SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y. - By Mike Repole's count, it was going to be a party of 55 at the Jim Dandy celebration dinner at Nove Restaurant Saturday night. Maybe add 20 or so hangers-on who became honorary Repole groupies during a day that the owner won four races.

The biggest, of course, was the \$500,000 GII Jim Dandy Stakes when **Renegade** (Into Mischief) came out of left field with a furious rally to win by a half-neck for jockey Irad Ortiz Jr.

That set off a wild celebration that would last well into the night.

"There is a big bill handed to me every night," Repole, his slick Queens accent working overdrive following the Jim Dandy. "If I go to dinner, I pay for the food, you pay for the wine."

Then a laugh and some back pounding, maybe a high-five or 10.

Repole was excited after Renegade came from nowhere to win the Jim Dandy and establish himself as a bona fide contender for the \$1.25-million GI Travers Stakes on Aug. 29. He was stoked for Renegade and Ortiz, and he was especially ecstatic for his trainer and good friend Todd Pletcher, who visited the winner's circle five times on Saturday.

JOCKEY CLUB TO CONVENE ROUND TABLE AS DOBSON MARKS FIRST LAP AS CHAIR

Everett Dobson will have a platform to assess his first year as Chair of The Jockey Club when he presides at its annual Round Table Conference on Matters Pertaining to Racing, in Saratoga Springs, Aug. 6.

In his inaugural address at last year's conference, Dobson said his top priority was to grow the sport and stem decline in the foal crop, field sizes, the fan base, wagering on races, and the potential loss of "some of our most important racetracks, particularly in regions of the country that are deemed to be important to the overall health of the sport."

Right out of the gate as chair one year ago, Dobson surprised breeders when he declared that The Jockey Club would revisit a cap to limit the number of mares bred by a stallion in a year.

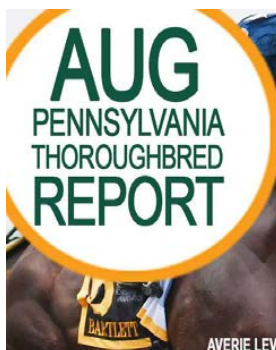

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Pletcher Knows Repold is an Excitable Guy (cont. from p1)

Pletcher, who started the summer in a Saratoga funk (three wins in his first 22 starts), entered Saturday's card with 12 wins in 48 starts and just three away from career win No. 6,000. Repole was much more excited about Pletcher's day than the Hall of Famer.

"On a scale of zero to 10, [he is] 2,000," Pletcher, the master of the dead pan said.

Pletcher could have been doing cartwheels, but that is not his way. He takes everything in stride, always has, always will.

"You go through a losing streak, and you go through winning streaks, you have to try and maintain an even keel," Pletcher, who has won a record 15 Saratoga training titles, said. "I don't know if I am jumping around inside, but I am feeling pretty good."

Pletcher also won five races in one day during the 2004 season.

He will spend the next four weeks working on Renegade to give him his fourth Travers win. His other three--Flower Alley (2005), Stay Thirsty (2011) and **Fierceness** (2024)--also won the Jim Dandy. Stay Thirsty and **Fierceness** were owned by Repole.

Repole co-owns Renegade with Robert and Lawana Low. In the Travers, the team will get a rematch with **Golden Tempo** (**Curlin**), who beat Renegade by a neck in the GI Kentucky Derby and 5 1/4 lengths (he was third) in the GI Belmont Stakes.

Pletcher was confident his horse would benefit from the eight weeks between the June 6 Belmont Stakes and the Jim Dandy. He had five weeks between the Kentucky Derby and Belmont and Pletcher said Renegade was almost there, but not quite.

Before the Jim Dandy, he saw the same Renegade he did before he blitzed the GI Arkansas Derby by four lengths in late March.

"I am looking forward to the Travers, whoever is in there," Pletcher said, sidestepping the question of whether he was looking forward to a rematch with Golden Tempo.

Repole was a little blunter.

"He is back," he said about Renegade. "I think he will be the favorite in the Travers. I wish the Travers was next week."

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Repole continued, “The best 3-year-old in the country right now is Golden Tempo; how can you say he’s not? We will get our shot in the Travers, and we’ll see what happens.”

DeVaux Looking Forward to the Next Race

A couple hours after **Golden Tempo** (**Curlin**) had his second Saratoga work on the main track Sunday morning, his trainer Cherie DeVaux stood outside her office at the Oklahoma Training Track and the conversation inevitably drifted to Aug. 29.

That’s the day of the \$1.25-million GI Travers Stakes and the next scheduled start for Golden Tempo, the hero of the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Belmont Stakes. What is looming is a much-anticipated showdown between DeVaux’s horse and **Renegade** (Into Mischief), the breathtaking winner of Saturday’s \$500,000 GII Jim Dandy Stakes.

DeVaux was at Colonial Downs in Virginia Saturday where she saddled **Supercharger** (**Constitution**) to victory in the \$500,000 GII Secretariat Stakes. She was able to see the Jim Dandy.

“I thought Renegade ran a great race,” DeVaux said. “We have faced him twice and we’ve come out on top. It was good to see him back and winning.”

And now the countdown to Golden Tempo-Renegade III.

“It’s something that gets everyone excited and engaged,” she said. “For us in the industry, it’s fun, a good opportunity for everyone to get out there and pick a side and have a vested interest, even if they are not betting.”

Owned by Phipps Stable and St Elias Stable, Golden Tempo worked four furlongs in :47.67 (9/149) with jockey Jose Ortiz aboard. He worked in company with 3-year-old stablemate Stirring Words, who was piloted

by Ameth Gonzalez.

Rodriguez Changes Mind, Phileas Fogg will Skip Whitney

Less than a week ago, trainer Gus Rodriguez was pumped up to see his 6-year-old **Phileas Fogg** (Astern {Aus}) run in the \$1-million GI Whitney Stakes on Saturday.

Six days away from the race, Rodriguez has pumped the brakes and decided the Whitney is out.

Instead, Rodriguez will wait until the \$1-million GI Jockey Club Gold Cup at the new Belmont Park's opening day on Sept. 18.

“We looked at everything and decided we wanted more time for the horse,” Rodriguez said at his barn at the Oklahoma Training Track Sunday morning. “I think the last race took a lot out of him.”

