broke his maiden.

Journalism kicked off his 2026 campaign with a pair of thirds on the road, including when last seen in the GI Metropolitan Mile June 6 at Saratoga. Save his Preakness win, Journalism has registered triple-digit Beyer Speed Figures in every start going back to his 108 in the GII San Felipe Stakes 16 months ago, including his seconds in both the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Belmont Stakes. That's an ostentatious show of sustained excellence.

In spring of 2025, Coolmore America announced that Journalism will stand at Ashford Stud upon his retirement. It was at that time Coolmore partners Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith joined Bridlewood Farm, Don Alberto Stable, Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners, Elayne Stables 5 LLC, and Robert LaPenta as part of Journalism's ownership group.



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Pedigree Notes:

One of 70 graded winners for his influential sire, Journalism is also one of 119 black-type winners for **Curlin**. The Hill 'n' Dale at Xalapa stallion, who sat out the second half of this year's breeding season as he recovered from an ulcer, is also the sire of the most accomplished 3-year-old of 2026 in GI Kentucky Derby and GI Belmont Stakes winner Golden Tempo.

Journalism's late dam, 2018 GII La Canada Stakes winner and four-time Grade I-placed Mopotism, was a \$1.05-million Fasig-Tipton buy by Don Alberto Corporation in 2019 at the 'Night of the Stars' sale. Don Alberto bred Journalism, then sold him to Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners for \$825,000 at the 2023 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale before ultimately staying in for a piece of his ownership.

Mopotism, a daughter of the late Uncle Mo, has also produced the unraced 2-year-old filly Magic Queen (Into Mischief), a \$3.9-million RNA at Saratoga last year, and a yearling filly by **Flightline**. Mopotism passed away from complications of colic last July.

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NYSOS TO SKIP WHITNEY, WILL RUN IN PACIFIC CLASSIC

SARATOGA SPRINGS, NY -- Last week, Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert said he was going to run the imposing 'TDN Rising Star' presented by Hagyard **Nysos** (**Nyquist**) in the \$1-million GI Whitney Stakes at Saratoga Race Course on Aug. 8 unless he changed his mind.

He changed his mind.

Speaking by phone from Kentucky, Baffert said the 5-year-old would instead be pointed to the 1 1/4-mile \$1-million GI Pacific Classic at Del Mar on Aug. 22.

"He's actually on a plane today to Del Mar," Baffert said. "I want to run him once before the Breeders' Cup. If I ran him in the Whitney, I would have to run him twice. I want to get him to the Breeders' Cup the best way that I can."

Nysos has won eight of 10 career starts and finished second in his other two races. In his last start, he won the GI Metropolitan Handicap at Saratoga on June 6. Before that, he was second in the G1 Saudi Cup.

Owned by Baoma Corp., Mrs. John Magnier, Michael B. Tabor and Derrick Smith, Nysos is undefeated in three starts at Del Mar. He won the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile last year as well as the GII San Diego Handicap. In 2023, Nysos was a winner of the GIII Bob Hope Stakes.

Since May, Nysos has been training at Churchill Downs where Baffert has had a strong presence this year. He did say he was going to be at Del Mar, his longtime summer base, next week.

"The Whitney was very enticing," said Baffert, who won the Whitney in 2019 with **McKinzie** (**Street Sense**) and 2020 with Improbable (City Zip), both former 'TDN Rising Stars'. "It's a mile and an eighth. It's just that he likes Del Mar...but he runs well wherever he goes."

The Whitney is still expected to draw a solid field that includes **Magnitude** (**Not This Time**), who won the GI Stephen Foster Stakes, the G1 Dubai World Cup and GIII Razorback Handicap; 2025 Horse of the Year **Sovereignty** (Into Mischief); **Baeza** (**McKinzie**), who was second in the Stephen Foster; **White Abarrio** (Race Day), who defeated Sovereignty in the GII Oaklawn Handicap; and **Nitrogen** (Medaglia d'Oro), last year's Eclipse Award-winning 3-year-old filly.

Baffert said he is still targeting 'TDN Rising Star' presented by Hagyard **Explora** (**Blame**) for the \$500,000, seven-furlong GI Test Stakes for 3-year-old fillies at Saratoga. That race is also on Aug. 8.

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KATHYNMARISSA LEADS BROWN SWEEP IN DUNKIN' DIANA

Michael Dubb and Michael J. Caruso's **Kathynmarissa** (**American Pharoah**) came with an irresistible run in the final furlong to peg back stablemate **Segesta** (Ghostzapper) in Saturday's GI Dunkin' Diana Stakes at a soggy Saratoga, giving trainer Chad Brown a record-extending 11th victory in the nine-furlong contest, his ninth in the last 10 runnings and his fifth in succession. For good measure, **Portfolio Duration** (**GB**) (Night of Thunder {Ire}), who defeated Kathrynmarissa into third when wiring the GI New York Stakes here on June 5, rounded out the trifecta.

"To have a one, two, three in this race, a race we have a lot of success in, in my area, I give a lot of credit to my team," said Brown. "Four fillies in this race, three of them ran really well and it takes a lot of different tasks daily, executed perfectly to bring the horses into the Diana every year this way--and they do it."

Juddmonte homebred dual Grade I winner Segesta had the most early speed for Dylan Davis and made the running in advance of **Ozara (Ire)** (Lope de Vega {Ire}), as Kathrynmarissa, the 9-4 post-time favorite, settled near the tail of the field and outside of the fourth Brown distaffer, **Dynamic Pricing (Ire)** (Night of Thunder {Ire}).

Segesta enjoyed a very soft time of things from the front over a turf course rendered yielding by earlier rains and she got the opening half in :50.42 and three-quarters of a mile in 1:15.75. Still going powerfully turning for home, Segesta had a kick and looked for a stride or two to have stolen it, but Kathrynmarissa followed the move of Portfolio Duration into the stretch, was pulled off that one's heels and stormed down the center of the course to take it by a measured half-length.

"When we hit the first turn, I noticed the pace backed up a lot," Ortiz explained. "**Five G** (Vekoma) wasn't [near the pace], so I knew it was going to be a problem, but I was already committed to my position behind Manny [Franco, aboard Portfolio Duration]."

"So, I stuck with it and just hoped for the best. She gave me a great turn of foot. Segesta got very good fractions early on and she was able to run on for second, but Kathrynmarissa was very good today."

