



LUSTER SHINES IN KING'S PLATE

Daughter of Knicks Go Becomes 40th Filly to Win First Jewel of Canadian Triple Crown

ETOBICOKE, ON--To say that Gainesway Stable and Andrew Rosen's **Luster** (Knicks Go) was the horse to beat in this season's \$1-million King's Plate would be an understatement of epic proportions. Earlier in the week, several of the trainers in the race, including Hall of Famer and fellow Plate contender Mark Casse, suggested that the race was hers to lose.

Come race day, however, the grey filly offered few anxious moments to her supporters as she came from just off the pace to handily defeat 11 rivals in the first jewel in the Canadian Triple Crown.

Pegged as the even-money choice on the morning line, the Josie Carroll trainee was pounded down to 1-5 favoritism by the time sophomores broke from the gate at shortly after 6 p.m. Exiting Post 1, Luster was given a little nudge by John Velazquez and the filly instantly put herself in a forward position, allowing longshots **Fire and Wine** (Lexitonia) and **Very Special** (Ghostzapper) to lead the way into the first turn. With **Magical Factor** (**The Factor**) joining the fray to the outside, Luster hugged the rail, roughly three lengths behind, through opening fractions of :22.78 and :46.48.

Continuing to survey the pace through three quarter in 1:11.05, Luster was asked for a bit more by Velazquez leaving the far turn and she overtook her struggling rivals with consummate ease. In command turning for home, she was given several prompts by her rider in the stretch, and while the Casse-trained **Military Time** (Gun Runner) rallied at the end, the effort proved an exercise in futility as the grey filly streaked home a

much-the-best 7 1/4-length winner.

The filly was the fourth Plate winner for Carroll. The Canadian Hall of Famer also trained Edenwold (2006), Inglorious (2011) and Mighty Heart (2020).

"These horses don't come along too often," said Carroll, who also saddled horses in the last two races on the card. "She's very special."

Echoing the importance of the achievement, Rosen told the TDN after his first Plate win, "It was really special and I've been obviously in horse racing a long time. I've had a lot of good horses over the years and they're just not easy to get. And Luster ranks right up there with some of the best I've ever had."

Making the 6 1/2-hour drive from Saratoga to ride the Ontario-bred filly, Velazquez previously won the Plate with Wonder Gadot in 2018.

"When you ride good horses, you do what you want to do and she allowed me to do whatever I wanted to with her. It makes me look good," explained Velazquez. "I was really good once we passed the wire for the first time. I got back where I thought I needed to be. By the time we got to the back stretch, I had my eye on [Fire and Wine and Very Special] in front of me and I knew they're not going to take me very far. So I went to [Magical Factor] and he looked like he had some horse."

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"And I had [**Dixie Law (Tiz the Law)**] behind trying to hold me in [on the rail]. I just kind of bided my time. And by the half-mile pole, that horse was not there. I got out, got my position, got to the three-eighths pole and I sat and waited until they came to me at the quarter pole. I was good to go. She was there. It's simple as that."

Carroll was quick to applaud the journeyman rider for his textbook ride.

"Johnny is the king of patience," she said. "He took her back without choking her back. He let the horses that wanted leave run on, and if you watched him when he was ready to make his move, he angled her out and said go and away she went."

And while the Hall of Fame rider said he was extremely confident sitting atop his charge from the onset of the 10-furlong race, Rosen—who helped lead the filly over to the infield for the winner's circle ceremony—admitted afterward that he felt some nerves during the early part of the race.

"I wasn't quite as confident as Johnny was," Rosen said with a laugh. "But she actually performed the way she has in the last three races. She really dominated those horses."

He continued, "I looked up at the board and I saw that she was 1-5. And I said to Josie, I said, 'They're betting her she's going to win this race by five or six lengths.'"

"I knew that she had been doing very well and Josie was super confident. I mean, the 1-hole scared us a little bit because you just never know, but she's just been so consistent and getting better all the time, so it was really nice."

In her sole start at two, Luster ran off to a 6 1/4-length victory going seven furlongs over the yielding Woodbine turf last August. **Cont.**

Facing allowance company at Keeneland in April, she was brought home a five-length winner under Velazquez while trying 8 1/2 furlongs on the grass.

"When I went on Keeneland, I told [Carroll] this horse is impressive. I would love to go ride it wherever she goes," recalled Velazquez. "Obviously, she's developed to what she is now. You don't know if they're going to develop, but obviously she did and she's done a great job with the horse to keep her going and develop into what she's doing now. So give it to the whole team doing a great job with her."

Cut back to seven panels while debuting on Woodbine's Tapeta in the Ruling Angel Stakes on May 16, Luster was third as the heavy favorite, but bounced back to win the 1 1/16-mile GIII Selene Stakes on June 27. In her latest outing, she ran away to a 5 1/2-length score in the Woodbine Oaks on July 19.

"I think she's gotten better with each race," Rosen affirmed. "If you look at it, I think the Selene was really good. The Woodbine Oaks was better, and I think this was better still."

Looking ahead, both Carroll and Rosen indicated that the filly was unlikely to return for the second jewel in Canada's Triple Crown, Prince of Wales Stakes at Fort Erie, next month.

"I will talk to the owners, but we had agreed that after this race we would probably give her a little break," said Carroll. "She runs her heart out every time and she just throws it all down there every time. I think we're pretty much in agreement that she'll get a little break now."