The last race was a 10-length romp in the GII Suburban Stakes, an effort that earned him a Beyer Speed figure of 107.

“Usually, when they run a race like that kind of race, I like to give them a month or two months,” Rodriguez said. “More time is better.”

It made sense to try the Whitney because the horse, Rodriguez said, was doing well and he has always liked Saratoga. In five career starts at the Spa, he has three wins. The more he thought about it and the more he discussed it with owner Steve Shapiro of Jupiter Stable, the more it made sense to wait.

“He would be running against the best of the best,” Rodriguez said, referring to Whitney runners such as Magnitude (**Not This Time**), Sovereignty (Into Mischief), Baeza (**McKinzie**), White Abarrio (Race Day) and the champion filly Nitrogen (Medaglia d'Oro). “He's ok and everything looks good; we just thought it would be better to wait.”

Now that he is out of the Whitney, Rodriguez can play handicapper and give his pick. The winner will be ...

"[Steve] Asmussen," he said, selecting Magnitude. "That horse has beat everybody."

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RENEGADE CLOSES FAST, BUT CAN HE LAST AT 10 FURLONGS?

Renegade (Into Mischief) delivered a half-length victory in the GII Jim Dandy Stakes Saturday, and while his 98 Beyer Speed Figure and win over the Saratoga surface are positive attributes heading into the Aug. 29 GI Travers Stakes, the jury is still out on whether this hard-charging closer who finishes with an arresting visual flourish can excel beyond nine furlongs against deeper competition.

Bettors got a slight (yet significant) bargain if they took Renegade's 1.36-1 odds over the favored 1.19-1 price on Commandment, with those two Triple Crown rivals completing **an Into Mischief-sired exacta**.

Chip Honcho (Connect) was intent to make the lead inside of **Silent Tactic** (**Tacitus**) into the first turn of the nine-furlong Jim Dandy, while Renegade broke fluidly, but was allowed to settle into a comfortable position under Irad Ortiz Jr., which for this colt means spotting the leaders 10 or 12 lengths down the backside.

Silent Tactic got first run on the faltering Chip Honcho at the five-sixteenths pole, but was immediately accosted by the stalking, blinkers-on Commandment.

All the while Renegade--a homebred for Robert and Lawana Low owned in partnership with Repole Stable--was uncoiling from next-to-last in the five-horse field and building serious momentum, incrementally closing the gap while freewheeling into the lane.

Commandment came over the top three-sixteenths out. But with Renegade looming and shifting course to his outside, Commandment's decent-enough move looked destined to be labeled "premature" even as Renegade still had four lengths to make up approaching the eighth pole.

Renegade's ultra-confident body language and unmatched deep-stretch torque foretold the difference, and this Todd Pletcher trainee mowed down Commandment without any credible threat from the three remaining stragglers in the splintered field.

Renegade's final time of 1:49.08 was the second-fastest Jim Dandy in the last decade, with only **Epicenter**'s 1:48.99 in 2022 fractionally faster.

That's noteworthy, considering the last five editions of the Jim Dandy have been won by either prior or eventual Eclipse Award recipients, including the 2-year-old champs **Fierceness** and **Forte**, the 3-year-old champs **Sovereignty** and **Epicenter**, plus **Essential Quality**, who was champion in both his juvenile and sophomore seasons.

But in terms of Jim Dandy numbers, the one that stands out for Renegade is his final eighth, clocked in :12.25.

All season long, Renegade's late-race prowess has been backed by fast-finishing fractions that have established him well ahead of his peers in that statistical category.

In the Feb. 7 1 1/16-mile Sam F. Davis Stakes at Tampa, which was both Renegade's sophomore debut and maiden-breaking win (after having been DQ'd at Aqueduct in October), his final sixteenth after circling the field from way off the tailgate was timed in :5.97.

For perspective, that ended up being the fastest among 19 points-awarding Derby prep stakes at that distance in 2025-26.

In his following start, the Mar. 28 GI Arkansas Derby, after a couple of back-of-pack momentum stalls, Renegade blasted off five wide through the far turn and romped away with a devastating turn of foot, soaring home solo through a final furlong in :11.84.

No other nine-furlong Derby qualifying prep in at least the last four years has produced a sub-12-second final furlong.

Counting six other dirt graded stakes for 3-year-olds at 1 1/8 miles that have been run in 2026 since the Arkansas Derby (including three Grade I races--the Blue Grass, Santa Anita Derby and Haskell), Renegade's :12.25 final eighth in the Jim Dandy means he now owns the two fastest closing furlongs in nine-furlong stakes for sophomores this season.

But is 1 1/8 miles Renegade's sweet spot, or the upper limit of his staying power?

In his two losses at 1 1/4 miles--the GI Kentucky Derby and the GI Belmont Stakes--Renegade was in it to win it until the sixteenth pole, but got overtaken by **Golden Tempo** (**Curlin**) both times.

Renegade's runner-up try in the Derby would have been good enough to win the first leg of the Triple Crown in most years, especially considering the trouble he overcame. Soon after breaking alertly from the historically disadvantageous inside post (now winless in 41 years), Renegade got crushed by chain-reaction crowding. Yet he recovered in unfazed fashion, settled near the back of the 18-horse pack, and rode the rail until Ortiz edged him out three-eighths from home.

Renegade seemed poised to pounce, but Ortiz had to keep floating ever wider to extricate the colt from heavy traffic. Parked way out in the 10 path, he blasted off, then bumped repeatedly with a tiring rival between the three-sixteenths and eighth poles.

Power-shifting into a higher gear to confront the on-rushing **Golden Tempo**, those two brushed in the final half-furlong, but Renegade was outkicked in the closing strides.

The Belmont Stakes wasn't as much of an exclamation-point effort for Renegade, even though he did get more or less his preferred trip as the 1.75-1 favorite. He settled third from last, advanced inside while repeatedly splitting horses starting at the half-mile marker, then turned for home in the six path with both **Golden Tempo** and **Commandment** farther outside.

Renegade appeared capable of surging to the front a furlong out. But by the sixteenth pole, both rivals had peeled off while Renegade came untethered, checking in third, 5 1/4 lengths behind **Golden Tempo** and **Commandment**.

It's also legit to question the quality of competition in those races at 1 1/16 miles and 1 1/8 miles where Renegade finished phenomenally fast.

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The horses he beat in the Davis Stakes and Arkansas Derby have gone a collective 2-for-32 over the last six months.