Kathynmarissa raced solely for Dubb and was trained through the first 10 starts of her career by Richard Dutrow, Jr., winning the 2024 Dueling Grounds Oaks while finishing runner-up in the GI American Oaks and in the GII Saratoga Oaks that season.

Caruso was on board when the bay ran out an easy allowance winner in a single Saratoga appearance last August and she returned to defeat then-stablemate and GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf heroine Gezora (Fr) (Almanzor {Fr}) in the GIII Modesty Stakes at Churchill on May 1 ahead of her try in the New York.

Pedigree Notes:

Kathynmarissa is the 10th worldwide Grade I/Group 1 winner for **American Pharoah** and is the second out of a daughter of the Dynaformer stallion Milt's Overture. The other is Kathrynmarissa's G1 Las Oaks-winning half-sister La Poetisa, who is by **American Pharoah's** paternal grandsire Empire Maker. The latter is the dam of Lorenzo (Chi) (Mendelssohn), a three-time Group 2 winner for Haras Don Alberto.

La Dalila is also responsible for a juvenile colt from the first crop of **Mandaloun** and a brother to Kathrynmarissa foaled Feb. 5.

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OH SO SPLENDID: SPLENDORA BLOWS THEM AWAY IN THE MOLLY PITCHER

OCEANPORT, NJ--When the heavens opened up early in Saturday's card at Monmouth Park, the connections must have been wondering whether their filly--**Splendora** ([Audible](#))--would be able to handle an off going in the GII Molly Pitcher Stakes.

The issue became rather moot as the Boyd and Talla Racing-owned mare scampered off to an eye-catching 5 1/2-length winner over **Lost Horizon** (Into Mischief).

Installed the 2-5 choice while trying to pick up her fourth victory of the season, she was entering the Molly Pitcher off a last-out victory in Churchill's GII Shawnee River Stakes on May 30. Rushed up to the front by the red-hot Flavien Prat, last year's GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint winner was comfortably in front through a opening quarter mile in :23.88. **Dry Powder** ([Gun Runner](#)), who made a move to be a head back in second

following three quarters in 1:11.83. That challenge was short lived, however, as Dry Powder retreated and Lost Horizon began to close from the back.

In the end it was too little too late as the favorite remained clear, defeating Lost Horizon while under a hand ride. **Nerazzuri** (Protonico) rounded out the trifecta.

"She does not like mud. I'm in Kentucky and I almost didn't run her because of the mud," admitted Bob Baffert. "I was waiting for that break. The track was so beautiful earlier and I was hoping it wouldn't rain, and then the rain came. It wasn't really muddy. But she does not like to get her feet wet. She's funny about that."

Splendora's rider was also concerned about the mare's ability to handle an off track, however, he knew she had the class to overcome it.

"You never know [about an off-track]," said Prat. "She has never seen it sloppy before. But she handled it well. With the surface I felt I wanted to get her running to the first turn and make the lead and get her into a good rhythm. That was the game plan and that's what happened."

Splendora kicked off a five-race winning skein last summer in a six-furlong Del Mar optional claimer in July before adding wins in that oval's restricted Tranquility Lake Stakes at a mile last September. Sent off at almost 3-1 under Prat on Breeders' Cup Day, the dark bay ran off to a 4 3/4-length victory over Vahva (**Gun Runner**).

Picking up where she left off at four, the newly-turned 5-year-old took the seven-panel GII D. Wayne Lukas at Santa Anita on Feb. 7 before adding a 5 3/4-length score in the GI Beholder Mile. A well-beaten fourth despite being backed down to even-money in the seven-furlong GI Derby City Distaff she rebounded to score when stretching out for the 8 1/2-furlong Shawnee River last time out.

"She's been doing great and she's just getting better and better," added Baffert. "I'm so excited for the owners. We're having a lot of fun with her. I love having mares like this, they're so much fun."

Is a return to the Breeders' Cup in the cards for the two-time Grade I winner?

"We're just going play it by ear," said Baffert. "She'll come back to Churchill Downs and we'll wait and see. It could be a race at Saratoga, or maybe Keeneland. I haven't decided yet."

Pedigree Notes:

Holding the distinction of being the only Grade I winner for her sire, Splendora was purchased in utero for \$45,000 at the 2021 Keeneland September Sale. The buyer, The Elkstone, sold Miss Freeze's resulting filly a yearling for \$125,000 at Fasig-Tipton July Sale.

The Frost Giant mare produced a filly by **Tiz the Law** last season and followed up with colt by National Treasure this term.

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KLARAVICH, BROWN GO BACK-TO-BACK IN UNITED NATIONS *by Alan Carasso*

Twelve months after Klaravich Stables' Redistricting (GB) (**Kingman** {GB}) helped trainer Chad Brown to tie the legendary MacKenzie Miller on six winners of the GII United Nations Stakes, the same ownership's **Program Trading** (GB) (Lope de Vega {Ire}) came very wide into the Monmouth stretch and rolled home to give the New York-based conditioner the record outright in deteriorating conditions at the Jersey Shore.

Sent off the 9-10 chalk to build on his latest victory in the nine-furlong Monmouth Stakes on June 13, the ridgling was dropped out to the tail of the field by the in-form Flavien Prat and switched off nicely, as second choice **Just A Touch** (**Justify**) made up for a sluggish beginning to ultimately set the pace in advance of **Uncle's Gold** (Uncle Mo) and--given the stormy atmospheric conditions--the aptly named **Thundering** (**Mosler**).

Just A Touch and Uncle's Gold opened up a yawning gap on the rest of the field entering the final four furlongs and it was a short time later that Prat slipped Program Trading some rein to be within striking distance a quarter mile from home. Spun as many as eight paths wide into the lane, Program Trading went to the staying-on Uncle's Gold with a furlong to travel and proved too strong in the finish. Thundering held for third, while Just A Touch was more or less eased in the testing ground, officially labeled as good, but playing much, much softer than that in actual fact.

"The pace was right and he relaxed well for me," said Prat, who has ridden four of Brown's seven UN winners. "Everything went well, the soft ground, a good pace, and he relaxed well for me. It's good to see him back at this top level. I think this race will give him a ton of confidence and that's what he needed."

Winner of the GI Saratoga Derby and GI Hollywood Derby at three in 2023 and the GI Turf Classic at four, Program Trading was snapping a seven-race losing streak when carrying Prat to a two-length success in the Monmouth Stakes. The stretch of winless outs did include a fast-closing second to Rhetorical (**Not This Time**) in last year's GI Keeneland Turf Mile and a third to Lagynos (**Kantharos**) in the GII Mervin Muniz Memorial Stakes this past March. He was 10th in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Mile.

