

COOLMORE ACQUIRES BREEDING RIGHTS TO MAGNITUDE

MGISW Magnitude (**Not This Time**--Rockadelic, by Bernardini) will stand at Coolmore's Ashford Stud upon his retirement, the farm announced Tuesday.

The Coolmore partners reached an agreement with the colt's owner Winchell Thoroughbreds to acquire the breeding rights. According to the release, Magnitude will continue to compete in the colors of Winchell Thoroughbreds for the remainder of his racing career before retiring to stand in Kentucky.

Trained by Hall of Famer Steve Asmussen, Magnitude is currently undefeated in his 4-year-old campaign and cemented his status as one of the world's best horses with a gate-to-wire victory over international superstar Forever Young (Real Steel {Jpn}) in the \$12 million G1 Dubai World Cup at Meydan in March. He then backed up that performance in June by capturing the \$2 million G1 Stephen Foster Stakes at Churchill Downs, securing an automatic berth into November's G1 Breeders' Cup Classic.

A spectacular 9 3/4-length winner of the GII Risen Star Stakes as a 3-year-old, Magnitude overcame a subsequent spring setback to return with a dominant 9 1/4-length victory in the Iowa Derby.

NEW YORK STATE OF MIND: BUCCHERO CEMENTS HIS WARRIOR STATUS AT STUD

SCHUYLERVILLE, N.Y. -- At this year's Fasig-Tipton New York-Bred Yearlings sale, Ironhorse Stallions' **Buccher** (**Kantharos**)--the Empire State's Leading Sire from 2025--will have 10 from his inaugural New York-sired crop go through the ring at the Humphrey S. Finney Pavilion when the two-day event gavel Aug. 16.

It's safe to say that **Buccher** is hitting them where they ain't. He is the only New York-based sire in 2026 with graded stakes winners to his credit.

Buccher's stock obviously reached new heights with Book'em Danno's fame, which was capped by the gelding garnering champion male sprinter honors. **Cont. Pg. 4**

The July Digital Sale on Fasig-Tipton Digital closed late Tuesday afternoon with gross sales of \$2,984,500 for 101 horses sold. Topping the sale was maiden winner Cha Cha Baby (*Highly Motivated*) at \$460,000 to LC Racing.

Counting Stars (*Honor A.P.*) is a timely top-level winner for her sire after taking this past weekend's GI Coaching Club American Oaks at Saratoga. Other features in this week's Breeding Digest include Gold Phoenix (Ire) (Belardo {Ire}) and Built (*Hard Spun*).

He concluded his sophomore season with highly competitive, top-level placings in both the GI Travers Stakes and the GI Pennsylvania Derby before defeating older horses in the GII Clark Stakes.

Bred in Kentucky by Ron Stolich, Magnitude is by sire sensation **Not This Time** and out of the Bernardini mare Rockadelic, a daughter of the Coaching Club American Oaks and dual Grade I winner Octave.

Welcoming the agreement, Charlie O'Connor of Ashford Stud said: "Magnitude has proven himself to be an absolute powerhouse, combining immense speed, balance, and incredible determination. His performances in the Dubai World Cup and the Stephen Foster showed the world what a talent he is. We've been watching him closely since his spectacular performance in the Risen Star at three, and we believe he has all the attributes to become an exceptional stallion. He is a striking, exceptionally good- looking horse with tremendous presence. We are thrilled to have come to an agreement with Ron and are looking forward to welcoming him to Ashford when his racing days are complete."

Expressing his enthusiasm for the colt's future, Ron Winchell added: "Magnitude is an incredibly special horse for us, and he has given our family and racing team some of our greatest moments on the track. Knowing he will eventually head to Ashford Stud for his stallion career ensures he will receive the absolute best support and opportunity when he enters the breeding shed. For now, Steve and our team are fully focused on the second half of his 4-year-old season as we point towards the Whitney."

Also of note is 5-year-old mare Queen Maxima, who netted her third higher-level win in the Las Cienegas Stakes over the Santa Anita turf in January.

For Ironhorse Stallions Managing Partner Harlan Malter, **Bucchero's** rise continues to be the ride of a lifetime as his syndicate navigates the challenging waters of stallion ownership.

"When we first thought about retiring **Bucchero** from the racetrack and standing him, a number of industry people that I respect told me this was not what we should be pursuing," said Malter from outside **Bucchero's** residence on the north side of Schuylerville, New York. "It is a tough haul for our partners to shift from racing to standing a stallion. But we felt passionate about the opportunity, we knew what kind of horse we had and that's what we pursued."

Bucchero's road to the farm in Schuylerville is a unique one, but according to Malter it probably reflects the sire's resilience and versatility more than anything.

"He's not a regional stallion by any stretch and we're immensely proud of the fact that he's adapted so well to different places," he said. "I think that proves he can appeal to anyone. After standing him in Florida for five years, we decided to make the switch to New York and we couldn't be happier with the results."

Remember, **Bucchero** was a \$43,000 OBS June buy. An Indiana-bred primarily trained by Tim Glyshaw, the son of **Kantharos** began his career competing in local stakes like the To Much Coffee before making the grass his preferred surface. He sprinted his way to back-to-back wins in the GII Woodford Stakes at Keeneland in 2017 and 2018.

In between those races, **Bucchero** went to Royal Ascot and finished fifth in the G1 King's Stand Stakes behind superstars Blue Point (Ire) (Shamardal) and Battaash (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}).

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Bucchero retired with a record of 11-6-3 after 31 races and almost \$950,000 in earnings. His seven black-type victories include five on the main track and he was stakes-placed on synthetic surfaces as well.

As Malter is quick to point out, not only did the future stallion's best figure come on the dirt, but being an older turf sprinter actually should be thought of as an asset.