Carroll indicated that the GI QEII at Keeneland was a strong possibility.

"I think that we have to see how she comes out and everything," said Rosen. "She's run a lot this year, and my feeling would probably, and I think Josie's feeling would be probably to give her a little bit of time...I wouldn't imagine that we would be anxious to run her right back in a month."

Pedigree Notes:

One of two graded winners for Knicks Go, Luster is out of **The Factor's** unraced daughter Ruby Frost, a half-sister to MGSP Swear by It (Broken Vow). Her unraced 2-year-old colt, Whatsyoursismine (Frac Daddy), is on the work tab at Woodbine. The mare was most recently bred to **Muth**.

Luster's third dam is by Chief's Crown, who was bred by Andrew Rosen's father, Carl Rosen, and **campaigning by the Rosen family** after the patriarch passed in 1983. Chief's Crown was the champion 2-year-old colt of 1984, and won the inaugural Breeders' Cup Juvenile.

An \$80,000 Keeneland September yearling purchase, the filly was previously sold by Machmer Hall for \$50,000 as a weanling at Fasig-Tipton the previous season. She was bred by Ravi Sugrim and Joannie Dass.

Conrad Bendoroff had a similar view from the Denali Stud consignment.

"Activity's been good," Bendoroff said. "We had a very solid day of showing yesterday. The barn has been very busy so far this morning, and I think foot traffic's been good. Our showing yesterday was up about 10% year-over-year from last year. I think there's going to be good momentum carrying over from the last sale."

The two-day Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Sale, held last Monday and Tuesday, produced frenetic bidding and record-setting results.

Asked if he expected the momentum from the select sale to trickle down to the New York-bred sale, Bendoroff said, "It is a different buying bench, but I think there's been plenty of people talking with some agents, talking with some buyers that didn't get anything bought in the last sale. I think there was some frustration, and agents that had orders in the last sale that weren't able to get horses bought, and they have clients that buy New York-breds. It could make them more aggressive in this market."

As the quality of the New York-bred program has continued to improve, it has forced Kentucky-based consignors to increase the quality of the stock they offer at the annual yearling sale.

"I think the New York program is getting so healthy," Duignan said. "It's fantastic. There are a lot of positive things going on in New York. Our standards for bringing horses here has gotten better. I think it's been improving for the last seven or eight years. And actually, [the local horses] are prepared a lot better. The bar has gotten higher."

Driving the increase in quality are a bevy of incentives and increased opportunities for New York-breds, from the arrival of full purse parity in 2027, which will offer equal purses for state-bred and open races, to a new Belmont Park which will feature

an all-weather surface, in addition to its traditional dirt and turf surfaces. Also debuting next year will be the Empire Trillium Series which will offer \$3.2 million in total purses for races pitting New York-breds against Canadian-breds.

"This is now our second year where we're going to have the purse parity, and I think that's a huge bonus for New York breeders and New York owners," Bendoroff said. "And now there is the Empire Trillium series."

Of the addition of a Tapeta track at Belmont, Bendoroff said, "I think it gives everybody more options. A horse that somebody might have had to run at Presque Isle, now it's got a home here in New York. I think it opens up more opportunities for horses and obviously with more purse power as well."

While Kentucky-based operations like Paramount Sales and Denali Stud saw action during the select sale earlier in the week, local operations like Anne Morgan's Mill Creek Farm will join the fray for the two-day New York-bred sale.

Located not far from Saratoga Springs in Stillwater, Mill Creek will offer five yearlings at the auction.

"It's been very, very busy," Morgan said Saturday morning. "They started very early, and everybody's really interested in everything."

Morgan agreed the new Belmont Park and purse parity were helping to create additional buzz around the sale, but she added, "The other thing that's really helping is the new breeders' awards. They've upped the breeders' awards, and that really interests the breeders, obviously, and the whole class of horses, New York-breds. Not only the Kentucky-sired, but right now especially the New York-sired. People are very, very interested in the New York-sired yearlings." **Cont.**

The Mill Creek consignment includes yearlings by Kentucky-based sires Taiba, **Charlatan**, and Arabian Lion, as well as a pair of yearlings by New York-based stallion **Americanrevolution**.

"We've brought some better stallions into the state, and the product that they're putting out, the mares that are getting bred to them are better, and that interests people," Morgan said.

'A Permanent Smile on My Face': Murray Smith Back Doing What She Loves

Longtime horsewoman Murray Smith was back in action at the sales grounds at Fasig-Tipton in Saratoga this week after an absence from the auction scene of some 14 years. Smith spent several years among the top 2-year-old consignors in the country, with GI Kentucky Derby winner Monarchos among her most famous graduates. But the years of training and breaking 2-year-olds took a heavy toll physically.

"I did everything," Smith said from the sales grounds Saturday. "I used to break them myself and ride them. And over the years, the injuries mounted up. So I had to stop, I was in so much pain. My right arm was almost totally paralyzed, my back was so bad, I had man-made scoliosis.

"For the last 10 years, I have had neck fusion, two back surgeries. One, they put two 18-inch rods and 22 screws in my back. Three hip replacements, a knee replacement, ankle surgery, reverse shoulder surgery, and wrist surgery."

Smith faced her biggest challenge this past spring when she was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer.

"I had cancer surgery in March of this year," she said. "It was the Whipple procedure, and thank God they got it all out."

After several rounds of chemotherapy, Smith said, "My doctor told me, 'You're one of the very few patients of mine that has pancreatic cancer that I don't say you have two weeks to two months to live.'"