Pedigree Notes:

On behalf of Seth Klarman's operation, bloodstock agent Mike Ryan spent 250,000gns (\$356,551) for Program Trading at the 2021 Tattersalls October Sale, the same auction at which Klaravich paid 200,000gns (\$278,019) for the same stallion's future dual Grade I winner Newspaperofrecord (Ire) back in 2017.

Program Trading is one of three winners from five to race out of a half-sister to G2 Park Hill Stakes victress and G1 QIPCO British Champions Fillies & Mares Stakes third Silk Sari (GB) (Dalakhani {Ire}), whose son Early Adopter (GB) (Lope de Vega {Ire}) was trained by Brown (for Madaket Stables) to a third-place finish in the 2024 GIII Pilgrim Stakes.

Program Trading's third dam Gossamer, a full-sister to the outstanding Barathea (Ire), produced G1SW Ibn Khaldun (Dubai Destination) and the dams of Godolphin's 2025 G2 Superlative Stakes hero Saba Desert (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint winner Mischief Magic (Ire) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}).

Dreamlike's youngest offspring include the 3-year-old colt Burning Impact (GB) (Too Darn Hot {GB}), fourth for Ralph Beckett on his June 18 debut going a mile over the Southwell all-weather, and a British-bred yearling colt by **Justify**.

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SOMERSET WEST CAUSES SAN CLEMENTE SHOCKER *by Alan Carasso*

Easily the longest shot on the board at 35-1 in a field of 10 for Saturday's GII San Clemente Handicap at Del Mar, Keith Abraham's **Somerset West** (**Kantharos**) got through inside with a furlong to race and kicked home strongly to register the surprise.

Drawn one from the outside, the homebred filly--stretching out to a distance of ground for the first time--was void of speed and that allowed Armando Ayuso to steer her straight down onto the fence as fellow outsiders **Light Won Up** (**City of Light**) and **Cortina d'Amprezzo** (**Ire**) (Lucky Vega {Ire}) matched motors up front through fractions that were modest at best.

Saving every inch of ground down the backstretch and around the second turn, Somerset West traveled on the bridle into the lane, bid hard up against the rail where the chute meets the course proper and went on to score.

Inbox (**GB**) (Ectot {GB}) was up for second, but had to survive an inquiry after she drifted in sharply late in the piece, causing some interference to **Wild Like The West** (Into Mischief).

After looking at the various angles, the stewards allowed the results to stand. Midwest shipper and recent Churchill allowance winner **Raiding Party** (**Ire**) (**Sioux Nation**) ran on for third as the 8-5 chalk.

"The family is kind of one-run so when I saw her sneaking up the rail I thought, this is good" said winning trainer John Sadler. "The family has a little distance limitations, so we liked the mile distance. She's run three or four good races. A little unlucky a couple of times. Really a great ride. You got to give him (jockey Armando Ayuso) credit. He saved all the ground and came up the rail."

Somerset West made up a stack of ground to finish a debut fourth over six furlongs at Santa Anita Mar. 7, then completed the exacta in consecutive contests on the 6 1/2-furlong flat course Apr. 4 and 24. The chestnut was last seen graduating by 2 1/4 lengths in Arcadia June 6, but was friendless in the market stepping up in trip and class Saturday afternoon.

Pedigree Notes:

Somerset West is the 48th worldwide stakes winner and 13th graded winner for her Hill 'n' Dale-based sire and she is the 10th black-type winner and second graded winner out of a mare by **Munnings**. The winner is bred on a cross similar to that of the money-spinning 5-year-old Lagynos, who is out of a mare by **Munnings**'s sire Speightstown.

Somerset West's dam, also conditioned by Sadler, was an accomplished runner at turf sprint trips, winning the Mizdirection Stakes and finishing runner-up in the GIII Monrovia Stakes. The mare is a daughter of Abrahams's GIII Las Cienegas Stakes runner-up Llandudno, whose two other winners includes the dual Grade III winner Kirstenbosch (Midnight Lute), who Abrahams sold to Katsumi Yoshida for \$700,000 at Fasig-Tipton November in 2024.

Constantia is also the dam of a yearling **Golden Pal** filly and a filly by **Blame** born this past Feb. 7. She was among the first book of mares covered by **Carl Spackler** (**Ire**) earlier this season.

KNIGHTSBRIDGE BOUNCES BACK IN A BIG WAY IN MONMOUTH CUP

OCEANPORT, NJ -- **Knightsbridge** (Nyquist) hadn't visited the winner's circle since romping at Gulfstream in February. However, moments before the skies opened up in Oceanport, New Jersey, the striking dark bay ran away from his rivals as if they were tied to a post, winning the GIII Monmouth Cup Stakes by 10 1/4 imposing lengths.

Not dilly-dallying at the start in this debut at Monmouth Park and the nine-furlong distance, Knightsbridge confidently went to the front as this season's GI Pegasus World Cup Invitational winner **Skippylongstocking** (Exaggerator) pressed the issue

through an opening quarter mile in :23.38. Given a little more rein by Flavien Prat, the 5-year-old kept up the tempo through a half in :46.57. Still in front turning for home, Skippylongstocking was having difficulty keeping up and began to backpedal as the front-runner started to open up. In the final sixteenth, it was purely a formality as the 1-2 choice crossed the wire over 10 lengths on top of Money Game. It was a further 19 lengths back to Skippylongstocking.

"I knew he was a good horse," said Prat. "He broke well. I had him relaxed most of the first part [of the race]. I just let him run on the backside and try to get away from the pressure and after that he was there for me every step of the way. I rode against him. He's obviously a very good horse. I was very impressed by his demeanor and his attitude. He's a very good horse."

Godolphin America's Michael Banahan added, "He passed the two-turn test today indeed. If you're trying the two-turn test, this is a great racetrack to do it because speed can carry. He had a little bit of pressure into the first turn. Flavien [Prat] said he decided he'd best let him roll on a little bit and he's either going to stay or he's not going to stay. Thankfully, he got stronger as the race went on and put on a tour de force. It was fantastic."