"I've always believed that we never really knew what was under **Bucchero**'s hood," he said. "Unlike traditional stallion prospects who have the pedigree from the start and are campaigned that way, **Bucchero** was entered like a racehorse, to compete and to last!"

"He still ran a 98 Beyer," added Malter. "I'd argue that **Bucchero** won those graded stakes on willpower alone. So what I'm saying is that negatives always have a chance to turn into positives. It's not always about a named pedigree. Older turf sprinters are just like gladiators and they know how to win."

With the advent of all-weather racing coming to the new Belmont Park, **Bucchero**'s ability to produce 'warriors' built for any surface could expand even further. He's connected to the likes of Rezarolex—a 5-year-old gelding with 22 starts to his credit and a record of 15-4-0.

Speaking of that move to New York, Malter brought on John Dowd to handle bloodstock and operations. Dowd added his own appraisal and said that **Bucchero**'s appeal will continue to mount.

I think physically, he's a gorgeous horse. Could you say that for a two-turn class of horse? Maybe he needs a little more of this or a little more of that, but to me the most important part is his mind. There's no wasted energy whatsoever."

In 2025, **Bucchero** covered a record 192 mares, which is the highest number ever posted outside the state of Kentucky.

According to the latest numbers that Malter has seen, **Bucchero** will be represented by somewhere around 110 to 120 live foals.

"I've always been told by people in this business that for your stallion to succeed he has to produce a freak because otherwise you'll be forgotten," Malter said. "Book'em Danno is that freak."



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The reality of the situation is every person who brings a mare over wants to think they can have the next Grade I winner or in this case the next Danno.”

Ironhorse capped **Bucchero** at 140 for this past breeding season and raised his stud fee to \$12,500.

“Commercial breeding is about supply and demand, and **Bucchero** has enough out there,” said Dowd. “There’s no doubt in my mind that he’s going to prove to everyone how good he is as a stallion. It’s pretty taxing to breed to 192 mares. It’s a lot to breed to 150. So, he’s 14 now and in order to get five to six more years it was in his best interest to set a cap. I would honestly cut it back again. Getting down to 100 would give him a greater shot at longevity.”

In late June, Malter rolled out a new television ad called “Where Horses Carried a Nation” that depicts a line of Revolutionary War mounted cavalry charging forward as part of the Battle of Saratoga. **Bucchero** peels off from the formation and leaps over a hedge, which Malter said signifies the stallion’s ability to take on all obstacles.

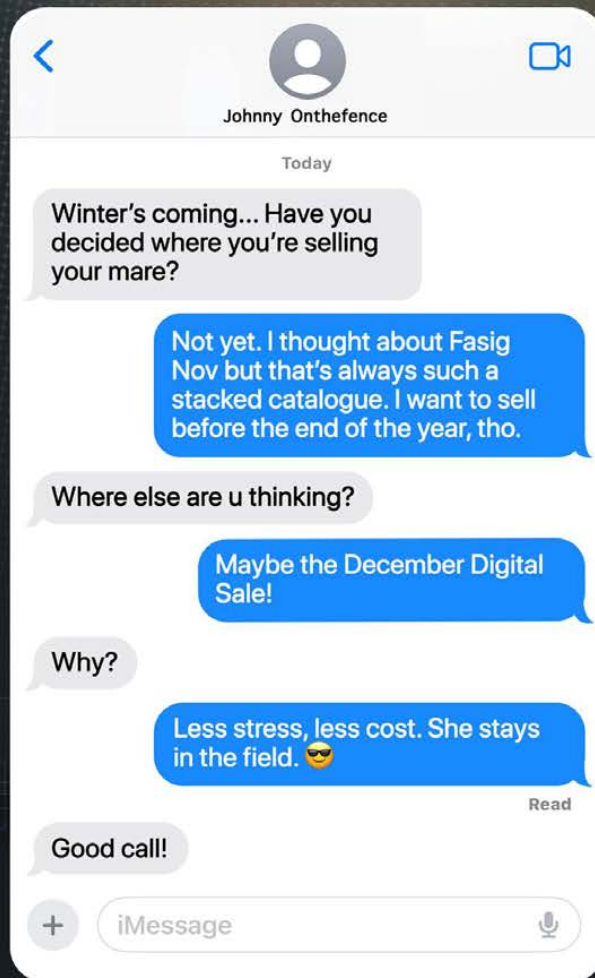
“People often say stallions can come from anywhere, but most don’t ever get the chance,” he said. “My partners took a huge shot and a leap of faith and I am so proud of **Bucchero** for pulling it off for us.”

Ironhorse’s stallion operation is doing something rare in the world of commercial breeding and according to Harlan Malter they will continue to think differently.

“The upcoming Fasig-Tipton New York-Bred sale is a big moment because traditionally the number of sires that are based here comprise less than 20% of the catalogue,” he said. “So, being a part of representing New York and building the future is key. We love New York and we’re here to stay.”

MAIDEN WINNER CHA CHA BABY TOPS FASIG-TIPTON JULY DIGITAL SALE

The July Digital Sale on Fasig-Tipton Digital closed late Tuesday afternoon with gross sales of \$2,984,500 for 101 horses sold.

Cha Cha Baby (**Highly Motivated**) (hip 27), a 9-length maiden special weight winner at Delaware Park on July 21, sold for \$460,000 to LC Racing LLC to top the sale. Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent, consigned. Cha Cha Baby is a 2-year-old filly from her sire's first crop.

"I've started using digital sales more and more, but mainly for mares to this point," said Mark Reid, who purchased Cha Cha Baby as agent for Glenn Bennett's LC Racing. "This is the first time I've used it for an actual racehorse, and with the horse stabled in my area [at Delaware Park] it was easy to go see her. All the information I needed, including Ragozin numbers, was all right there in front of me. The platform is very easy to use and everything worked out great. I bought her for Glenn Bennett, from the Philadelphia area, who is looking to increase his profile in racing and hopefully this filly will take him there."