With her cancer battle behind her, Smith, who had been

working in real estate in Ocala, was seeking a sign for what to do next.

"It wasn't my passion," Smith said of real estate. "So, when I got out of this cancer deal, I said, 'You know what? I've got to find a way back to the horses.' That's where my heart and soul is, and I don't know if you believe in miracles or not, but I walked outside one night and prayed to God. I looked up in the stars and I said, 'Please tell me where I'm supposed to be.' And the very next day, Patti Miller called me and asked me to come to Saratoga."

Smith has been short-listing for Miller all week and, inevitably, found other people who wanted to work with her.

"I'm doing the short-listing, looking at all the individuals, the conformation, because that's what I'm best at," Smith said. "And you know, while I'm up here, everybody is saying, 'Glad to see you again. Can you help me in this sale? Can you help me in that sale?'"

Smith teamed up with Keiber Rengifo to purchase a colt by Arabian Lion (**hip 151**) for \$200,000 as a pinhook prospect during the select sale and expects she will be an active buyer at the New York-bred sale.

"This is my first year back," Smith said. "I don't want to overdo it. I'll be at the sale with anything that I'm a part of. But I'm not going to have a consignment in my name yet. I had like 10 surgeries and cancer surgery. I don't want to come back and then falter."

For the time being, Smith is enjoying being back where she loves to be.

"Listen, I have a permanent smile on my face looking at horses," she said. "For me to just be here on the grounds and be around my peers and my friends that I've missed, you know, people that I can relate to, this is where my heart and soul is. This is what I'm passionate about."

A LADY'S DAY IN THE CLEMENT, SURVIE DOMINATES TO EARN BREEDERS' CUP BERTH

Ladies first in the GI Christophe Clement Stakes.

Survie (Ire) (Churchill {Ire}) had to close into a glacial pace, but roared home like they'd unleashed her at the top of the stretch, and posted a glorious win to secure an automatic berth to the GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Keeneland.

An elite runner in her European home base, the Michael Tabor colorbearer came into the Christophe Clement off a victory in the GII Glens Falls Stakes. With her Group 1 placings in France, Ireland, and Saudi Arabia, and a victory in the States, Survie now boasts Group/Grade I black type in four countries every year since her 3-year-old season.

The field broke well in a line and **Ole Crazy Bone** (Ghostzapper) stepped out to lead with **Minaret Station** (Instilled Regard) close behind in second through a pedestrian opening quarter in :26.24. Survie meanwhile had set up in last with fellow European **Ancient Egypt (Ire) (Frankel {GB})** to track the action in front of them. Positions largely remained the same for most of the trip, but the pace quickened as they entered the final bend and the top two were overtaken by **Program Trading (GB)** (Lope de Vega {Ire}) in an outer lane as they swung for home.

While the boys duelled at the front, Survie took the widest overland route and produced an electric turn of foot that her rivals simply could not counter. She came in the easiest of winners to secure her first North American Grade I contest. Minaret Station fought back to repel Program Trading late and claim second. The 9-5 favorite Ancient Egypt came in fourth.

The final time was 2:31.55.



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"She was great, wasn't she?" said trainer George Boughey, who was watching while on grounds at the ongoing Arqana Yearling Sale in France. "She had to be very good from where she was with the slow splits. She's been training for this race and it [the Glens Falls] was the perfect lead-up race into it. She showed possibly an even better turn-of-foot today."

"For everyone back at the stable in the U.K., this is a massive milestone for us. We've been lucky enough to have two Group 1-winners for Coolmore now and to get the support of Michael and Doreen Tabor with a filly that was already a Group 2-winner in Europe is just a credit to everyone that is working very hard to produce these results."

When asked about returning to Keeneland this fall to make good on his automatic berth, the conditioner minced no words, saying, "Yes. Very much so. The plan was always to run her twice and then bring her home and prepare her for Keeneland. I'd like to get her back and give her an easy time for a little bit--she doesn't take a huge amount of training--and then ship her out with the normal horses for the Breeders' Cup. I think she'll fly home Wednesday or Thursday this week."

"I tried to recover [heading onto the backstretch] and ride her with patience, but when I asked her to go she just took off with me, and I was just the passenger after that," said Manny Franco, who is currently enjoying the Saratoga meeting of his career. "The trainer told me, 'don't rush her, give her time, and come late. Ride her the way Flavien [Prat] rode her [in the Glens Falls],' so that's what I did."

Pedigree Note:

Survie is the most accomplished runner for her dam, a French Listed winner and twice Group-placed in that country, who is also a half to two other mares that produced group runners. Sotteville (Fr) (Le Havre {Ire}) produced a winning gelding named Soligny (Fr) (Mehmas {Ire}) as well as an unplaced filly Sainte Marthe (Fr) (Zarak {Fr}) since this victress. The latter is her last registered offspring.

This is the extended female family of Australian champion miler MG1SW-Aus Contributor (Ire) (High Chapaarral {Ire}).

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DEVAUX: GOLDEN TEMPO IS 'IN A REALLY GOOD PLACE' *by Tim Wilkin*

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y. -- The fog lifted Saturday morning, and then the star came out.

Golden Tempo ([Curlin](#)), the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Belmont Stakes winner, emerged on the main track at Saratoga just before 8:45 a.m. and dazzled in his second-to-last work before the Aug. 29 GI, \$1.25 million Travers Stakes.