Knightsbridge | Walter Wlodarczyk

Named a 'TDN Rising Star, presented by Hagyard' in his career debut at Churchill Downs in the fall of 2023, the Godolphin homebred made only a pair of starts at three, galloping home by nine at Gulfstream before rounding out the season with a third in the seven-furlong GIII Perryville Stakes at Keeneland. After a second-place finish in a Gulfstream optional claimer in the winter of his 4-year-old season, the Kentucky-bred won his remaining two starts of the year, including a victory in Gulfstream's seven-furlong GIII Mr Prospector Stakes last December.

Monmouth Cup S. cont.

This season Knightsbridge kicked off with a confident score in the GIII Fred Hooper Stakes over a mile at Gulfstream before dazzling with a 11 1/4-length score in the GIII Gulfstream Park Mile on Feb. 28. Favored when cutting back to seven-eighths in the GI Churchill Downs Stakes, he faded late to be sixth behind T O Elvis (**Volatile**), but returned to be a much-improved second, beaten four lengths to Nysos (**Nyquist**) in the GI Metropolitan Handicap at Saratoga June 6.

"It was a really good performance," said Banahan. "He's been talented since the day he broke his maiden at Churchill. We've had a stop and-start-career with him."

He continued, "This has been the first year since we've had him when we can go race to race. It was a spectacular performance. We were looking for something like that, but did not know what we'd get until doing that distance. You're not going to know for sure how they'll do it. So that was very gratifying to see."

Asked what is next for Knightsbridge, Banahan said, "This will open up other opportunities for him down the road as well. That was the nice thing about today, to be able to see what else we could do with him. It'll be exciting to sit down and have a chat with [trainer] Bill [Mott] and see where we're going to go with him."

Trainer Chad Brown added a record 10th GIII Matchmaker Stakes to his resume Saturday as Grayosh (Yoshida {Jpn}) ran down Long Ago (GB) (Roaring Lion) and favored City Girl (Fr) (City Light {Fr}) to spring the 8-1 upset at Monmouth Park.

Making her third start off a layoff, the 5-year-old mare kicked off her season eeking out a win against optional claimers at Aqueduct Apr. 24, her first race in over five months. Shipping to the Jersey Shore, she prepped for Saturday's win with a start in the 1 1/16-mile GIII Eatontown Stakes, finishing a rallying third June 13.

Getting the bit of extra distance here at 1 1/8 miles, Grayosh entered the starting gate for the Matchmaker for the second straight year having finished third by just a neck in a thrilling 2025 edition behind MGISW Segesta (Ghostzapper) and GISW Sacred Wish (**Not This Time**).

Drawn inside, jockey Tyler Gaffalione let his mare settle back out of the opening chute, saving ground around the first turn while a comfortable fourth as longshot Creative Stuff (Creative Cause) took it to City Girl on the lead.

Shifting up to be right off those leaders heels through the half in :49.75, Grayosh needed a lane as the contenders bunched up and found it by splitting the field with a pair of runners both inside and out of her. The early leaders continued to duke it out against the rail but the grey was charging fast and got up in time with Long Ago edging out City Girl for the minor awards.

"First of, all the credit goes to Chad (Brown)," said Gaffalione following the race. "He sent this filly over ready to run. He gave me a ton of confidence and told me before the race to ride her like I own her. He said she was going to fire big, and she did. She put herself in a great spot and traveled like a winner throughout. I waited for the spot, and as soon as it opened, she didn't hesitate. She's got a lot of heart. She's a very hard-trying filly. I'm very proud of her to finally break through and get a good win."

Trainer Chad Brown has now won the Matchmaker seven years in a row dating back to 2020.

"She has been training well," added Brown's assistant, Luis Cabrera. "She likes it here. She has been training really good. After the last race, Chad decided to keep her here because he wanted to run her in this race. She has just been doing everything well lately. Some horses like certain tracks. She has run well twice on this track. Some horses take a little time to get it. She is getting more focused now."

That mare, third in the turf Happy Ticket Stakes in her own racing career, has plenty of back pedigree class with no fewer than three European stakes runners in her pedigree along with the likes of English and Irish champions and full-siblings El Gran Senor and Try My Best, both by Northern Dancer.

CY FAIR STRUTS HER STUFF IN CORONATION CUP *by Jill Williams*

GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint winner **Cy Fair** (**Not This Time**) captured Saturday's GIII Coronation Cup Stakes at Saratoga, soundly beating the only two in-training fillies who have ever finished in front of her. It was something of a return to her roots, as Cy Fair was named a 'TDN Rising Star, presented by Hagyard' on debut over this course and distance last July. What a ride she's taken her owners--Medallion Racing, Swinbank Stables LLC, Joey Platts, and Mark Stanton--on since then.

In addition to her Breeders' Cup win over colts last fall at two, which put her on the short list of finalists for Eclipse Award 2-year-old filly honors, Cy Fair also won the GIII Mamzelle Stakes at Churchill Downs Apr. 30 and the Algonquin Stakes, also over colts, at Woodbine in October. A colt has never finished in front of her and Saturday's win ensured she's now defeated each of the fillies who has: the re-opposing **Snow Face Princess**

(**Midshipman**) finished a neck in front of Cy Fair last August in the Bolton Landing Stakes, while **Sapphire Beach (Ire)** (**No Nay Never**) finished a half-length to the good in Keeneland's Apr. 10 GIII Limestone Stakes, Cy Fair's first start of 2026. The winner that day was Slay the Day (Into Mischief), who was retired earlier this week and was beaten by Cy Fair in the Mamzelle.

"I think all things equal, she is the best 3-year-old filly turf sprinter out there," said winning trainer George Weaver of his charge. "I know it's not a big category in the [United] States, but she is a pretty special horse. We're very proud of her."

Cy Fair broke sharply in the Coronation Cup, but it was Sapphire Beach who went to the front while Cy Fair bided her time just off the leader's flank on the inside and last-out GIII Soaring Softly third **Cadenza** (**Charlatan**) sat third. Cy Fair and Cadenza swapped spots just after Sapphire Beach recorded the :22.54 first quarter and remained there until the straight, while longshots **Hark Theangelssing** (Mendelssohn) and Snow Face Princess trailed and never cracked the top three. As they leveled off in the lane, Sapphire Beach clung to the lead until Cy Fair angled off the rail, accelerated effortlessly, and went right on by to win by 2 1/2 lengths in little more than a hand ride. Sapphire Beach outclassed Cadenza by another 4 3/4 lengths for second.

Purchased by Swinbank Stables for \$185,000 at the 2025 OBS April 2-year-old sale, Cy Fair had originally been slated for a trip to Royal Ascot last month, but Weaver wasn't happy with the way she was training at the time. After the Coronation Cup, Weaver said Cy Fair's major end-of-season target may be the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint against older males.