"Cha Cha Baby delivered a very impressive result for a very impressive racehorse, highlighting another successful Digital sale," said Leif Aaron, Fasig-Tipton Director of Digital Sales. "Overall trade was solid from start to finish, with strong activity surrounding the auction. We welcomed more than 1,000 registered bidders, saw heavy veterinary activity in the repository, and had participation from buyers around the world. Racehorses continued to drive the market, accounting for nearly two-thirds of the sale's gross while posting an outstanding 91% clearance rate--further evidence of the continued demand for horses ready to compete."

Other top hips included:

Life and Times (**Justify**) (hip 12), sold for \$200,000 to Michael Dubb and Douglas Nachman from the consignment of ELiTE,

agent. A 5-year-old, Life and Times is a multiple winner and multiple graded stakes placed, and has won or placed in all his career starts to date.

Alghero (**Quality Road**) (hip 26), sold for \$160,000 to Sondereker Racing LLC from the consignment of Gainesway, agent. A 3-year-old colt, Alghero was a fast-closing second in a Saratoga maiden on July 16 in his first try over turf.

Mambo Queen (Mendelssohn) (hip 13), sold for \$100,000 to PARA2022 from the consignment of Evergreen Equine, agent. The 4-year-old filly came into the sale off a 3 1/2 length score in allowance company on June 26.

"Around the office we've been joking that 'Winter is Coming,'" added Aaron. "But there's some truth behind the saying. Now is the time to start planning for our fall and winter Digital breeding stock sales. If you're considering selling broodmares, mares in foal, weanlings, or breeding prospects, we'd love to discuss how we can help position them for success in the months ahead."

The next digital sale is the August Digital Sale, to be held August 27 through September 1. Entries close August 17.

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BREEDING DIGEST: COUNTING ON STARDOM *by Chris McGrath*

The stallions who entered stud in 2021 should really remain viewed as a work in progress, with only a third crop of juveniles joining the fray. Yet an impetuous commercial market had already made its judgement last year, when **Tiz the Law** was the busiest stallion in America, with 274 mares, while a stallion who has a superior ratio of black-type winners found himself languishing with 19.

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Has Counting Stars emerged in time to turn things round for **Honor A.P.**? It's a big question, for those of us who always thought him grievously underrated on the racetrack. But the outstanding filly of her crop, judged on the GI Coaching Club American Oaks, is well named to prompt reflection. Because it's never enough merely to count the stars produced by any given stallion, as a bare aggregate, without introducing perspective from the relative quantity and quality of his books.

Honor A.P. has so far mustered eight stakes winners from 105 starters, having opened no higher than \$15,000 (meanwhile halved). Counting Stars is the second at graded level, but the third at least placed in Grade I company.

Of those in relevant competition in Kentucky, the only pair to match his black-type winners, as a percentage of starters (7.6), are Vekoma and **Complexity**. The former, now a six-figure cover, has no fewer than 26: even from a cavalry of 257, that works out at a knockout 10.1 percent. **Complexity**'s 13 stakes winners meanwhile represent 8.4 percent of 154 starters, all conceived at just \$12,500.

The other main players in their class currently produce black-type winners at the following clip: **Tiz the Law** 6.9 percent (15 from 217 starters); **Volatile** 5.3 (10 from 187); Thousand Words 5.1 (eight from 158); **McKinzie** 4.7 (11 from 235); Authentic 4.2 (11 from 260). (A few others, notably Caracaro, have competitive percentages from a smaller sample size.) But we know that not all black type weighs quite the same, so how about their graded stakes action? **Tiz the Law** and Vekoma both have 17 such performers, respectively at 7.8 and 6.6 percent of starters; **Complexity** has nine, at 5.8 percent; **Volatile**, 10 at 5.3 percent; **Honor A.P.**, five at 4.8 percent; **McKinzie**, 10 at 4.3 percent; Thousand Words, five at 3.2 percent; Authentic, eight at 3.1 percent.

Of the rest, we must salute Shancelot for getting his first black-type winner of any description in no less a race than the GI Bing Crosby Stakes! If not to that extent, **McKinzie** has shown an uncanny flair for landing his sharpest arrows around the bull's-eye. If you're literally "counting stars", his three Grade I winners and five Grade I performers overall are the standout achievement of the class. Expressed as a ratio of starters, however, **Honor A.P.**'s three Grade I performers bat at 2.9 percent.

People should judge horses fairly, and there's no way **Honor A.P.** should already have been written off to the point that he now stands at a tenth of **McKinzie**'s fee, and suffered a nine-fold disparity in their last published books.

On the track **Honor A.P.** beat the Horse of the Year on merit, the one and only time he got a meaningful run at him. His sire admittedly didn't help his profile, but that only shows what kind of physique he has, to have made \$850,000 as a yearling. And of course he's out of a Grade I winner.

Now he has come up with a champion in the making, from only his second crop, a \$13,000 yearling whose first two dams are by Paynter and Cherokee Run. The black type introduced by the granddam does not bear close inspection and her production record proved duly mediocre, leaving as her one real distinction a sibling, Sassy Siena (**Midshipman**), who precedes Counting Stars by eight years on the Fantasy Stakes roll of honor (then Grade III).

Only when we reach the fourth dam of Counting Stars, Golden Reef (Mr. Prospector), do we find some authentic quality: she was a dashing juvenile in 1989, winner of the GII Schuylerville Stakes before twice finishing runner-up in Grade Is. That blood is pretty diluted by this stage, however, so let's give overdue

"honor" to a sire replicating an athleticism inadequately appreciated during his own racing career.

Even if doing so in revolutionary numbers, however, we shall still require patience: **Honor A.P.** can hardly retain the attention of the "star counters" through his upcoming crops. Hats off, then, to the astute purchasers of the mare responsible for his flagship performer, who decided to send her back to him this spring. It was smart work to find her, in a digital sale for \$160,000; and smarter again, to perceive the upgrade she had received from a \$7,500 stallion.