With jockey Jose Ortiz in the saddle, Golden Tempo, working on the inside, glided over the Spa surface, breezing four furlongs in a bullet 47.46 (1/64). He worked with stablemate Paige Turner ([Army Mule](#)), a 3-year-old filly, and exercise rider Ameth Gonzalez.

"I am really confident where he is right now," trainer Cherie DeVaux said outside her barn at the Oklahoma Training Track after the work. "He seems fit, he is really happy. He has had a couple really nice works, solid, and he is not overly exerted. I think he is in a really good place."

Originally, the plan was to work Golden Tempo at 7 a.m., but a dense fog scrapped that idea and pushed it to 8:45 after the break.

"We couldn't see anything," DeVaux said of the early hour murkiness.

After the conditions improved, Golden Tempo and Ortiz made

the long walk from DeVaux's barn in the far corner of the Oklahoma to the main track. Once there, the Phipps Stable and St. Elias Stable homebred chewed up the ground, which still had some moisture in it after Friday's rains.

"He handled it fine," DeVaux said. "He probably would not have gone as fast to start out if it were dry, a normal track."

Ortiz, who has been Golden Tempo's constant partner--he has ridden him in all six of his starts --could find nothing wrong with the work.

"I am sure Cherie is happy with him and so am I," he said after hopping off Golden Tempo. "We wanted 48; he went a little bit more, 47, but he did it on his own. Just let him be happy and stretch his legs."

This was the fourth work for Golden Tempo at Saratoga since shipping up from Keeneland last month and Ortiz has been on him for all four. For this work, DeVaux did not want as robust of a gallop out, something that had been evident in his prior Spa works.

"We didn't have him gallop out the way he has his last couple of works," DeVaux said. "We just kind of eased him down because he has been doing a lot."

With two weeks to go to the Travers, DeVaux says she is not feeling any pressure. She still has a stable to run, other horses to prepare for other races.

Golden Tempo has won three of five starts this year and has four wins in six starts for his career. His wins in the Kentucky Derby and Belmont Stakes came at 1 1/4 miles, the same distance as the Travers.

"I will be anxious the week of the race because I want to get to the race," she said. "The pressure, I try hard not to feel that because then you don't get to enjoy any of this."

Ortiz Starting to Run Away With Title

When Week 7 of the marathon Saratoga summer started, the chase to be top jockey at Saratoga was still a race. After Sunday, there will be three weeks left and the race has turned into a runaway.

Jose Ortiz saw to that. The 32-year-old jockey, a three-time winner of the Spa riding title, is well on his way to his fourth after his impressive week. When it started, Ortiz had 40 wins, two more than Flavien Prat and six more than Manny Franco.

Ortiz had a power surge in the first three days this week, riding 11 winners to rocket to a 51-38 advantage over Prat. Prat, though, was inactive because he was serving a three-day suspension. He came off it Saturday.

Irad Ortiz Jr., Jose's brother, had surged into contention after missing the first six days of the meet (suspension, riding out of town) but is now sidelined with a foot injury. He won't be back until next Saturday and is stuck on 30 winners. **Cont.**

Naturally, Jose Ortiz likes the position he's in but will take nothing for granted.

"It's going to be a great memory," he said Saturday morning while making the rounds on the Oklahoma Training Track. "But I am focusing on what is in front of me."

Steve Rushing, the agent for both Ortiz brothers, said that Jose will be leaving the Spa after Travers Day, Aug. 29, and will head for Kentucky Downs. He said there is a chance Jose Ortiz could come back to ride on Sept. 4, the final Friday of the Saratoga meet when Kentucky Downs is dark.

Irak Ortiz and Prat are also expected to spend a lot of time at Kentucky Downs after the Travers. Opening day of the seven-day meet at Kentucky Downs is Travers Day. Total purse money at the all-grass track is \$25.75 million across 20 stakes races.

Besides Aug. 29, Kentucky Downs will race Aug. 30, Sept. 3 and Sept. 5-7 and Sept. 9.

"We will see what happens in the next couple weeks," Jose Ortiz said. "It would be great to win the title here and ride at Kentucky Downs as well."

Ortiz hopes he can put more daylight between himself and his competitors before heading to Kentucky. The main concern could be Franco, who is expected to stay the duration of the Saratoga meet. He went into Saturday with 37 wins. At the conclusion of the card, Franco had won three races, and Ortiz matched that tally. Jose now sits at 54 wins and Manny at 40 with the latter in second place in the rankings.

"It is very hard when you're not here and other guys are," Jose Ortiz said. "The most important thing right now is winning as much as we can."

LaRose Aiming at Second Graded Stakes Win

Earlier in the meet, trainer Kinnon LaRose, in his first Saratoga summer running a stable, got his first graded stakes win when Stress Relief (**Not This Time**) won the GIII Adirondack.

The 29-year-old LaRose, who spent six years as an assistant to Tom Amoss, took over when Amoss retired in April. On Sunday, he'll be looking for stakes win No. 2 when he saddles Oscar's Hope (**Twirling Candy**) in the GIII Mahony, a 5 1/2-furlong sprint on the Mellon Turf Course for 3-year-olds.

Owned by Michael McLoughlin, Oscar's Hope, will be making his first start on grass after 10 career starts (four wins, three seconds and a third) on dirt.

"We're trying something different with him," LaRose said at his barn on the Saratoga backstretch. "He has handled the grass well in the morning and we are willing to give him a shot."