He added, "I decided I wanted to be a horse trainer a long time ago, and this type of horse is the reason why. We love all our horses, and we love winning maiden \$10,000, claiming races, it doesn't matter, but these good horses, they put a pep in your step. She has been really good to us."

Pedigree Notes:

Taylor Made's 2026 leading general sire **Not This Time** is the sire of Cy Fair and 38 other graded winners, as well as 75 career black-type winners. Cy Fair is one of several of his runners to have shone brightly at Saratoga, including 2022 GI Travers Stakes winner **Epicenter** and 2024 GI Jaipur Stakes winner **Cogburn**, who set the course record for the Coronation Cup's 5 1/2-furlong distance in :59.80.

Out of a winning Arch mare, Cy Fair has three younger half-siblings: the 2-year-old filly Channel Crossing (Omaha Beach), who sold to Steve Young for \$400,000 at Keeneland September, and a 2025 filly and a 2026 colt, both by **Nyquist**. The now-yearling filly was a \$750,000 MWG purchase at Keeneland November. Their dam, Remarqued, was bred to **Annapolis** for 2027. Remarqued is a half-sister to British MG2SW & G1SP

Crimson Advocate (**Nyquist**), who is also a MSW in the U.S., while her dam hails from the same family as champion and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner Caledonia Road (**Quality Road**).

SIDELINED SINCE REBEL VICTORY, CLASS PRESIDENT NEARING RETURN TO TRAINING

Class President (Uncle Mo), scratched from the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. and subsequently taken off the Triple Crown trail with bone bruising, is nearing a return to training.

Campaigned in partnership by WinStar Farm, First Go Racing and CHC, Inc. and trained by Hall of Famer Todd Pletcher, Class President was an ultra-game nose winner in his first attempt around two turns when last seen in the GII Rebel S. at Oaklawn Park Mar. 1.

He followed a smart debut victory at a one-turn mile at Gulfstream Park Dec. 27 with a second-place finish in the seven-furlong Swale S. Jan. 31.

"He's doing really well," WinStar Farm's Elliott Walden said. "He looks great, no surgeries were needed. Just turnout and he's about at the end of that. Gonna start back probably within two weeks."

Walden continued, "We're kinda in a spot where he wasn't gonna make it back for the end of the year, so there wasn't a whole lot of pressure on time. He's just getting ready to start back in training with an expectation of getting to Florida this winter and regrouping at four."

One of 65 graded winners for the late, great leading sire Uncle Mo, the WinStar Farm-bred Class President was produced by the MSW & GSP **Quality Road** mare Top Quality. She brought \$335,000 from WinStar at the 2019 Keeneland January sale and

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is also responsible for the stakes-placed duo of American Speed (More Than Ready) and Keepsake (Into Mischief); and the ill-fated flashy debut winner Pastor T (Into Mischief).

"He's a horse that we're really excited about getting back," Walden said. "Being a son of Uncle Mo, and the fact he's a sire of sires, he's an exciting prospect for us at WinStar."

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SARATOGA NOTEBOOK, PRESENTED BY NYRA BETS: ALVARADO NOT WORRIED ABOUT SOVEREIGNTY ... YET *by Tim Wilkin*

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y. - Jockey Junior Alvarado, the constant companion of 2025 Horse of the Year **Sovereignty** (Into Mischief), still has confidence in the horse that took him to great heights a season ago.

That being said, it's time for Sovereignty to put it all together very soon. Like in the GI, \$1-million Whitney Stakes at Saratoga Race Course on Aug. 8.

Sovereignty has come out of the gate in 2026 a little slow with a second (in the GII Oaklawn Handicap on Apr. 18) and a third (GI Stephen Foster at Churchill Downs on June 27).

He was a good second in the Oaklawn race, which was his first start since winning the GI Travers Stakes eight months earlier. The Foster came on a sloppy track.

"I told Bill (Hall of Fame trainer Mott) after the last race, it was the first time he has not finished the way I thought he would," Alvarado said Saturday morning outside of Mott's barn at the Oklahoma Training Track. "It was a sealed track, a big guy like him, maybe not the best thing."

After those two races, coming off a spectacular 2025, there is no need to raise the red flag. Not yet, anyway.

"Worried? No," Alvarado said. "I will be worried after the Whitney if he doesn't run like the way I expect. If he doesn't run his race in the Whitney, I will definitely be scratching my head."

Alvarado, who has ridden Sovereignty in 10 of his 11 career starts, was talking after Sovereignty worked five furlongs on the Oklahoma in 1:00.25 (1/18) under assistant trainer Neil Poznansky. Alvarado got a good look at his partner as he was the pilot of 4-year-old maiden **Thunder Roll** (**Hard Spun**), who worked in company with Sovereignty.

Thunder Roll, clocked in 1:00.65 (2/18), broke about three lengths in front of Sovereignty to give his stablemate a target.

"I thought the pair of them put in a very good work," Mott said. "That is why we give (Sovereignty) a horse to work with. If you worked him on his own, he would probably be going in 1:03 or 1:04."

Alvarado said this was the third time he has worked the other horse in company with Sovereignty.

The Whitney will be run over a surface that Godolphin's Sovereignty has always liked. He has won all three of his starts on the main track at the Spa: last year's GI Belmont Stakes, the GII Jim Dandy and the Travers.

In the Whitney, he is going to face the likes of **Magnitude** (**Not This Time**), who worked five furlongs in 1:03 (11/18) earlier on the Oklahoma, **Baeza** (**McKinzie**), **White Abarrio** (Race Day) and the filly **Nitrogen** (Medaglia d'Oro).

"The Whitney is very important," Mott said. "But the most important (race) will be the Breeders' Cup Classic. That is the end goal."

Travers? Albany? Talk to Me Jimmy's People Will Talk About it

Last Monday, trainer Rudy Rodriguez and the owners of New York-bred **Talk to Me Jimmy** (**Modernist**), took a ride west on the New York State Thruway, stopped at Finger Lakes and won the \$164,000 New York Derby.

And that opened a whole lot of doors. Well, two of them.

The next start is either the GI, \$1.25-million Travers Stakes at Saratoga on Aug. 29 against the big boys or the division of the \$200,000 Albany Stakes for New York bred on Aug. 23.

Which way do we go?

That depends on who you ask.

"I want to keep him with New York bred and try to make some money," Rodriguez said Saturday morning outside his barn at the Oklahoma Training Track.