Built for Speed

Yet another mare discarded at what proved the worst possible moment-and we seem to find these weekly-was Sea Garden (**Curlin**), picked up for \$40,000 at the 2022 Keeneland November Sale. Her son by **Hard Spun** was sold the following September for \$82,000 and, after a profitable pinhook cycle, subsequently emerged as Built (**Hard Spun**), winner of the **Gun Runner** Stakes and neck runner-up in the GIII Lecomte Stakes.

That sufficed for his dam to be cashed out back at Keeneland last November for \$600,000. Even that may turn out to be rather a bargain, however, with Built meanwhile discovering his true metier round a single turn. While not immediately building on his Fair Grounds track record, in March, last weekend he got it all stylishly together in the GII Alfred G. Vanderbilt Stakes.

We've previously noted the paucity of evidence under his first two dams: Sea Garden showed little in a light career, while her mother Navy Gardens (Storm Cat) was unraced and shared her fragility with nearly all her foals: the one exception being much to the credit of Street Cry (Ire), whose son Glenville Gardens assembled more wins (15-for-36) than the other six, collectively, did starts. He peaked in a Grade II over seven furlongs of

Woodbine turf, confirming speed as the family brand after Built's third dam Marley Vale (Forty Niner) dropped back to win the GI Test Stakes, having failed to get home in the GI Kentucky Oaks. Moreover the next dam, as a Listed winner over six, was one of few distinctions for her sire Hagley besides the European sprinter Committed.

Having devoted our first item to a stallion undervalued relative to his early efforts, we can only despair that one as unequivocally accomplished as **Hard Spun** should be down to just \$20,000. It's not as though he trades in dourness, having already had a Grade II winner over 5.5 furlongs this summer, and remember how he himself won the GI King's Bishop weeks after exhausting all bar **Street Sense** in the Derby.

Hard Spun-one of whose daughters has just made Shancelot a Grade I sire-remains the best value in the land to prove a mare. We've said all this before, but must now add that **War Front**'s recent retirement makes this horse our last direct link to the great Danzig. As the advertisers used to say: "Hurry while stocks last!"

Carried Across the Water

If this is a week to reiterate familiar prejudices, let me predictably draw attention to where Kalpana (GB) (Study Of Man {Ire}), winner of the best race staged in Europe this year, found her stamina. All four sires seeding her second generation were American-foaled, each with two American parents.

Moreover three of the four mares channelling these sires into the pedigree were also American. I can't say it often enough: those European horsemen who view dirt blood as

"one-dimensional" are laboring under a crass misapprehension. Dirt speed is speed that carries, and as such can fill the gaping hole of class lately created in the European gene pool by a local obsession with precocity.

The Americans themselves notoriously don't stage many races that call for a Kalpana, but the latest chapter in the wonderful Del Mar grass career of the 8-year-old Gold Phoenix (Ire) (Belardo {Ire}) should not be credited simply to a European sire (champion juvenile, then miler, now in Turkey).

For his latest wins, as indifferent to 14 furlongs as to nine, Gold Phoenix mined a genetic bedrock that is predominately American. For one thing, each side of his pedigree is pegged down by Nijinsky, responsible both for his own third dam and that of Belardo. Europeans like to claim Nijinsky, on account of his racing career, but his maternal line reached the U.S. in 1915; while that of his sire arrived in 1894. And in the foreground is damsire Mizzen Mast, by that wonderful influence Cozzene out of a mare tracing to Newstead Farm diamonds Mrs Peterkin/Legendra. An awful lot of Gold Phoenix's blood has simply been repatriated.

MATRIARCH OF PHIPPS STABLE ANDREA PHIPPS PASSES AWAY

Andrea (Ande) Phipps, the wife of Ogden Mills Phipps, the late, longtime chairman of The Jockey Club, died Tuesday in New York City after a short illness surrounded by her children, the family announced.

A release sent on behalf of the family reads as follows: She was the matriarch of the Phipps Stable and the co-owner and breeder of 2026 Kentucky Derby and Belmont Stakes winner Golden Tempo.

Among the graded stakes winners that ran exclusively for the Phipps Stable in the past 20 years were Smuggler, Good Reward, Pine Island, Persistently, Point of Entry, Boisterous, Imagining and Mr. Speaker. The Phipps Stable campaigned countless other stakes and graded stakes winners in various partnerships through the years.

Ande Phipps was a native of Oneonta, NY and she graduated from the University of Pennsylvania before pursuing a career as a registered nurse.

She is survived by six children: Kayce Reagan Hughes (Jim), Kelley Reagan Farish (Bill), Lilly Phipps Cardwell (John), Daisy Phipps Pulito (David), Samantha Phipps Alvarez (Matt), Ogden Phipps II (Ashley) as well as 24 grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

Ogden Mills (Dinny) Phipps passed away April 6, 2016.

A private celebration of Ande Phipps' life will be held at a later date.

Wembley Avenue is the maternal grandson of Unbridled Sidney, a crack turf sprinter from two decades ago best known today for the Derby week stakes named in her honor. But whereas she was a five-furlong speedball, this colt is a deep-closing router who has never raced on the grass. He rallied from 19 lengths back to break his maiden; last fall he was third in the GIII Grey Stakes in which Silent Tactic finished second.

The replacement dates are all Thursdays and Fridays, meaning Penn National will close out the season with two-date racing weeks.

The current schedule calls for Wednesday, Thursday and Friday racing to continue through Sept. 4. After a planned four-week break, that three-date weekly schedule resumes Oct. 7 through Nov. 20.

After one date of racing on Wednesday, Nov. 25 during the Thanksgiving holiday week, the December makeup dates start eight days later, on Dec. 3.