Oscar's Hope is one of three horses in the seven-horse field with 8-1 morning-line odds. The heavy favorite is even-money morning line choice Outfielder (Speightstown), who was last seen finishing 10th in the GI Commonwealth Cup Stakes at Royal Ascot in June.

LaRose, the former basketball player at Siena College (now University) and Sacred Heart University (he showed he could still shoot it when he nailed several 3-pointers in the annual jockey-trainer basketball game earlier this month"), enjoyed the taste of a Saratoga stake.

Now, he wants another helping.

"I was telling someone the other day, when you win a stake, you want to get back there right away," he said. "This is the summer place to be. We are very grateful to be here and we are blessed to have some good horses and some good owners that are behind us. We are just going to take it day by day, keep it simple and keep on rolling."

Give it three inches and it's a three-way dead heat for the win in the 2026 running of the GII King Edward Stakes, but fortune smiled upon defending champion **Gas Me Up** (**Hard Spun**) as he found the wire just in time to score.

The connections always thought highly of their runner as they sent him straight to the GI Woodbine Mile after his win in this contest last year, and then on to the GI Breeders' Cup Mile at Del Mar when he ran third behind Godolphin's classy Notable Speech (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) and MGISP My Boy Prince (**Cairo Prince**) in the local marquee race.

While the World Championships didn't pan out, they left Gas Me Up in California in the barn of Peter Eurton. He collected a win in the GII Joe Hernandez Stakes Dec. 29 and a runner-up Feb. 7 in the GIII Thunder Road Stakes before returning to Canada--and to the barn of Kevin Attard--after a freshening when he missed the board in the GII Frank E. Kilroe Mile Mar. 7.

Breaking well here as the 2-1 favorite with **Irish Aces** (Mshawish) going off close behind in the wagering, he watched the race unfold rather erratically in the opening stages when **Piper's Factor** (**The Factor**) went deep into the course and then tried to cut over going into the bend. That runner led the procession after that through :23 flat and a half-mile in :46.50 with Irish Aces tracking along the inside and Gas Me Up in the middle of the short field as they went up the backstretch.

The group closed ranks swinging through the far bend and Piper's Factor was still in front when they straightened out. Closing stoutly from the overland route as Irish Aces rallied up the fence after leaving it to avoid a drifting Piper's Factor, the trio dove for the wire noses apart and it took the placing judges a moment to separate them.

Gas Me Up got the lucky bob by the tiniest of noses over Piper's Factor while Irish Aces ran third by a similar margin. The final time was 1:35.44, barely a second off the track record.

While the connections were left to sweat out the result, for his part, jockey Fraser Aebly knew he'd won the race, saying, "Yeah, I did [know that he got up just in time]. Really."

"I've had the chance to ride him previously for [trainer] Kevin [Attard] and I love the way [Gas Me Up] runs. He's a big, strong horse who gives you everything he's got every time and he showed that today."

"This is a real cool horse," said Attard from the winner's circle. "Obviously, he had a great winter in California this year. I'm happy to get him back [after he got a refreshing]...and the owners have done right by him. He's rewarded them very well."

"I was a little bit more worried on this [inner] course. On the outer course, he absolutely loves it, so looking forward to getting him back there next month [for the GI Woodbine Mile]."

"Irish Aces is such a game horse. He runs his tail off every time out," said Pocket Aces Racing's Jared Shoemaker of the narrow third-place finisher. "He's been so so close so many times to that graded stakes win. He's going to break through soon. I love this horse."

The chart notes mention that **G T Five Hundred** (Astern {Aus}), who had defeated Irish Aces last out in the GII Connaught Cup, bled during the running of this contest and had to be transported off the course via an equine ambulance after finishing far out of it.

Pedigree Notes:

Gas Me Up is the second runner to the races for Chic Thrill (Smart Strike) and one of three stakes runners for that broodmare. His full-brother Give It a Whirl is a stakes-winning steeplechase horse while his 3-year-old half-sister C'est Chouette (**Gun Runner**) is stakes-placed in the Listed Shamrock Rose. Their dam has a juvenile colt by Uncle Mo in the wings as well as a yearling full-brother to this victor. She was bred to **Not This Time** for 2027.

Second dam Catch the Thrill (A.P. Indy) was Canada's champion juvenile filly during her racing career, and is herself the daughter of Catch the Ring (Seeking the Gold), the Sovereign Award winner as a 3-year-old filly. This is the distant female family of MGSW & GISP **Messier** (Empire Maker) as well as MGSW Southern Ring (Speightstown).

Winless in five prior starts this season, Proctor Street broke through with a narrow victory over 8-5 choice Eponine (Ire) in Saturday's GII Canadian Stakes on Woodbine's King's Plate undercard.

Smoothly away from post 6, Proctor Street was eased to the back by Pietro Moran as Lupa (Ire) the compact field into the first turn. Lupa, who continued to show the way ahead of War Painter and Eponine, completed the half in :46.46. Meanwhile, Proctor Street enjoyed a ground-saving position near the back, within striking distance and only five lengths behind the pace.

Inching closer leaving the far turn, the 5-1 chance ranged into contention, and needed some daylight to open up in front of her. Finally gaining the opportunity she needed turning for home, the 5-year-old took aim at the leading Lupa and Eponine, who remained in close pursuit, and gradually ground her way to the front to win by a neck over the favorite. The pacesetter held on for third.