"Why wouldn't we think about the Travers?" said Libby Imperio, who owns part of the horse with her husband, Michael.

"She has already sent him to the Travers," Rodriguez, also a co-owner, said with a laugh as the two sat in a golf cart.

"I think he is much more talented than Rudy likes to admit," Libby Imperio said with a shrug.

Wherever Talk to Me Jimmy ends up, it will be a well thought out plan with plenty of discussion by all the connections. SEI Thoroughbreds also co-owns the colt.

Talk to Me Jimmy has had open company experience before. He won the Withers Stakes at Aqueduct by 11 lengths on Feb. 6, was eighth in the GII Wood Memorial on Apr. 4 at Aqueduct and then was second in the GII Peter Pan Stakes on May 9, also at Aqueduct.

He only faced three others in the New York Derby and the final time of 1:46.67 for the 1 1/16 miles isn't going to scare any other Travers runners. Just being able to have to make a decision like this is what they are all in the game for.

"It's never crazy to dream," Libby Imperio said. "We will do what we think is best for the horse."

Ewing Resurfaces at Saratoga on a New Surface

Even when he was sparkling on the dirt at Saratoga last summer, Hall of Fame trainer Mark Casse thought the future for his promising 2-year-old and 'TDN Rising Star, presented by Hagyard' **Ewing** (Knicks Go) might be on the grass.

The future is here, and the grey colt owned by DJ Stable, West Point Thoroughbreds and Kenneth Freirich is indeed going to try the turf.

"I always kind of felt he moved like a grass horse," Casse said outside his barn on the Saratoga backstretch. "A lot of the Knicks Gos have run pretty well on the grass."

Ewing, named for former New York Knick and NBA Hall of Famer Patrick Ewing, is entered to run in Sunday's GIII, \$225,000 Quick Call Stakes, a 5 1/2-furlong sprint on the Mellon Turf Course. He is listed at 5-1 on the morning line and will leave from post position one with jockey Jose Ortiz.

Ewing dazzled at Saratoga as a 2-year-old, breaking his maiden by a dozen lengths and then winning the GII Saratoga Special. Both races were won on the front end.

His juvenile season was cut short because of a knee injury and Casse pointed him to 2026. Ewing's first start this year resulted in a sixth-place finish in the Ozark Stakes at Oaklawn Park on Feb. 16.

"I think I might have rushed him back a little bit; you know, the old (Kentucky) Derby feel deal," Casse said. "He never showed up at all at Oaklawn, so I took him home."

That would be Casse's training center in Ocala, Fla.

"I said, 'you know what? I am going to let him tell me instead of me telling him,' Casse said. "We have taken our time with him and aimed for Saratoga. With these horses, especially these 3-year-olds that have won a stake already, there are so few opportunities."

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AS GOOD AS IT GETS: THE GOOD LIFE DEBUTS A 'RISING STAR' AT THE SPA

WinStar Farm, First Go Racing and CHC, Inc.'s **The Good Life** (c, 2, **Life Is Good**--First Hour, by Speightstown) shot out to the front and dominated a talented-looking bunch on debut at the Spa Saturday to become the third 'TDN Rising Star, presented by Hagyard' for his freshman sire.

Off at odds of 3-1, the Brad Cox-trained The Good Life was hustled to the front from his inside draw by Manny Franco and led through an opening quarter in :22.92. He began to let it out a notch approaching the quarter pole and drew clear in the stretch to win with authority by 3 1/2 lengths.

Highly regarded \$1.8-million Fasig-Tipton Saratoga graduate **Powerline** (**Flightline**) encountered some traffic trouble in the early going and also got slammed into at the top of the stretch to finish an unlucky second as the 8-5 second choice.

Favored **Greenwell** (**Flightline**), second as the chalk on debut at Churchill Downs June 12, was a disappointing fifth as the 6-5 choice.

The final time for six furlongs was 1:11.14.

The winner's dam First Hour, a maiden of three career starts, brought \$250,000 from WinStar as a Keeneland November weanling. She is also responsible for Hereforagoodtime (**Justify**), MGSP, \$481,711; and a yearling filly by **Flightline**.

First Hour is a half-sister to MGSW & GISP and fantastic producer Justwhistledixie (Dixie Union), the dam of GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner New Year's Day (Street Cry {Ire}); MGSW Mohaymen (**Tapit**); and GSWs Kingly (**Tapit**) and Enforceable (**Tapit**).

The rail-drawn 2-1 favorite was ridden along in fifth as **Cruising Again** (**Charlatan**) sped through an opening quarter in :22.22. Effusive was tipped off the rail by Manny Franco at the top of the stretch and bumped soundly with \$650,000 OBS April breezer **Key Colony Beach** (Omaha Beach) as Cruising Again kicked for home with a three-length advantage.

Undeterred, Effusive recovered nicely, set her sights on the tiring leader from there and outkicked Key Colony Beach home to graduate by 1 1/4 lengths.

Banishing enjoyed a drop in class Saturday, taking the Jeff Hall Memorial Stakes in his first start since getting pulled up in the GI Churchill Downs Stakes on the Kentucky Derby undercard May 2.

The G2 Godolphin Mile winner from March also enjoyed a minor cutback in distance from his last start, going just 6 1/2 furlongs here as he attempted to defend his title from the same race won one year ago.

He went right to the front and ran them off their feet.

Proletariat (Raging Bull {Fr}) proved too good for them Friday, and dominated the Oceanside Handicap on opening day at Del Mar to collect his first stakes victory.

Proletariat entered this race off a May 15 victory at Santa Anita when he defeated optional claiming company and earned a career-best 92 Beyer figure in the process. Before that, he'd claimed back-to-back graded placings with third-place finishes in the GIII Del Mar Juvenile Turf and GIII Zuma Beach Stakes Sept. 7 and Oct. 5, respectively. Between those two contests, he was defeated by the likes of 'TDN Rising Star, presented by Hagyard' GSW & GISP Plutarch (Into Mischief); well-regarded multiple black-type winner Hey Nay Nay (Ire); and GISW Stark Contrast (Caravaggio).

Breaking well and immediately establishing command going into the first bend, the Jeff Mullins-trainee posted :22.49, :46.63, and six panels in 1:10.76 while opening up a commanding advantage by the time they entered the last turn. Increasing the margin as 2-1 favorite GISP **Mr. A.P. (American Pharoah)** tried to reel him in, this 6-1 shot gave them all the slip entering the lane and only expanded the margin to win with air to spare.