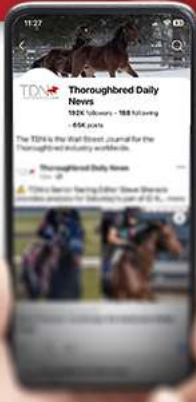

Coolmore's G1 St Leger hero **Scandinavia** (*Justify*) collected a first elite-level victory in last year's renewal of Goodwood's G1 Al Shaqab Goodwood Cup and repeated the dose, at the expense of the unlucky-in-running **Trawlerman** (Golden Horn), to become Aidan O'Brien's third dual winner of the two-mile marathon.

"Scandinavia is a great horse and a real, real top stayer," said O'Brien after the four-year-old added to the dual wins of Yeats and Kyrios. "He has a big cruising speed and relaxes when he finds his rhythm. Ryan [Moore] said that the minute he started asking, he felt him coming alive underneath him. We felt he was really going the right way after [Royal] Ascot and the Goodwood Cup is a very prestigious race to win. It is great that Trawlerman came and all the horses were there. It is what we always want to see, win, lose or draw. The plan was that we thought Trawlerman would make the running and Ryan was just going to follow him, like he did at Ascot. That is what we thought and that is the way it played out." [Cont. p3](#)

He said, "There was a little bit of drama, I think Trawlerman was a little slowly away and there was a loose horse. It was one of those eventful races. It was great though, Goodwood is a great track and I think it was a great spectacle to watch. There was so much happening in a race like that and, over two miles, you get a great chance to look at it and take it all in."

Looking ahead, the trainer continued, "He is very sound, he loves what he is doing and I think the lads love having a horse like that. When you get a horse who can race year-in-year-out, with the ability he has, that is what makes it very special. They are very hard to find, nearly impossible, but when they come along the lads love it and I would imagine he will race for as long as he is able to stay safe and sound. He is a very high cruiser, very natural and easy to train. He has a great rhythm and loves what he does. He has a great mind and he is by **Justify**, so he has that big rhythm."

Moore added, "I spoke to Aidan and he said it is probably as good a staying performance as he has ever seen. I never asked him for everything either and it was nice for him to have a horse to follow all the way. His stride never shortened, he just kept galloping all the way to the line and he has an unbelievable race record now. He could not have done any more than he did today. He likes fast ground, he is a high-class horse and

hopefully there are a few more good days to come."

The 6-5 favourite, who outbattled Trawlerman in a pulsating finish to last month's G1 Gold Cup at Royal Ascot, occupied a stalking role in third after **Amiloc** (Postponed) had unshipped Hector Crouch leaving the stalls. Improving into second nearing halfway as Trawlerman set the tempo up front, he was hustled along with a half-mile remaining.

With Trawlerman's impetus halted by the loose Amiloc in the straight, Scandinavia surged ahead approaching the quarter-mile pole and extended clear in style to defeat his old foe by 8 1/2 lengths, with **Rahiebb** (**Frankel**) faring best of the remainder 3/4-of-a-length back in third.

Reflecting on the runner-up's interrupted passage, William Buick commented, "It was significant, but it is hard to say how significant. Trawlerman is a Gold Cup winner, so he stays and he was just going through the gears down the hill. To try and outmanoeuvre or manoeuvre around a loose horse is never easy and my worry obviously was that if I found myself on his outside, we could give away a lot of ground and end up on the stands' side. I went the short route and he only got in the way at the most important part of the race. It definitely had an effect and it's unfortunate. I know the winner won well on the day, but on a horse like Trawlerman in a staying race, when you get hampered at that stage it is obviously never ideal. He has run a super race considering." John Gosden added, "It was a messy race, he got interfered with early and then the pace early was quite strong. He got into a nice rhythm down the hill and I noticed Ryan was beginning to ride on Scandinavia. The loose horse came back and visited us again and, once you check and lose your rhythm, that's it in any race, let alone when you're finding a rhythm over that trip. That is life and that's racing. When you've been crossed like that and checked, he's not the type to turn around and start quickening. He has to build it up, which he was, but that's the way it is. We got the worst of it and we went from being a length-and-a-half in front to a length-and-a-half behind."

Roger Varian was not too downcast with the performance of Rahiebb and said, "The race did not set up too well for us because it got a bit messy and they did not go very quick, but he ran well. He got locked away at the wrong time off a steady gallop and the two big horses got first run. I am not suggesting it stopped us from winning, but I think it probably stopped us from finishing second. He got the trip well, which I was pleased about, and I would not rule out going further again with him. Watching him today, all he looked like he was doing was staying and you cannot judge it on one run. He will likely go to York [for the G2

Yorkshire Cup] and we will also look at the [G1] Irish St Leger. Next year he will be a stronger horse and I would not rule out going beyond two miles again. He looked a stayer today and I think he will keep getting better."

Pedigree Notes

Scandinavia, one of his sire's 11 Group/Grade 1 winners, is the sixth of nine foals and one of three winners out of an unraced sibling of eight black-type performers headed by multiple Group 1-winning sire Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat).

He is a half-brother to G1 Prix Saint-Alary victrix Above The Curve (**American Pharoah**), the dual Group 3-placed Thinking Of You (**American Pharoah**), a two-year-old colt by **No Nay Never**, a yearling filly by **Siyouni** and a weanling filly by Wootton Bassett.

His dam Fabulous (Galileo) was bred back to **Justify** this year.

Galileo-sired descendants of his second dam Mariah's Storm (Rahy), herself kin to Group 1-placed sire Panoramic (Rainbow Quest), include sires **Gleneagles**, Decorated Knight and Taj Mahal, Classic heroines Marvellous and Joan Of Arc, multiple Group 1-winning distaffer Happily and elite-level performers Vatican City, Coolmore and Toy.