And in the Jim Dandy, Commandment was Renegade's only A-list peer. Silent Tactic and Chip Honcho have yet to win beyond the Grade III level. **Asked and Answered** ([Tapit](#)), last all the way around the track, is a seven-start maiden.

A rematch with Golden Tempo in the Travers is likely, and the Oct. 31 GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Keeneland will be circled on Renegade's calendar if his connections hope to attain the sophomore divisional championship and/or Horse of the Year honors.

But both of those stakes are at 10 furlongs, and the cast of characters will soon expand to include older horses.

Renegade's best shot will be for his end-of-season run to match the pattern of his individual races: The plot will thicken, and his cadence must quicken.

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TRAVERS, PENNSYLVANIA DERBY POSSIBLE FOR COMMANDMENT

Wathnan Racing's **Commandment** (Into Mischief) exited his runner-up effort in the GI Jim Dandy Stakes Saturday in fine shape and connections are mulling a pair of options for the colt's next start.

"I love the way he came out of the race, super pleased with him this morning," trainer Brad Cox said Sunday. "His energy was good and he cooled out well last night. Everything was very positive with him."

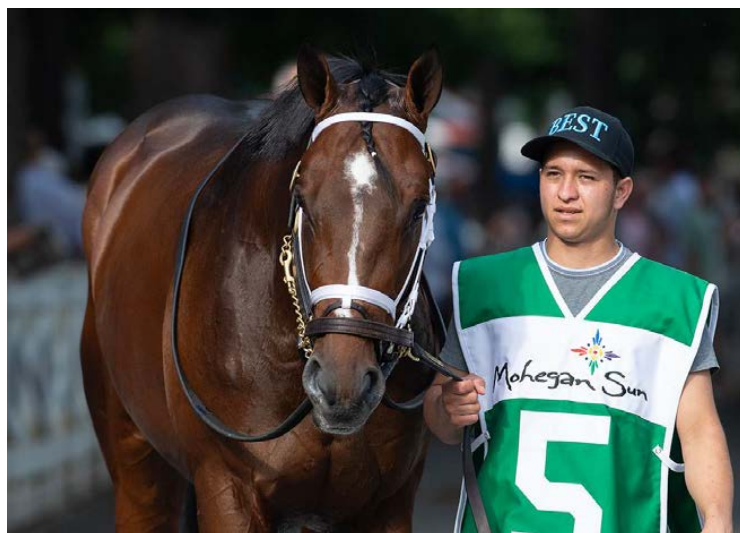
Cox added, "I don't know about the [Aug. 29 GI] Travers. We'll make a decision when we feel like we need to, but it will probably be a decision between that and the [Sept. 19 GI] P.A. Derby."

Commandment was wearing blinkers for the first time when he finished a half-length second to deep-closing Renegade (Into Mischief) in the Jim Dandy.

"Talking to the jockey [Flavien Prat] after the race, he said turning for home after he made the lead, he was just waiting and didn't want to kick clear," Cox said. "He brought him over to feel the pressure of Silent Tactic and he responded, but he never saw or felt the pressure of Renegade until he got by. Once he got by, he said he reengaged and went after him, and you can see that in the replay. It was a game effort. I'm proud of the effort. Unfortunately, we didn't come out on the right end."

Cox said he doesn't believe the blinkers were a factor in Commandment not seeing the charge of the Irad Ortiz, Jr.-piloted Renegade.

"He doesn't wear a lot of blinker, so I don't want to blame it on that," Cox said. "I think Irad probably did a good job of keeping his horse outside and not running up near us and getting us game and competitive again."

Cox said Commandment will likely keep the blinkers on moving forward. "I like how he traveled in them and I thought it was a good effort," Cox said.

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HASKELL WINNER BABY VINO EYEING

TRAVERS by Bill Finley

GI Haskell Stakes winner **Baby Vino** (Vino Rosso) will make his next start in the Aug. 29 GI Travers Stakes at Saratoga, trainer Lindsay Schultz confirmed. The decision was made after Baby Vino returned to the work tab Saturday at Monmouth Park, where he breezed four furlongs in :49.20.

Schultz had also been considering the GI Pennsylvania Derby.

"Right now, the plan is to go to the Travers. He went very easy in the work, worked well and came out of it good," Schultz said. "He has time for two more works between now and the Travers, so it sets up well."

Facing the likes of **Golden Tempo (Curlin)**, **Renegade** (Into Mischief) and other heavyweights from the 3-year-old male division, the Travers will not be an easy assignment for Baby Vino, but Schultz knows there would be a lot to be gained from a victory.

“It would be a pretty big mark on his career if he were to win that race,” she said. “We had a great win with him last time in the Haskell. We’ll be looking to build onto that.”

One of the storylines in this year's Travers will be if a female trainer can win the race for the second time in four years. Jena Antonucci captured the race in 2023 with **Arcangelo**. Prior to that, you have to go back to 1938 when Mary Hirsch won the race with Thanksgiving. Schultz will be facing off against Cherie DeVaux, the trainer of GI Kentucky Derby and GI Belmont winner Golden Tempo. Schultz was the first female trainer to win the Haskell.

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SOVEREIGNTY, BAEZA WORK FOR WHITNEY

Trainer Bill Mott sent reigning Horse of the Year **Sovereignty** (Into Mischief) and Grade I winner **Baeza (McKinzie)** to breeze separately over the Oklahoma dirt training track in Saratoga Sunday in preparation for Saturday's GI Whitney Stakes.

Godolphin homebred Sovereignty, with assistant trainer Neil Poznansky up, started his work a bit ahead and to the inside of workmate Thunder Roll, maintaining a narrow advantage as he covered a half-mile in :50.10 (46/65), according to NYRA clockers.

“He went nice,” Mott said. “He was on the bridle. Neil thought he felt really good. He said when the other horse kept inching closer, he kept tightening the reins and acted like he wanted to go on.”

C R K Stable and breeder Grandview Equine's Baeza breezed a half-mile in :49.20 (23/65), according to NYRA clockers, in company with Veblen [:49.50].

“He looked great,” Mott said. “I mean both my horses worked good. They just had four-furlong breezes. I think they are fit. I think they are doing well. I think they appear to be ready to go. We just have to hope they continue to do good for the next six days.”