Secured Freedom (Practical Joke) came on late to claim second from a valiant Mr. A.P., who was returning off a nearly 8.5 month layoff. The final time was 1:33.54. **Cont.**

“This was the only spot there was for him and we knew the horse was a little bit rank going long,” said Mullins afterwards. “Every work [jockey] Kyle [Frey] worked with him getting him to slow down early and letting him finish strong. I just told him to leave there with loose ends and if he takes you, just go ahead and get him to settle. He got him on the lead and he ran around there with ears pricked the whole way and turned it on.”

Proletariat gets to enjoy the distinction as **Raging Bull**'s first stakes winner from three black-type runners. The others are MSP Jutland and MSP In the Aggregate, the latter of which is the lone filly to garner stakes placings thus far. **Raging Bull**'s first crop of runners are this year's 3-year-olds.

The victor is a half-brother to Italian multiple Group runner Sun Never Sets, who was their dam's first to the races. The pair has an unplaced juvenile half-brother in Ireland named Charlemont G G (**Charlatan**) as well as two half-sisters in the wings--a yearling Up to the mark and a 2026 **Constitution**. 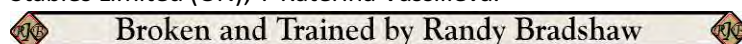

“She was cherry-ripe for the day and wasn't a bad substitute! I thought she was a little bit better than she showed at Ascot and it was push-button stuff today,” he added of the 7-2 second favourite. “She is improving with each run and handles this fast ground well--she is a filly with a lot of class. We had three good fillies in it and with Thundering On being a little bit special it is hard to know what she would have done, but it's all worked out in my favour today.”

Enjoying the perfect tow into the race from four of the Ballydoyle quintet, Johanna Walsh who was having only the fifth run of her career was able to take total control two out and surge to an emphatic success. Following her home were the supplemented trio of **Inis Mor** (Galiway), **Sparan Nua** (**Dawn Approach**) and **Rebel Moon** (Lope De Vega), all of whom closed from rear after the winner had flown with 3/4 of a length separating the Menuisier and Bolger fillies and Johanna Walsh's stablemate half a length further away. **Earth Shot** (Time Test), the 9-4 favourite following the withdrawal of Thundering On, was the race's disappointment in a well-beaten sixth.

Joseph O'Brien has the pick of the middle-distance three-year-old fillies and said, “It was a huge performance--from the three to the two she really came alive and is a hugely exciting filly for the future. We thought we had a messy enough trip at Ascot and Dylan said she was waiting all way up the straight there, but so did Earth Shot so it was hard to quantify. On that, we thought she was a real live contender and I'm delighted for Wells Watson and Andrew Cary. She has a big pedigree and it's a pleasure to get the opportunity to train her. Sadly, neither are here today.”

Johanna Walsh, who had been third behind her stablemate and future Royal Ascot scorer Green Carrera on her sole juvenile start at Thurles in October, had looked pretty far from Oaks-winning material when in that position again behind Rebel Moon at Gowran in April. [Cont. p4](#)

As can happen with such a classically-bred individual, a maiden win at Leopardstown in May transformed her and there had been only a head between her and Earth Shot in the key three-year-old fillies' middle-distance contest at the Royal meeting.

What would have transpired had Thundering On line up here remains an unknown, but this was an imperious display from the winner and it is difficult to envisage the Epsom heroine being able to handle her. The time of 2:28.49 was the fastest in the race since Shawanda set the record in 2005 and the fourth-fastest in its history.

"I thought Dylan gave her a fantastic ride because he controlled the whole race," the trainer added. "It's really special to win a Classic here in Ireland and great for the team to have two impressive Oaks winners. This is what we are in the game for and this is why we do what we do. She's had a busy first part of the season, so we'll probably give her a little freshen up now and focus on an autumn campaign. It's disappointing that Thundering On couldn't be here, but she will be back for the autumn too."

Johanna Walsh, who becomes the third Irish Oaks winner for her sire following the exploits of Sea Of Class in 2018 and Star Catcher a year later, is out of the Mezeray and Skymarc Farm-bred maiden Miss Aiglonne (**Dawn Approach**). Her dam Aiglonne (Silver Hawk), who was successful at Group 3 level in France before finishing third in the Orchid Handicap in the States, was responsible for **Sea The Stars**'s Prix d'Ispahan-winning sire Mekhtaal, the dual Graded-Stakes scorer and Stakes producer Aigue Marine (Galileo), the Group 1-placed Normandy Bridge (Le Havre) and Prix Hocquart winner Democrate (Dalakhani).

Also connected to Silver Hawk's Prix de Diane and Prix Saint-Alary heroine Germance, in turn the dam of last year's Prix de Diane and Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf heroine Gezora (Alamazor), and to the past international heavyweights White Muzzle and Almutawakel, Miss Aiglonne's two-year-old is a full-brother to the winner. Sold for 65,000gns to Oliver St Lawrence Bloodstock at Tattersalls October Book 2, he is named Seagoing and is already gelded. Her fifth progeny by **Sea The Stars** is a colt produced this year.

Said O'Callaghan, "He found the pace mid-race a little bit hot, but he said the horse has plenty of class and took plenty of pulling up. His next race will be over seven furlongs and he could be a horse to go a mile next May."

Positioned off the tempo in a detached third through the initial stages, the 7-2 second favourite came under pressure soon after halfway and was ridden clear once quickening smartly for his challenge entering the final furlong to securer a career high by an impressive three lengths from G2 Norfolk Stakes also-ran **Tribeca** (Blue Point).

COVER UP SWOOPS LATE FOR SAPPHIRE SUCCESS

Khalifa Saeed Sulaiman's six-year-old gelding **Cover Up** (Exceed And Excel) was under four lengths adrift of Mission Central when a close-up 13th in last month's G1 King Charles III Stakes at Royal Ascot and stepped forward to claim a fourth stakes success and second Group 2 win in Saturday's G2 Tulfarris Hotel & Golf Resort Sapphire Stakes at the Curragh.

"He's a really wonderful horse to have in the stable and he's a high-quality sprinter who did well in Dubai," commented Ed Crisford. "[Royal] Ascot was the aim, but he ran into the back of horses and just got no run really. We thought this track would suit him well, but I was a little bit worried because there was no rain and we always thought he liked to get his toe in a bit. He handled it super and he finished really well. We'll run in the [G1] Nunthorpe and maybe come back here for the [G1] Flying Five."