"She loves to race and the one thing you can always guarantee with this mare is she will try her heart out for you," said Erin Campbell, assistant trainer to Brendan Walsh.

On the board in all five starts last season, Proctor Street won at Saratoga facing optional claiming company before finishing third in the Spa's one-mile Perfect Sting Stakes. She rounded out her 4-year-old campaign with a pair of victories--an allowance score at Keeneland in addition to the nine-furlong Cardinal Stakes at Churchill Downs in November.

Launching her five-year-old campaign, she was eighth in the GI Pegasus World Cup Filly & Mare Turf before getting caught late to be third in the GII Hillsborough over nine furlongs at Tampa in March. Returning to Louisville for her next two, she was third in the GII Modesty on May 1 before finishing a close-up second in the GIII Mint Julep on May 30. Sent off at 5-1 for the restricted De La Rose Stakes at Saratoga on July 17, the dark bay was a troubled third, beaten 3 1/4 lengths by And One More Time (**Not This Time**).

Pedigree Notes:

Proctor Street is the 46th group/graded winner for her Kentucky Derby winning sire, **Street Sense**.

The MGSW and GISP turf mare Proctor's Ledge produced a full-brother to Proctor Street in 2022. Both mare and her Medaglia d'Oro foal died in 2024.

BISHOPS BAY TURNS BACK CHUNK OF GOLD TO WIN PHILIP ISELIN *by Patrycja Szpyra*

It was another battle down to the wire for 'TDN Rising Star, presented by Hagyard' **Bishops Bay** (Uncle Mo), and this time he would not be denied, valiantly re-rallying to take the GIII Philip H. Iselin Stakes at Monmouth Park.

With a field of four left after scratches, most people knew it would be a contest where ultra-consistent Bishops Bay would make sure that he had the final say. His track record spoke for itself--16 lifetime starts and 14 times he's been on the board. His lone two finishes out of the money where last year in the GI Forego won by New Jersey's favorite son Book'em Danno (**Bucchero**) and in this year's G1 Saudi Cup, where he ran fourth behind globetrotting superstar Forever Young (Jpn) (Real Steel {Jpn}), MGISW Nysos (**Nyquist**), and Wathnan Racing's ever-classy multiple Group 1-placed and multiple Graded winner Tumbaramba (**Oscar Performance**).

Since that Saudi Cup effort, he returned Stateside and again showed his mettle against salty competition--running second May 3 in the GIII Westchester Stakes behind GISW Antiquarian (Preservationist) and battling returning rival GISW **East Avenue** (Medaglia d'Oro) to the bitter end last out June 13 in this venue's GIII Salvator Mile.

The betting public leaned in favor of the Godolphin colorbearer this time around, but right from the jump, it was 3-1 shot **Chunk of Gold** (Preservationist) who had his mind set on running. The grey sailed along through :23.43 and a half in :46.92 with Bishops Bay glued to his outside flank. East Avenue chased along in third and **La Frost** (Frosted), the remaining entrant, cabooseed the field in last.

After six furlongs in 1:10.37, the top pair began to distance themselves from the remaining two and it quickly became clear that it was not East Avenue's day as the 20-1 longest shot on the board overtook him turning for home. Up front, Bishops Bay and Chunk of Gold had locked horns for the stretch drive and would not give an inch either way until the final yards when the former finally managed to put a neck on his competition. La Frost closed the trifecta as the favorite galloped in last.

Pedigree Note:

Bishops Bay is a half-brother to GSW & GISP Catching Freedom (**Constitution**) and MSP Strava (Into Mischief). Their dam Catch My Drift (Pioneerof the Nile) was Grade I-placed in her time on the track and a Listed winner at Saratoga. Since the trio of stakes runners, she's also produced the winning Indeed (Improbable), placed Uncatchable (**Not This Time**), and has two fillies in the wings--a yearling full-sister to Bishops Bay and a 2026 **Constitution**. The broodmare was bred by **Nyquist** for 2027.

Catch My Drift is the most accomplished offspring for the second dam, though her winning half-sister The Girl Factor (**The Factor**) is a black type producer as well as she claims Venezuelan Listed winner Nikitis (**Audible**) to her credit. This is the immediate female family of MSW Mindy Sue (Pleasantly Perfect), mother of MSP Malibu Max (Malibu Moon), and her half-brother MSP Our Dark Knight (Medaglia d'Oro).

One year ago, jockey Emma-Jayne Wilson was watching the King's Plate Day card from the sidelines while recovering from injury. Fast forward to 2026, the resilient rider gained a razor-edge decision in Woodbine's GIII Bold Venture Stakes.

Last season's Plate contender Notorious Gangster took the money at the windows, getting backed down to 4-5 favoritism by post time. Meanwhile, Souped Up--fifth last time out as the favorite in the six-furlong Pink Lloyd Stakes on July 5--was sent off at 10-1.

Breaking like a shot, 9-2 chance Western Whirl went to the front and Souped Up, exiting the 7 hole, was hustled into contention as well. With the top pair carving out an initial quarter in :23.10, the favorite was reserved in a three-wide fifth. With Western Whirl narrowly ahead of Souped Up straightening for home, Notorious Gangster started to grind his way into contention midpack, and while the favorite made some headway late, it was Souped Up who gained a narrow advantage late en route to a head decision. Notorious Gangster was up for third while Its Bourbon Thirty (Outwork) closed resolutely to complete the exacta.