The Whitney, a Win and You're In contest for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, will be broadcast to a national audience on FOX as part of a two-hour edition of FOX Saratoga Saturday, which will begin at 5 p.m. ET.

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Jockey Club to Convene Round Table

At the National HBPA conference earlier in the year, Dobson warned that economic incentives for commercial breeders are driving what he has called an “alarming increase in the coefficient of inbreeding.” The Jockey Club explored book size limits of 140 per stallion in 2019, only to retreat in the face of opposition from its constituency.

Ten stallions at six Kentucky stud farms bred more than 200 mares apiece last year, covering almost 10% of mares bred in 2025. By contrast, 95% of stallions in North America bred fewer than 140. The average book in New York and Florida was 36 and 22, respectively. In California, Louisiana and Ontario, the average was 16 or 17. Whether breeding and racing can grow beyond Kentucky weighs on the industry as a whole.

In April, the Kentucky legislature passed a measure to retaliate against The Jockey Club if it were to implement a mare cap. It was a political setback for rookie chair Dobson, who owns a broodmare farm near Lexington and races under Cheyenne Stables.

The Jockey Club's efforts to reign in the industry encountered additional resistance in June when the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals ruled the Horseracing and Safety Integrity Authority's enforcement provisions **unconstitutional**. Two other circuit courts have ruled in HISA's favor, leaving the matter unresolved. The creation of HISA was a top priority of Dobson's predecessor, Stuart Janney, but has faced legal challenges from the National Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association and from Louisiana, Oklahoma, West Virginia and Iowa. Of the 23 states that host Thoroughbred racing, four remain outside HISA's jurisdiction: Louisiana, Texas, West Virginia and Nebraska. HISA's supporters argue the lack of uniform standards for safety and integrity jeopardizes racing's social license with the public.

Although The Jockey Club's Board of Stewards includes track operators and executives from across the industry, the breed registry has no authority to decide issues such as whether to limit Computer Assisted Wagering or reschedule the Preakness and Belmont Stakes to revamp the Triple Crown.

While The Jockey Club provided increased financial support this year for retraining Thoroughbreds for second careers, and for its traceability initiative to reduce the number of racehorses shipped to slaughter in Mexico and Canada, aftercare advocates want systemic funding to secure racehorse retirement beyond piecemeal efforts funded voluntarily.

At the same time, The Jockey Club and its industry partners achieved some **noteworthy wins** during the past year that Dobson can highlight at the Round Table.

An expanded federal tax benefit for investors in Thoroughbreds--100% bonus depreciation--increased gross sales of yearlings by \$138 million last year, a 21% increase over 2024. The median yearling price, a key indicator of the health of the midmarket, increased 30%, from \$27,000 in 2024 to \$35,000 last year.

The tax benefit was championed by the National Thoroughbred Racing Association, which is funded in part by The Jockey Club.

In November, The Jockey Club facilitated collaboration among state breeding programs when it convened a workshop for directors of state-bred programs in conjunction with the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association. The workshop was well received and additional regional programs will be held. The New York Racing Association subsequently announced a reciprocal partnership with Woodbine Racetrack, in Toronto, to hold 14 restricted stakes races with combined purses of \$3.2 million for New York and Canadian-breds. NYRA aims to incentivize Ontario horsemen to fill fields and improve its winter product when racing at the renovated Belmont Park shifts to a new synthetic track.

In California, Fasig-Tipton, in partnership with the California Thoroughbred Breeders Association, will offer a \$500,000 bonus for the first graduate of its 2026 California Fall Yearlings Sale to win a U.S. Grade I race by three years of age.

In October, Equibase, a partnership of The Jockey Club and an association of Thoroughbred racetracks, introduced a new rating system that uses performance data to score horses' relative class and ability. By June, 10 tracks had used it to hold nearly 50 ratings handicap races as alternatives to claiming races. Backers of the system believe wider adoption could help retain small owners who quit the sport when their horses are claimed, improving the safety of claiming horses through less frequent churn of owners.

America's Best Racing, the casual fan engagement and marketing arm funded by The Jockey Club at \$2.5 million this year, achieved significantly wider reach through social media and expanded live streams, including ABR's first live stream of a non-racing or wagering program: the Fasig-Tipton sale at Saratoga last year.

ABR's exclusive video clip of trainer Cherie DeVaux's reaction to Golden Tempo's victory in the Kentucky Derby went viral and was viewed more than 150 million times, almost double the 76 million views ABR generated from last year's Derby. Broadcast television talk shows rushed to book DeVaux on their programs. ABR estimates that 98% of viewers who saw DeVaux's video clip on third-party channels were non-followers of racing. ABR claims the media exposure was worth as much as \$7.75 million in paid advertising, or three times the value of The Jockey Club's annual investment in ABR overall.

At last year's Round Table, Dobson called for "a unified, comprehensive national marketing strategy" to grow racing's fan base, particularly among Generation Z viewers whose attention and wallets are drawn to other sports and forms of sports betting.

As a minority owner of the National Basketball Association team the Oklahoma City Thunder, Dobson contends that Thoroughbred racing has a marketing opportunity to convert more of the Kentucky Derby's record-breaking 24.4 million viewers at peak this year into repeat, causal followers of the sport.

This year's Round Table agenda will emphasize marketing strategies to attract new fans and owners, including a keynote presentation by racing league leader Greg Maffei, who helped grow the global audience for Formula 1 racing as Liberty Media's CEO. The Japanese Racing Association's Tom Hashimoto will review efforts to attract young fans in Japan, where racing has broad, mainstream cultural appeal. Marketing consultant Victoria Edwards and ABR's Dan Tordjman will review an expanded industrywide marketing initiative to raise racing's profile in North America.

In addition, Joe Appelbaum, former president of the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, will share an analysis of ownership trends. Maryland Jockey Club chair James Dresher will review developments to reinvigorate racing there. Charlotte Clement de Bona, The Jockey Club's recently hired chief strategy and transformation officer, will cover the organization's strategic priorities, and Kristin Werner, The Jockey Club's vice president of Thoroughbred strategy and industry initiatives, will discuss its traceability initiative.

Dobson, the first chairman of The Jockey Club in 40 years who is not a member of the Phipps family, has pledged to make the organization more transparent as it faces mounting criticism from detractors as an insular body, resistant to input from outsiders.