Off the pace in an overall eighth through solid early fractions, the Simon and Ed Crisford-trained 7-1 chance came was hustled along approaching the quarter-mile pole and kept on relentlessly under a continued drive to deny **Partisan Hero** (Muhaarar) by 3/4-of-a-length nearing the line. Completing a British trifecta, the pacesetter **Jakajaro** (Too Darn Hot) fared best of the remainder and was one length adrift in third.

Mel Sutcliffe's **Moody** (Night Of Thunder), who snagged one of two starts for Godolphin and Andre Fabre last year, maintained her unbeaten record for her new connections with a pillar-to-post victory in Saturday's G3 Al Shira'aa Racing Meadow Court Stakes on the G1 Irish Oaks undercard.

"She's a nice filly," said Paddy Twomey. "She's won her Listed race, her Listed race with a penalty and a Group 3 now. She's versatile and when she was with Mr [Andre] Fabre she'd ran at nine furlongs twice. She's just tough and I'd say she's good too. She's in the [G1] Prix Jean Romanet, she's in the [G1] Yorkshire Oaks and she's in the [G1] Prix Vermeille. She's in everything."

In command throughout the 10-furlong test, the 15-2 chance kicked clear inside the final quarter-mile and kept on strongly in the latter stages to easily account for **Rhapsody** (Ghaiyyath) and **Nyra** (Isfahan) by 3 1/2 lengths and a neck.

Moody, who becomes the 46th Group-race winner for her sire, is the third of seven foals and the leading performer out of stakes-winning G3 Grosser Preis der Mehl-Mulhens-Stiftung second Agathonia (Street Cry), herself a granddaughter of Listed Radley Stakes victrix Ciquette (Shirley Heights).

MOYGLARE'S PORTO VECCHIO BECOMES FRANKEL'S 50TH TDN RISING STAR *by Tom Frary*

Dermot Weld's sole runner on Saturday's Irish Oaks card at The Curragh just happened to be a full-brother to his Irish 1,000 Guineas heroine Homeless Songs and **Porto Vecchio** duly followed in her steps to become **Frankel's** 50th TDN Rising Star, Presented by Hagyard.

Almost five years to the day since his illustrious full-sibling was launched onto the scene to earn instant TDN Rising Stardom, Moyglare's latest representative of the amazing dynasty of In Anticipation was in action in a seven-furlong maiden that has been won in recent times by The Lion In Winter, **Henry Longfellow** and Mac Swiney.

Tackling a trio of Ballydoyle newcomers by Wootton Bassett and the fancied Ger Lyons-trained **Anchor Road** (Dark Angel), the homebred was 9-1 as a result but hadn't read the script travelling powerfully under Chris Hayes tracking the latter throughout the early stages. Let down approaching the furlong pole, he demonstrated the same acceleration that characterised his sister's best performances to score by half a length from the best of the Aidan O'Brien trio, **Victory Speech**. That full-brother to the Group 2 winner Beautify was in turn 1 1/4 lengths ahead of Anchor Road, whose form is linked with the Superlative runner-up Abraham Lincoln.

"He had worked very nicely at home--he has shown a little bit of immaturity, but everything he's been asked to do he's done very well," Weld said. "This is only the first or second time he's been on grass, so I think we can see a lot of progress from him. If he's as good as his sister he'll do and he's always shown nice ability."

Weld added, "He's in the Futurity, so we'll discuss it with Eva Marie [Bucher-Haefner], Fiona [Craig] and Malachy [Ryan] and see. I'd hope he'll be a miler like her and the National Stakes has always been in my mind as a target race for this colt, even as early as March."

"He's my first two-year-old colt to run this year," he added. "I said a couple of weeks ago when Purview won the Group 3 that we had some nice two-year-olds to produce in the coming weeks and he was the first of them."

Porto Vecchio is the sixth foal out of the German Listed winner Joailliere (Dubawi) who was multiple group-placed between seven furlongs and a mile. Other than the aforementioned Homeless Songs, she has also produced the Listed winner and dual Group-placed Reve De Vol (Siyouni) and has a 2026 colt again by Frankel.

Joailliere, a half-sister to two other Stakes performers headed by the dual Group winner Carla Bianca (Dansili), is a daughter of the Listed scorer Diamond Trim (Highest Honor) whose progeny list features by the triple Group 3 winner and Irish St Leger runner-up Profound Beauty (Danehill). The fourth dam In Anticipation (Sadler's Wells) is the key member of the family,

producing the Ribblesdale winner Irresistible Jewel (Danehill) responsible for three high-class runners in Princess Highway (Street Cry), Royal Diamond (King's Best) and Mad About You (Indian Ridge) who is in turn the dam of the Takamatsunomiya Kinen heroine Mad Cool (Dark Angel).

WOOTTON BASSETT COLT WINS FOR JUDDMONTE IN CALIFORNIA

In this series, the TDN takes a look at notable successes of European-based sires in North America. This week's column is highlighted by the victory of Detain at Del Mar.

Detain Prevails At Del Mar

Juddmonte's **Detain**, third in the 2025 G1 Prix du Jockey Club, got off the mark in his second American start at Del Mar on Friday evening ([video](#)). Bred by Swordlestown Little, the four-year-old colt is now trained by Michael McCarthy.

Offered by his breeder at the 2022 Goffs November Foal Sale, the son of Nisriyna (Intikhab) was picked up by Juddmonte for €340,000. Trained by John and Thady Gosden in the U.K., the son of Wootton Bassett won his first two starts a two from three appearances and added a third win in his three-year-old bow. Before switching Stateside, he ran third in the G2 Joel Stakes. Detain is a half-brother to a trio of stakes horses led by dual Group 3 winner Arrest (**Frankel**), who was second in the G1 St Leger and Dinozzo, successful in the G3 Centenary Vase in Hong Kong, as well as third in the G1 Hong Kong Gold Cup. His dam is a half-sister to multiple group winner Narniyn (Dubawi), second

in the G1 Nassau Stakes and third in the G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud.

Coolmore's late Wootton Bassett continues to burnish his sire record posthumously. Detain is his 29th winner from 60 runners (48%) in the U.S. His octet of stakes winners there include a trio of Grade I winners. All scored in Breeders' Cup Turf races, with Audarya winning the Filly & Mare Turf, and Unquestionable and **Henri Matisse** both striking in the G1 Juvenile Turf.

Repeat Winners