"The trip was beauty," Wilson said. "I was sitting just off him, and when I asked [Souped Up] to dig, he dug, and every time I asked him for more, he gave me more...I was quite confident that I won it, but I waited...until I was unofficially informed, and I gave myself a bit of a shout out loud. I was pretty happy with that."

Claimed for \$25,000 in the summer of his sophomore season, the Ontario-bred gelding placed in restricted stakes company later that season. A winner of three of eight starts at four, he finished runner-up in his sole black-type attempt in the Pink Lloyd.

On the board in both starts last term, including a 1/2-length second in a seven-furlong optional claimer last November, the 6-year-old kicked off 2026 on a winning note, taking a six-panel optional claiming test on June 21.

"This horse comes every single time to play," added Wilson. "I rode him quite a few years back, and I've always been a fan of his."

Pedigree Notes:

With Saturday's Bold Venture victory, Souped Up becomes the second graded/group winner for his sire, Souper Speedy. The second foal out of unraced Jevina, Souped Up has an unraced juvenile sister by **Modernist** and a yearling full-sister.

SARATOGA UPDATES: ENGLISHMAN ON TRACK FOR H. ALLEN JERKENS, ASMUSSEN STABLE EYES FUTURE TARGETS

Trainers Cherie DeVaux and Steve Asmussen reported in on their Saratoga winners Saturday morning with the former providing updates on **Englishman** (**Maxfield**) and **Remember Mamba** (Kitten's Joy) and the latter offering a good prognosis for recent Smart and Fancy victress **Zeitlos** (**Curlin**).

The DeVaux barns at Keeneland and Saratoga were active ones over the last couple days as Englishman continued preparations for his upcoming target. Dual Classic winner **Golden Tempo** (**Curlin**) was also out, and you can read DeVaux's thoughts on his progress in Tim Wilkin's **Saratoga Notebook segment**.

Englishman cruised four panels in :49 flat (26.49) on Friday at Keeneland, and remains on track for the GI H. Allen Jerkens Memorial Aug. 29 at Saratoga. DeVaux has said that he will ship

to New York the week of the race. Remember Mamba, fourth in the GI Saratoga Derby, came out of the contest in good shape physically, but his trainer believes that the colt needs a mental shift more than anything else.

"I was a little concerned prior to the [Saratoga Derby]," said DeVaux. "In the paddock, he was quiet, and he kind of ran that way. I'm not really sure Saratoga is his favorite place, so we are going to regroup [and] probably run him back at Keeneland [in the GIII Bryan Station Stakes Oct. 24]."

In addition to those 'TDN Rising Stars, presented by Hagyard', the trainer also provided insights and targets for **Supercharger** (**Constitution**). The GII Secretariat Stakes victor will return to Colonials Downs to make his next appearance in the GIII Old Dominion Derby Sept. 7.

Zeitlos in Good Form, Magnitude to Train Up to the Classic

Zeitlos collected her first stakes win on the lawn in Friday's Smart and Fancy Stakes, and has emerged from her effort in good shape.

"She came back really good," Asmussen said. "She's been excellent to us and obviously continues to do so. That was a big win."

Her potential upcoming targets remain the GI Ladies Turf Sprint Aug. 29 at Kentucky Downs or a try for a second win in the GII Thoroughbred Club of America Stakes Oct. 3 at Keeneland.

Impressive 'Rising Star' **Summer Starlet** (**City of Light**) is targeting the GI Spinaway Stakes Sept. 5, a 'WAYI' event for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, and GIII Sanford victor **Booked** (Yaupon) remains on track for a tilt in the GI Spendthrift Farm Hopeful Stakes Sept. 6.

"I expected [Booked] to win, and he was second, so we need to improve," Asmussen said.

Asmussen also offered updates on fellow 'Rising Stars' **Obliteration** (**Violence**) and **Magnitude** (**Not This Time**), who are doing well and remain on target for their next races. The former points to the GI H. Allen Jerkens Memorial and the latter will likely train up to the Breeders' Cup Classic.

JOE HARPER NAMED LAFFIT PINCAY JR. AWARD WINNER

Joe Harper, the chief executive officer of the Del Mar Thoroughbred Club (DMTC) who will be retiring from his position at the end of the year, has been named the 22nd winner of the Laffit Pincay Jr. Award, the track announced Saturday.

Named for and presented by the Hall of Fame rider, the award recognizes those who have served the sport of racing "with integrity, extraordinary dedication, determination and distinction." Harper, 83, recently announced his impending retirement from his full-time position, and his transition to the title CEO Emeritus at the end of 2026. He would still serve as part of the DMTC Board of Directors.

Harper will be honored Saturday, Aug. 22 on Pacific Classic Day, the track's premier Grade I event and a 'Win and You're In' contest to the Breeders' Cup Classic--an event he was instrumental in bringing to the seaside oval on four separate occasions.

'A REAL GOOSEBUMPER'... INTO MISCHIEF'S LIBBY LLOYD EARNS 'TDN RISING STAR' AT THE SPA

Bret Jones and his family have fond memories of breeding and racing Indian Pride (Proud Citizen), who carried the house colors for the late Governor Brereton C. Jones.

Under trainer Chad Brown at the Spa in 2019, Indian Pride debuted with an eight-length romp.