In March, Dobson **went before the national HBPA** to acknowledge disagreements and underscore common ground. In June, The Jockey Club launched a **newsletter** to share more information with stakeholders. The Round Table conference will be livestreamed on Thursday, Aug. 6, at 10 a.m. ET, on The Jockey Club's **website**.

Michael Tabor's Survie, multiple Group 1-placed in Europe and third in this year's G1 Neom Turf Cup in Saudi Arabia, came flying late to take her U.S. debut in the GII Glens Falls Stakes at Saratoga Sunday. The bay mare, sent off at 2-1, settled at midpack while covered up along the hedge as longshot Storm Miami took the field through pedestrian splits. The pacesetter scampered clear down the lane and looked home free only to have Survie unleash a powerful late rally to sweep to the lead in the dying strides.

"I had a great trip," said winning jockey Flavien Prat. "She broke OK. It sounded like she could be anxious in the gate. She was good, so she jumped well, and I was able to get myself in the race and I saved ground most of the way. I mean, I tipped her out and I'd be curious to see how fast she went home, but she really sprinted."

Of the slow pace up front, Prat added, "It was slow, at that point there's nothing I can do about it. You turn for home and know everybody is going to sprint home and she just outsprinted them."

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Winning trainer George Boughey, who won the G1 Sussex Stakes with the undefeated Bow Echo on Wednesday at Goodwood, was happy with Survie's effort.

"Impressive performance, really," Boughey said. "We hoped the step back up to the mile and a half would suit and luckily it did. She's a filly who has always trained with a lot of pace and just wasn't able to show it over shorter distances. "[Prat] gave her a lovely ride. We were always going to be asked for that turn-of-foot with how slowly they went. There was a moment where I thought we might have been covered up on the fence without being able to get a run, but he found a beautiful path, and he had an equal partner. She showed a proper turn-of-foot today."

Survie, winner of the 2024 G2 Prix de Malleret and a narrowly beaten second in that year's G1 French Oaks, was third in the G1 Pretty Polly Stakes and second in the G1 Prix Jean Romanet last summer for trainer Nicolas Clement and Frauke Hermans, and co-owners Gerard Augustin-Normand and China Horse Club International. She was offered at last year's Tattersalls December sale where she was purchased by M.V. Magnier for 1.9-million guineas.

Returning this term in the Coolmore colors, Survie was a winner at Lingfield in January before traveling to Riyadh in February. Third in the G2 Dahlia Stakes in May, she was making her first start since finishing sixth in the Wolferton Stakes at Royal Ascot June 16.

On a potential start in the Aug. 15 GI Christophe Clement Turf, Boughey said, "Back up to the mile and a half is where we'll probably stay with her and the Christophe Clement seems like a suitable spot to go to. She's run back quickly before. She won for us back in January and ran well two weeks later in Saudi Arabia. She shipped over in the two weeks and ran very well out there."

Baughey added, "Obviously, we'll see how she comes out of the race, but she was bought to be a Group or a Grade 1 winner and it's nice to make her a Grade II winner [in the U.S.] today."

Joel Politi's homebred Stress Relief came flying late to take the GIII Adirondack Stakes and give trainer Kinnon LaRose his first graded victory Sunday at Saratoga.

Sent off at 6-1, the dark bay filly sat off the pace set by Luminous Beauty, who took the field through an opening quarter in :21.99. Stress Relief loomed a three while three wide after a half in :45.40. She forged to the lead inside the final sixteenth before spurting away to an authoritative victory.

"I worked her last week, it was an easy work, but I was very pleased with her," said winning rider Junior Alvarado. "[This was] a step up in company against horses that had been running probably more than her, but I mean, she was up to the task today. She responded very well. She was kind of close to the pace, and when I asked her, she was there for me, finished up very nice."

Stress Relief romped home a five-length winner after pressing the pace in her five-furlong debut at Churchill Downs June 20 for former Tom Amoss assistant trainer LaRose.

"When she broke her maiden at Churchill, Joel Politi was there with his family, and he looked at me and said, 'Can't wait for the Adirondack,'" LaRose said. "For us to be able to get here and [have] everything go right, we got lucky. She's a classy filly and she ran a great race. Junior [Alvarado] rode her perfectly."

LaRose was confident the filly would be able to come off the pace in her second start.

"She's a very versatile filly," he said. "She's young, but at the same time she seems like she can really adapt to what we throw at her. She's just a pleasure to train."

LaRose, 28, is from the upstate New York town of Ogdensburg, and grew up attending the races at the Spa. He worked for Amoss for several years until his retirement earlier this year, and took out his trainer's license to assume command of the sizable stable Apr. 1, notching his first career win nine days later at Keeneland.

Of winning his first graded race at Saratoga, LaRose said, "No better place to do it. I wish Joel Politi was here with his family, but my wife is here, my mom and my dad, and my brothers are here. We had a bunch of friends here. It's a special place. I grew up coming here as a kid, and I never thought I would be in this position, but I'm just very grateful."

FUJITA-OWNED COLT GIVES IN-FORM LIFE IS GOOD A FIRST JAPANESE WINNER

A handful of hours after WinStar Farm's boom freshman sire **Life Is Good** (Into Mischief) was represented by his fourth 'TDN Rising Star' presented by Hagyard in the form of the debuting filly Life Changing, the stallion's first-crop son **Lizhitsumodoraichi** became his ninth individual winner with a front-running victory in a newcomers' event over 1800 meters Sunday afternoon at Niigata Racecourse.

Sent off the 43-10 third betting favorite to open his account at first asking, the Apr. 3 foal was sent straight into the lead from the five hole by leading jockey Keita Tosaki and galloped his 11 rivals along at a leisurely tempo over the left-turning track. Held together into the straight, the Hideyuki Mori trainee opened a bit of daylight approaching the final 200 meters and held sway to graduate by a comfortable 1 1/2 lengths over second choice **Ten Yumeno Aurora (Jpn)** (Le Vent Se Leve {Jpn}).

The winner's dam, third in the grassy GII Jessamine Stakes as a juvenile and victorious in the Northbound Pride Oaks at three in 2020, was purchased by Mulholland Springs for \$255,000 at the 2021 Keeneland November Sale. The second produce from Ask Bailey, Lizhitsumodoraichi was consigned by the Mulholland family operation to KEENOV in 2024 and fetched \$270,000 before changing hands for \$210,000 at Keeneland September last fall.