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'THIS MEANS EVERYTHING': KAIYA FRASER SHINES ON VINTAGE WINNER DR RASCAL

It wasn't Ryan Moore or William Buick's name next to the winner of the Qatar Goodwood Festival's first black-type race of the week, but the little-known Kaiya Fraser as he steered **Dr Rascal** (Sottsass) to success in the G2 Vintage Stakes.

Two-for-two entering this seven-furlong test, Charlie and Julia Rosier's homebred was always travelling strongly tracking the leaders early. [Cont. p6](#)

Sent up a narrow gap on the far rail approaching the furlong pole, the 13-2 shot subdued Ballydoyle's **Haffner** (**Justify**) soon after for a half-length success with the 5-4 favourite **Al Hudaiba** (Dark Angel) a short head away in third.

"It's a great day and I'm very happy to get the job done for Charlie and Julia Rosier--this means everything," the 23-year-old Fraser said. "It's what we wake up for every morning. The gap was just wide enough for me to go through and I knew how much horse I had underneath me. He was brave enough to go and do what I asked him to do."

The winner hails from the famous Whatcombe stable of Oliver Cole, whose father Paul was once a big name at Glorious Goodwood and had trained the winner of this three times. "He's a very good horse and I have a lot of faith in him, so I wasn't that nervous beforehand," the trainer said. "Kaiya is a very capable jockey and he was very relaxed before the race. We haven't used him that much, but you're in safe hands with him."

"He's a very fast horse, classy and pretty uncomplicated and we'd done stalls work at home because he got loose before his last race at Ascot. We'll give him a bit of a break now and we'll probably look at the Dewhurst, that's his ultimate target. The Breeders' Cup is a possible, unless he does well in the Dewhurst in which case he'll be trained for the 2,000 Guineas--that's the big dream."

"We are very lucky to have him in our stable and in my first complete year as a trainer, this means a lot," he added. "It is not just me--there is a big group at home who work so hard and I am very proud of all of them."

Charlie Appleby said of Al Hudaiba, who comes out as the moral winner carrying a three-pound penalty for his Superlative win, "Will [Buick] did say at Newmarket that he felt the ground

was quick enough and he said coming down the hill here that he could feel it. You are always a bit wary when you start getting into the battle, but in fairness to the horse he rallied really well. He had the penalty against a couple of unexposed horses who had broken their maidens and were stepping up to Stakes level. I don't think he lost too much in defeat and we were pleased with his attitude. He is the sort of horse we might just go travelling with."

Pedigree Notes

Dr Rascal is the second of two current foals out of the unraced Litte Miss Rascal (Zoffany), with the first being the useful filly Miss Rascal (Havana Gold) who ran only three times with an impressive win followed by a fifth in the Queen Mary. The second dam is Hibiscus (Galileo), a Listed-placed full-sister to the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf winner Line Of Duty who produced the Group 3 winner Queen Of Hawaii (**Kingman**) and Group 3-placed Up And Under (Lope De Vega).

The third dam is Jacqueline Quest (Rock Of Gibraltar), who was controversially demoted from first in the 1,000 Guineas and who was also responsible for Galileo's Group 3 scorer and Prix de l'Opera runner-up Jackie Oh and the dual Listed winner Onassis (Dubawi) who was also second in the Oak Tree Stakes here.

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HOW A BOOZY LUNCH LED TO VINTAGE SUCCESS FOR GIANT-KILLING OWNER-BREEDERS

With the massed ranks of Coolmore, Godolphin and Amo Racing in behind, owner-breeder Julia Rosier and her son Charlie sealed the dream of a lifetime to have a major winner at their local track during Glorious Goodwood.

The Rosiers bred Dr Rascal from their unraced Zoffany mare Little Miss Rascal, a purchase Charlie said was made "in the pub in Waterloo after a few beers, after a boozy client lunch". It is already looking like a shrewd decision, even if it wasn't made with the clearest of heads.

He continued, "She was in training with Tom Ward but she never ran for us and we decided to make her into a mare when we decided to go over to the breeding side. Her first foal was Miss Rascal, who came fifth in the Queen Mary and sadly never raced again. It was very exciting. Now we've got Dr Rascal, who's by probably the most unsexy stallion that there is in Sottsass. I think we've got the fastest Sottsass ever."

Sottsass, who left Coolmore for Japan's Shizunai Stallion Station two years ago, may be "unsexy" from a commercial viewpoint but he did win an Arc and a Prix du Jockey Club - ironically in the colours of Peter Brant, which were also carried by Dr Rascal's runner-up Haffner (*Justify*). And from an owner-breeder's point of view, the commercial acceptability of a sire matters not a jot if he can get you a racehorse. In the unbeaten G2 Coral Vintage Stakes winner Dr Rascal, the Rosiers look to have a high-calibre colt on their hands.

"They wanted to buy him yesterday," said Julia Rosier, shaking her head at the idea of the unidentified buyer attempting to whisk her dream horse away from her.

"It's so exciting because I've been a member of Goodwood for years and I've always wanted to breed a horse who would do well here. And I have actually had a lot of horses but not one like this."

The Rosiers keep their five broodmares at Trinity Park Stud and were full of praise for Becky Marsh, who runs the stud.

"Ever since this horse was born, Becky has been saying that he is something special," Julia added.

Bloodstock agent Matt Coleman is also involved in the Rosiers' breeding operation and said, "They turned down some serious money for the horse after Ascot but ever since I've known Julia all she has ever said is that she wants to have a winner at Glorious Goodwood."

As well as Dr Rascal's trainer Oliver Cole, the Rosiers have their nine horses in training split between George Boughey, George Scott and Jack Morland in Newmarket, with their homebreds all carrying the 'Rascal' tag in their names.

Dr Rascal has now won all three of his starts, including after he got loose at Ascot when jockey Kaiya Fraser was dragged to the ground in the teeth of a rival horse behind the stalls. Cole indicated that he will look to the G1 Dewhurst Stakes with the great grandson of Jacqueline Quest (Rock Of Gibraltar), who finished first past the post in the 1,000 Guineas of 2010 only to be demoted to second in the stewards' room. At stud, her five black-type performers include Godolphin's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf winner Line Of Duty (Galileo), a full-brother to Dr Rascal's granddam Hibiscus.

Charlie Rosier added, "My mum and I have been doing this for a long time together. It's very emotional for us actually. It's magical."

It's also a good excuse for another boozy lunch.

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LAKE FOREST SWOOPS FOR LENNOX TRIUMPH

Tony Bloom and Ian McAleavy's **Lake Forest** (*No Nay Never*) was doing his best work at the business end of last month's G1 Queen Elizabeth II Jubilee Stakes and, faced with an easier task in Tuesday's G2 HKJC World Pool Lennox Stakes at Goodwood, bettered his runner-up finish in last year's renewal to secure a second win at Group 2 level.

"We thought there would be lots of pace and there was not, so I thought Lake Forest ran really well," said Maureen Haggas. "He is a totally different horse since being gelded and it is extraordinary what a difference that can make. He has always been a talented horse, but you could never have called him consistent because he was absolutely brilliant one day, whereas the next day he just could not be bothered. It seems to have made him more consistent and that is great." [Cont. p8](#)

Looking ahead to having a pop at Wednesday's G1 Sussex Stakes, she added, "The owners are up for it and we have plenty of time to decide. He has got nothing until York and does not have to do any travelling. He is pretty laid back, so unless something happens overnight, I would imagine that is the plan. If he is okay, why not? We have done it once or twice a year and we did it with a filly the other night. She was second on both runs, but definitely ran better the second night. Martin Pipe always said if you run them on consecutive days, they always run better the second time. If you have a day in between, not so much."

Winning rider Cieren Fallon reflected, "The expected pace did not happen, so it was Plan B. It is not ideal, but when you are riding a horse of this calibre, you can change your tactics just like that. They did not go much of a gallop and he was in a position where I had to commit a long way out, which was not ideal. He is a horse that likes to be covered up and get there as late as possible, but in a race of this stature, with it being so tricky, I could not sit there and wait for a gap because it can just close like that. I had to peel him out down the middle of the track and, as you can see, he does not really do a stroke, which I suppose is not a bad thing with tomorrow in mind. Things did not go according to plan, but he got the job done, which is pleasing."

The 2023 G2 Gimcrack and 2024 Golden Eagle hero was helped up behind a moderate tempo in seventh until beyond halfway. Coming under pressure approaching the quarter-mile marker, he quickened into second entering the final furlong and kept on rolling to subdue last year's winner **Witness Stand** (Expert Eye) and withstand the late surge of Royal Hunt Cup winner **Rogue Diplomat** (Calyx) by neck.

Witness Stand kept on well once headed and finished 3/4-of-a-length back in third, a head in front of last term's G1 Sussex

Stakes victor **Qirat** (Showcasing).

Runner-up Rogue Diplomat's trainer James Owen commented, "He is a lovely horse, he was our first Royal Ascot winner, and it was punchy coming here, but he had been working well. I would have loved the ground to have been a little easier because it would have really played to his strengths, as he is the sort of seven-furlong-to-one-mile horse who comes home strong. He gets on exceptionally well with Harry [Davies], who gave him a great ride. I think we will give him a little break now and then head for the [G1 Prix de la] Forêt and probably on to Champions Day for the mile [G1 Queen Elizabeth II Stakes] race. He has been busy, he ran in the Lincoln, and I am keen to let him develop. He's a lovely horse for next season as well. It is great for a syndicate to have a horse like this and I think he is a proper Group 1 horse in time."

Jamie Insole, co-trainer of Witness Stand, said, "He loves the track and I thought he had nicked it. The ground was maybe a bit quicker today than last year and perhaps that found him out a little, helping the closers. He has run a brilliant race and I am delighted. Lake Forest is a seriously good horse, so I think the form is there for everyone to see."

Lake Forest is one of 10 scorers from as many runners for G3 Sirenia Stakes third Lady Aquitaine (El Prado), herself a half-sister to the stakes-winning dam of four black-type performers headed by dual Group 1-winning sire Roderic O'Connor (Galileo).

The winner, one of his sire's 49 pattern-race scorers, is a half-brother to GIII Cardinal Stakes winner Star Fortress ([Sea The Stars](#)), the dual Group-placed Listed Derby du Languedoc victrix Lady Of Kyushu (Smart Strike), stakes winner Clint Maroon (Oasis Dream) and a two-year-old colt by Ghaiyyath.

Descendants of his dam also include G3 Prix Fille de l'Air victrix Higher Leaves (Golden Horn), GIII Honeymoon Stakes winner Selenia (Sea The Moon) and the four-time Group 2-placed Do Or Do Not (Space Blues).

TOP-LEVEL WINNERS MO TOWN AND TWAIN PURCHASED BY TURKISH JOCKEY CLUB

The Turkish Jockey Club has bolstered its stallion ranks with a pair of new arrivals for 2027, with **Mo Town** on the move from Coolmore's Ashford Stud in America and **Twain** set to kick off his

stallion career in the country following his retirement from racing.

Mo Town, the winner of the GI Hollywood Derby in 2017, has been based at Ashford Stud since 2019 and is the sire of 20 individual stakes winners. They are headed by Mystic Lake, whose 13 career victories include the GII Charles Town Oaks and GII Inside Information Stakes, along with Play The Music, who was Canada's champion female sprinter in 2024 when her wins included the GIII Royal North Stakes and GIII Whimsical Stakes.

The 12-year-old **Mo Town** is by Uncle Mo and out of the winning Bernardini mare Grazie Mille, whose other notable progeny include the multiple stakes winner and GII Chandelier Stakes third Justique ([Justify](#)). Grazie Mille, in turn, is out of the GIII Thoroughbred Club of America Stakes scorer Molto Vita (Carson City), who was also placed at the top level on two occasions.