On behalf of Fujita, best known for campaigning reigning Eclipse Award and GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero Forever Young (Jpn) (Real Steel {Jpn}), Mori signed the ticket on the colt at this year's OBS March Sale after he breezed a blinkered eighth of a mile in :9 4/5. He did not race with the equipment on Sunday.

An active buyer of American-bred stock at this country's breeze-up sales and known for successfully traveling his young runners to win overseas, Mori has started some 13 horses at the Breeders' Cup since 2019, including Fujita's Shin Believe (**Constitution**), an \$800,000 OBS March purchase who won a Niigata newcomers' event by five lengths on Aug. 3, 2024 before finishing unplaced in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile in his next start.

Ask Bailey is also responsible for a yearling filly by Taiba, a **Cogburn** colt foaled Apr. 18 of this year and has been bred back to Omaha Beach.

Brilliant Bertie raced with blinkers on for the first time in his career here, and defeated a massive 78-1 longshot to win the Green River Island Stakes at Ellis.

Winless since his GII Wise Dan Stakes in 2025, he tried to defend his title last out June 27 in the contest, but could only manage fourth behind Lagynos (**Kantharos**), who continued a five-race winstreak with that effort. His last time on the board was Oct. 4 last year when he wrapped his '25 campaign with a third-place finish in the GI Coolmore Turf Mile.

Racing along from sixth as the frontrunner posted early fractions of :23.89, :47.99, and 1:11.03, Brilliant Bertie found himself coming wide off the far bend with Native Runner in pursuit as he overtook the fading leaders. Taking a clear advantage by the furlong grounds, it was 1 3/4 lengths back to Native Runner in second while 24-1 Giocosso claiming third.

"The key was keeping him a little more focused late," Brian Hernandez Jr. said. "He's normally pretty good about putting himself in position, and everything definitely worked out today."

The victor is the elder half-brother to SP Hey Bertie (**Kantharos**) and the first stakes horse for the dam, Believe in Bertie. The dam was a two-time course record-setter during her racing days in addition to being a three-time stakes winner and twice Graded-placed. In addition to the aforementioned runners, she also claims a yearling filly by Goldencents as well as a 2026 colt by **Oscar Performance**. “He puts himself in the race and gets into a good position,” winning rider Brian Hernandez Jr. said. “All the credit goes to Brian [Lynch] and his team. The first time he let me get on this horse, he said, ‘I think I’ve got a good one for you.’ He waited on horses a little in the stretch after he put the favorite away, but once he got past the wire, he took off again. I think that shows he’s the type of horse who will continue to improve.”

Lynch added, “I’ve always thought the more ground he gets, the better he’ll be. Hopefully, this gets us to the **Nashville Derby** at Kentucky Downs.”

Fancy Sailor, a maiden winner going one mile over the Gulfstream lawn in March, was sixth when stretched to 1 1/16 miles at Churchill May 8, but returned to the winner’s circle when cut back to a mile in a June 5 optional claimer in Louisville.

Tiz Ro, a half-sister to multiple Grade I winner Jambalaya (Langfuhr), died this year. She has a 2-year-old filly by **Jack Christopher** and produced a filly by **Epicenter** this year.

Bohemian had the best turn of foot in the late stages and overhauled the leaders to win her first black-type in the Pucker Up Stakes at Ellis.

On the board in two stakes races earlier this year, the grey's last three jumps came at Churchill Downs. Her best result was a third-place finish June 5 against optional claimers, and she was last seen June 27 closing for fourth in the Tepin Stakes.

Sent off carrying 6-1 odds, she set up shop as the caboose and watched the race unfold through tepid early fractions of :24.19, :49.03, and six panels in 1:13.43. She steadily advanced from the five path but had a lot of ground to make up in the lane as Turner's Charm and Embrace Time were dueling for command. Relentlessly closing the gap, Bohemian timed her final jumps to perfection and won the bob despite drifting out to the seven path.

"She was getting into position around the half-mile pole and then dropped back a little around the turn," trainer Joe Sharp said. "She's been very consistent with that late run, and it's special to win this race with her. She's the third foal out of a mare I trained. They've all had their quirks, but she knows how to get the job done."

The moment called on him to take a big step forward, and 'TDN Rising Star, presented by Hagyard' Sea Strike obliged, dominating the **Curlin** Stakes at the Spa with air to spare.

Breaking well and eager to get to the front, he was floated wide going into the first turn by **Gulfy**, who took command as Sea Strike settled in second. The opening quarter went by in :23.62 with positions largely unchanged, and a half was posted in :46.77 heading up the backstretch.

Going into the far turn behind six panels in 1:11.88, the closers took closer order for the final drive and the field bunched together late on the bend with 4-5 favorite 'Rising Star' Chief Wallabee the looming danger.

Straightening out as challengers came calling, Sea Strike made his move and overhauled the longtime leader with an electric turn of foot in upper stretch. The race was over in a matter of strides as he easily put away the runner-up and galloped in a stylish winner by over eight lengths. **Gulfy** held on to wrap the trifecta.

Flavien Prat and Chad Brown both won three races on the card with Sea Strike's victory in the **Curlin** Stakes.

"[Sea Strike] always acted like he wanted to have a clean face in his races and he grabs the bridle nicely and just clicks along as

long as you want him to go. That's how I work the horse," said Brown afterwards. "He got left at the gate in his first start and was able to get up against maidens, but against better horses last time he got that dirt in his face and really resented it."

When asked if he would consider stretching out to 1 1/4-miles for the GI Travers Stakes Aug. 29, Brown said, "Yes. This horse is freaky good in the morning. Now, he's playing catch-up here. That was a really good race yesterday, the Jim Dandy, so I don't say that lightly, but I don't know...he ran pretty good today and looked like he had more in the tank."

"I'm not saying a step up against those other horses he'd do the same, and he's likely to have some company in that final

turn against better horses. We'll just see how he comes out of it and go from there, but I wouldn't take it off the table."

Sea Strike claimed his first stakes victory on the back of that aforementioned disappointing fifth-place effort last out June 6 at this venue, when he took on first-level allowance foes on the step up from the maiden ranks. He earned his 'Rising

Star' nod Apr. 25 at Aqueduct when he did everything possible to lose, but still found a way to roll home a much-the-best winner by 2 1/4 lengths.

The victor is the third consecutive offspring for the dam to get his picture taken, but her first stakes runner. Meetmeonline has a juvenile filly by **Speaker's Corner**, a yearling filly by **Army Mule**, and a weanling colt by **Midshipman**. She was bred to Chancer McPatrick for 2027. The dam is a half-sister to MGSW **Bucchero (Kantharos)**, whose best runner as a sire thus far is Eclipse champion Book'em Danno. Sunday's G1 Prix Rothschild saw the same one-two as the Falmouth, but it was a lot closer between **Blue Bolt** (Blue Point) and **Precise** (Starspangledbanner) at the end of the Deauville feature.

Unbeaten in 2026, Juddmonte's 1-2 favourite, who also captured Royal Ascot's Duke of Cambridge Stakes, drifted left and ended up on the stands' rail under Colin Keane but had enough to deny the Ballydoyle filly by half a length. The early leader **Moon Target** (Cracksman) was a further 1 3/4 lengths back in third.

"It wasn't very comfortable watching, but Colin's judged it perfectly," Andrew Balding said. "She's a powerful traveller with great strength and great desire. She's effective on any ground, which is a big help. We always felt that Leopardstown was her race and, afterwards, who knows?"

Behind Precise in the early stages this time, Blue Bolt was still able to overhaul the three-year-old in the final furlong with a fast closing sectional straightened by the fence. There can be no doubt that she is the better of the pair over a mile and, with her next target of the Matron Stakes being left-handed, she looks set to continue the sequence for a while. SEVEN UP FOR WOHLER AS SOREANGA IMPRESSES IN THE DIANA

Sunday's G1 Henkel-Preis der Diana stayed in Germany as Gestut Fahrhof's **Soreanga** (Siyouuni) provided Andreas Wohler with a seventh renewal of the Dusseldorf Classic.

Last seen winning the Hamburger Stutenpreis over this 11-furlong trip, the 7-1 shot was never far from the pace under Eduardo Pedroza and, when launched approaching the furlong pole, swamped the Prix Saint-Alary winner **Lapothese** (Wootton Bassett) to settle the issue. Strong to the line, the homebred had 3 1/2 lengths to spare over that 6-5 favourite, with another three-length margin back to **Noble Lips** (Gleneagles) in third.

This was Wohler's sixth edition since 2014 and Pedroza's fifth, while it also ended a drought for her owner-breeders since Risen Raven triumphed in 1994. In total, this was the sixth Diana for Fahrhof. [Cont. p4](#)

"It was pretty straightforward, but she has a tendency to go left when she comes off the bridle and thankfully the rail gave us a little bit of help," her rider said. "She's a big physical and likes to get on with it. She came a long way in a short space of time last year and it's the same this year. There's no reason she can't keep on improving. She definitely won't look out of place against the boys if she goes that way."

Aidan O'Brien said of Precise, "I'm very pleased with her. In the Falmouth Stakes, Blue Bolt beat her by two lengths and today she finished only half a length behind despite the weight conditions being less favourable to her, so she ran very well. She may step up in distance on her next start--we'll see. We'll take time to consider it."

Cheveley Park Stud's managing director Chris Richardson said of Moon Target, "We are delighted. The plan was to go to the front, as there was no obvious pacemaker in the race and it was logical to try to control the race from the front at a steady pace. Last year, our filly finished second to Precise in the Prestige Stakes at Goodwood and we felt we had been a little unlucky when fourth in the Coronation Stakes."

He added, "I think we'll probably keep her over a mile. Some of these very good fillies are going into battle race after race. Our filly was a little fresher and we will try to keep her that way. She needs time between her races and so we'll space out her races more carefully."

Blue Bolt's dam is the Prix Allez France winner Mayhem (Whipper), whose progeny include the Listed scorer and German 1,000 Guineas runner-up Sky Angel (Dark Angel) and the dual Listed scorer Sea Theme (**Sea The Stars**). Another of the many notable stakes performers in the dynasty is Full Count Felicia (War Front), the E. P. Taylor-winning Canadian champion. Mayhem's three-year-old Heureuse (Dark Angel) was a winner at Pompadour on Saturday, while she also has a yearling colt by Baaeed.