Meanwhile, Wootton Bassett colt Twain is one of six winners out of the G2 Rockfel Stakes heroine Wading (Montjeu), who is herself out of the G3 Blue Wind Stakes runner-up Cherry Hinton (Green Desert). A daughter of the legendary Urban Sea (Miswaki), Cherry Hinton can count both Galileo and [Sea The Stars](#) among her illustrious siblings.

Trained by Aidan O'Brien, Twain was an unbeaten two-year-old, having won the G1 Criterium International at Saint-Cloud just eight days after making a successful debut at Leopardstown. He made only one subsequent appearance on a racecourse when returning from 18 months on the sidelines with a fifth-place finish in April's G3 Alleged Stakes at the Curragh.

SHADWELL'S CLASSIC HEROINE GHANAATI DIES AT 20

Ghanaati (Giant's Causeway), who memorably won both the 1,000 Guineas and Coronation Stakes in 2009, has died at the age of 20.

The Shadwell homebred was trained by Barry Hills to win three of her six starts, having also won a Kempton maiden by six lengths when making her second appearance on a racecourse at two. She then returned the following year to cause a 20-1 upset in the 1,000 Guineas, before proving that her Newmarket win was no fluke when producing an even more striking display to follow up in the Coronation Stakes at Royal Ascot. One of the leading fillies of her generation, she went on to finish third in the G1 Sussex Stakes at Goodwood and second in the G1 Sun Chariot Stakes back at Newmarket.

A granddaughter of Shadwell's hugely influential Height Of Fashion, Ghanaati herself produced seven winners from as many runners after retiring to the paddocks, including the three-time Group 2 winner Mutasaabeq (Invincible Spirit), G3 Mahab Al Shimaal hero Wafy (Dubawi) and Royal Hunt Cup scorer Afaak (Oasis Dream).

Paying tribute to the daughter of Giant's Causeway, Shadwell's racing manager Angus Gold said, "Ghanaati was a fabulous race mare who gave us two special days in the spring and summer of 2009, winning the 1,000 Guineas in impressive fashion on her first start and then going on to Royal Ascot where she showed she had improved by blitzing the Coronation Stakes on the day that Barry Hills was released from hospital after a lengthy spell of illness.

"As a granddaughter of Height Of Fashion she was particularly close to Sheikh Hamdan's heart, and his family were very sad to hear of her death, and we will always remember her as a top-class miler and an outstanding Guineas winner."

SEVEN NEW ZEALAND RACECOURSES FACE CLOSURE UNDER PROJECT STAMINA PLAN

New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing (NZTR), Harness Racing New Zealand (HRNZ) and TAB NZ have unveiled Project Stamina, an independent review recommending a significant reduction in the country's racing venue network, with future investment focused on fewer, better-resourced facilities.

The report found the industry had become "over-venued and under-capitalised," with infrastructure no longer aligned to horse populations, participant numbers and wagering demand.

Under the proposed One Equine View strategy, 39 venues would remain in the national network, while five, including Te Rapa and the Cambridge Synthetic track, would undergo further business case assessments.

Nineteen other venues have been recommended to exit the network, including the thoroughbred racecourses at Rotorua and Trentham.

Prepared by consultancy RCP following more than 50 workshops with clubs and industry participants, the blueprint is designed to improve race-day reliability, training infrastructure and long-term sustainability by concentrating investment on key venues.

"This is about ensuring New Zealand racing has the infrastructure it needs to thrive for decades to come," said NZTR chairman Russell Warwick. "Project Stamina provides a clear, evidence-based roadmap that puts the long-term interests of the industry first, while keeping the welfare of the horse at the centre of the network."

Warwick added, "Doing nothing is not an option. Our infrastructure must reflect today's racing landscape and be capable of supporting future growth."

HRNZ chairman Grant Jarrold described the report as "a unified direction that links strategy, investment and implementation, giving the industry greater certainty about the future."

NZTR and HRNZ emphasized that Project Stamina does not trigger immediate venue closures, with consultation to take place with affected clubs before any final decisions are made.

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ONE STRIPE RETIRED TO RIDGEMONT STUD IN SOUTH AFRICA AFTER INJURY

Dual Grade 1 hero **One Stripe** (One World) has been retired due to injury to Ridgemont Stud in South Africa for stallion duty, the *Sporting Post* reported on Monday. One Stripe was diagnosed with a stress-related injury to his right foreleg after a veterinary assessment last week.

"It goes without saying that everybody involved is very disappointed," said Hollywood racing manager Anthony Delpech. "One Stripe deserved to have won a Group 1 in America, but he nevertheless still made us all proud. His performances again showed that quality SA-bred horses can compete internationally. Graham Motion did a fantastic job with him and is world-class."

Bred by Drakenstein Stud, One Stripe raced in the colours of Hollywood Racing and Rikesh Sewgoolam. A winner of both the G1 Cape Guineas and G1 King's Plate in South Africa, he traveled to the U.S. and was placed in the barn of Graham Motion beginning last autumn. For Motion, he won a Gulfstream contest, before finishing second by a neck in the GI Pegasus World Cup Turf Invitational Stakes in January. Later this year, he added a second in the GI Maker's Mark Mile Stakes at Keeneland and a third in the GI Manhattan Stakes at Saratoga on June 6. He retires with a mark of 15-7-3-1 and earnings of \$666,038.

"I was fortunate enough to witness One Stripe's outstanding victory in the 2025 L'Ormarins Gr1 King's Plate before he joined our stable later that year," Graham Motion told the publication. "Once he adapted to the demands of American racing, he produced a tremendous performance to finish a close second in the GI Pegasus and continued to improve throughout the season. Sadly, I don't believe we got to see the very best of him. He was as tough as they come."