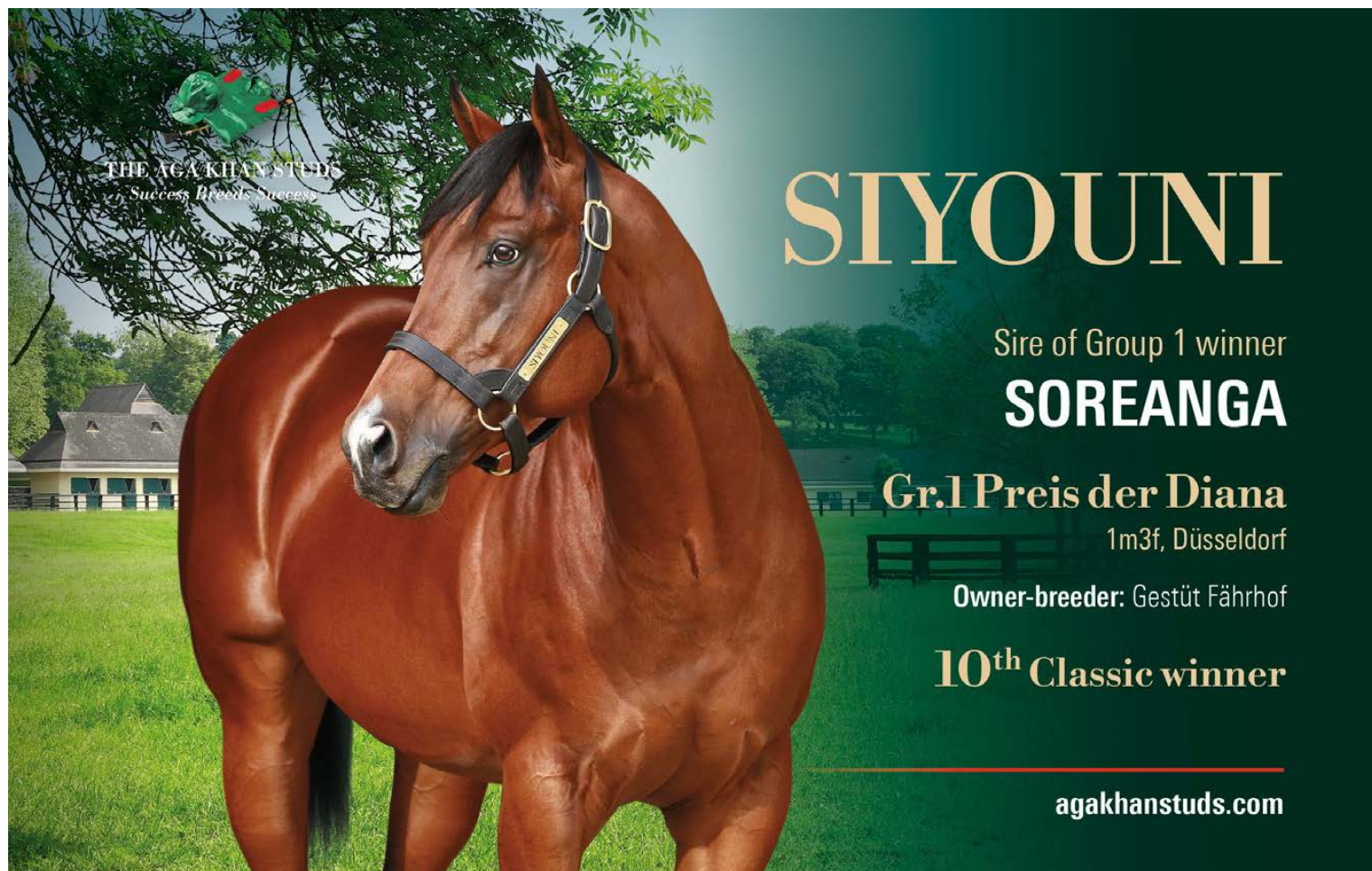
DATA DELIVERS THIRD STRAIGHT SIX PERFECTIONS FOR HEAD

Two Group 3 races in, it was two winners at Deauville August in the famous Wertheimer colours as **Kosuma** (Night Of Thunder) proved queen bee in the Prix de Cabourg.

Two-for-two entering this course-and-distance prep for the Prix Morny, the granddaughter of the top-class Aquarelliste had impressed on the second of her starts at Saint-Cloud in May and traded as the 5-2 second favourite. Happy to take a tow under Maxime Guyon, the homebred produced key acceleration approaching the furlong pole and ran down the colt

Agamemnon (Mehmas) 100 metres from home en route to a 1 1/2-length success. Wathnan's Albany third **Light Of Dawn** (Showcasing) was three lengths away in third.

"We were wondering where the speed was coming from in the family, but it's probably Night Of Thunder," the owner-breeders' racing manager Pierre-Yves Bureau said of the winner, the first at Deauville August for the new partnership of Andre and Lavinia Fabre and Fabre Senior's ninth in total, bringing him level with Francois Boutin's record. "There were a lot of questions, but she did it very nicely. I think, if all is okay, she'll go to the Prix Morny. That's going to be a big step up, but let's try!"

Pedigree Notes

Kosuma emanates from one of the best Wildenstein families, with the Wertheimers having purchased the Dayton Investments stock three years ago to bring together the best bloodlines of the two powerhouse operations. She is the first foal out of the Listed winner Any Time Soon (**Camelot**), one of four stakes performers produced by the aforementioned Danehill mare Aquarelliste, whose trio of Group 1 victories included the Prix de Diane.

Aquarelliste is also responsible for Prix Jean Romanet runner-up Ame Bleue (Dubawi) and the Listed-placed Amerique (Galileo) who, in turn, produced the talented but quirky Listed Pretty Polly Stakes winner Maqsad (**Siyouni**). From the dynasty of Arcangues (Sagace), which includes the four-time Group 1 winner Luxembourg by Any Time Soon's sire **Camelot** (Montjeu), the dam's yearling filly by **Zarak** is named Forenoon, while she also has a colt foal by Study Of Man named Maintenant.

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YORK ENTERS THE EQUATION FOR NOTABLE SPEECH; CANADA NEXT FOR OPERA BALLO

The G1 City Of York Stakes could be the next port of call for leading older miler **Notable Speech** (Dubawi), with trainer Charlie Appleby revealing that an appearance at York's Ebor Festival is currently preferred to a return to Deauville for the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois.

The son of Dubawi showed that he retains all of his ability at the age of five when winning May's G1 Lockinge Stakes at Newbury, before failing to meet expectations at Royal Ascot for the third consecutive year when last seen finishing sixth in the G1 Queen Anne Stakes.

A five-time winner at the top level, Notable Speech could also be considered an unlucky loser in last year's Prix Jacques le Marois when making rapid late headway after meeting trouble to be beaten just a head behind Diego Velazquez. He had been expected to return to Deauville later this month to try and avenge that defeat, but a drop back to seven furlongs for the City Of York is now being strongly considered, according to Appleby.

"Notable Speech is in good form," said the trainer. "We've been looking towards the Prix Jacques le Marois, but we've also very much got an eye on going to York for the City Of York Stakes.

"I think seven [furlongs] with a big field will suit him. In all honesty, if you ask me right now, I'd say we're 70-30 at the moment that we'll end up going to York."

With Notable Speech a possible for York, **Opera Ballo** (Ghaiyyath) will be the horse entrusted with representing the stable in the G1 Woodbine Mile, a race Notable Speech won last year before following up in the G1 Breeders' Cup Mile.

The latter event is also reported to be a big target in the second half of 2026 for Opera Ballo who, having finished third in the Queen Anne, ran another huge race when occupying the same position behind Bow Echo (Night Of Thunder) in Wednesday's G1 Sussex Stakes at Goodwood.

"He's come out of the Sussex well, as in he's sound and fit," said Appleby. "He was tired, needless to say, as I think a few of them were. They all probably had a lie in the next day.

"I'm sticking to Plan A which is to take him to Canada. I want to get him there as I think the tracks and style of racing will suit him, going round the bend and an easier mile.

"Doing what he does, if they're going quick enough and you get a lead on him, then great. If he goes and makes it himself, it wouldn't worry me as you can get away with it over there. Here, going up and down dale, where they won't ease off on you, is a different ball game."

He added, "Hopefully, that will lead into a Breeders' Cup. I know we might meet Bow Echo again, but the weights will be different there and, as we know, you need a lot of luck around those American tracks. If you are drawn 14 of 14, it can make life a bit different."