On Saturday over the same surface her filly **Libby Lloyd (Into Mischief--Indian Pride, by Proud Citizen)**--named after Bret Jones's mother--replicated the feat and like her mare earned a 'TDN Rising Star, presented by Hagyard,' for the splendid effort.

An **'Insight'** runner who was sent off as the 6-5 choice here, Libby Lloyd singed out of the blocks with flames emanating from her hooves. Her speed as she set the fractions up the backstretch.

The 2-year-old Brown trainee meant business around the far turn and she entered the lane with more to give.

Extending her lead to 10, which bested what her mare did in 2019, Libby Lloyd won for fun.

The other **'Insighted'** runners finished as follows: **Groves (Flightline)** was the runner-up; **Free Verse (Justify)** was third; **Tumoohaat (Into Mischief)** was fifth; and the scratches were **V Formation (Drain the Clock)** and **Oneinamilliongirl (Audible)**.

"That was a real goosebump for us." Airdrie Stud's Bret Jones told the *TDN*. "Pretty remarkable how similar it was to her dam, Indian Pride's debut. I immediately texted Chad that it brought back a lot of memories. Indian Pride had come along when my Dad's health was failing and I showed him her first race over and over again, and it always pumped him up.

"We had some great days with Indian Pride and I always told Chad we'd send him one of her daughters if they were acting like they could be okay," said Jones. "This filly always has been pretty special, so we made that commitment to him a while ago. Just as you'd expect, he and his team have done an absolutely brilliant job preparing her to do what she just did today."

Indian Pride's first foal is GI Arkansas Derby runner-up Publisher (**American Pharoah**), SW & GISP, \$806,851 and her last is a filly by **Gun Runner** who arrived in 2025.

The winner's mare is herself a half-sister to Canadian Horse of the Year Biofuel (Stormin Fever), who happens to be the second dam of **Road Show (Roadster)**, the winner of the third race on the Saratoga card.

Indian Pride is also a half to Canadian champion 2-year-old filly Tu Endie Wei (Johar) and the dam MGSW Mrs. Astor (Lookin At Lucky).

Libby Lloyd marks the 62nd 'TDN Rising Star, presented by Hagyard' for her stellar multiple leading sire, Into Mischief.

Q B ROCKET RUNS TO HIS PRICETAG, BECOMES A NEW 'RISING STAR' by Alan Carasso

Spendthrift Farm and Frank Fletcher Racing Operation's **Q B Rocket (c, 2, Gun Runner--Ginja, by Quality Road)** was the pari-mutuel darling in a good-looking collection of 2-year-old males assembled for Saturday's eighth race maiden over six furlongs and ran to those odds and his \$1.9-million purchase price at auction to become the afternoon's second 'TDN Rising Star presented by Hagyard,' at Saratoga.

With Junior Alvarado deputizing for the injured Irad Ortiz, Jr., the athletic dark bay colt was beaten to the front by the twice-raced **Decimation** (Jackie's Warrior), but Q B Rocket was sent through at the fence by Alvarado to take up the running while barely being asked to do so approaching the entrance to the turn after a quarter in :22.66

The 5-4 favorite carried a narrow advantage around the turn and into the stretch while still being very quietly ridden as Decimation continued to give chase.

But, under hands-and-heels urging only, Q B Rocket widened his advantage and was taken well in hand late, scoring by a deceptively easy margin.

The well-meant **Card Man (Life Is Good)** sat a good inside trip and popped out three wide for the drive, but was no match for the winner while hitting the line willingly. The final time of 1:10.70 was 0.10 quicker than the one recorded by the day's first 'Rising Star', Libby Lloyd (Into Mischief) two races prior.

Q B Rocket continues a banner week in Saratoga for Three Chimneys' superstar sire **Gun Runner**.

During the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Sale held last Monday and Tuesday, the 13-year-old stallion was responsible for 16 sales (18 ring) for a remarkable \$22,825,000, a number that translated into 19.2% of the total gross of \$118,640,000. His son of Four Graces (Majesticperfection), a half-sister to MGSW & GISP McCracken (Ghostzapper), was sold to Flying Dutchmen for \$4 million, one of his 10 youngsters that changed hands for prices in the seven figures.

Q B Rocket was bred on a foal share by the **Gun Runner** Syndicate and trainer Bob Baffert, whose wife Natalie (Jill) raced the colt's dam Ginja (**Quality Road**) to a maiden victory and a black-type placing from 11 trips to the post for earnings just north of \$106,000.

Ginja has plenty of pedigree to recommend her, as her half-sister Top Decile (Congrats)--second in the GI Darley Alcibiades Stakes and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies in 2014--is the dam of Danon Decile (Jpn) (Epiphaneia {Jpn}), who won the G1 Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby) a little more than two months after Q B Rocket was foaled in March 2024. Ginja was purchased by Japanese interests for \$290,000 in foal to **Cody's Wish** at the 2024 Fasig-Tipton November Sale and the in-utero colt sold for the equivalent of \$223,730 as a foal at the 2025 JRHA Select Sale. Danon Decile has since padded his resume with a victory in the 2025 G1 Dubai Sheema Classic. Ginja's most recent produce is a colt by the sire of Danon Decile foaled this past Apr. 2.

Q B Rocket is the 25th 'TDN Rising Star' for **Gun Runner**, who is responsible for one other winner out of a **Quality Road** mare, namely Jumping the Gun, a stakes winner at two, second in this year's GII Black-Eyed Susan Stakes and GIII Delaware Oaks and a latest third in the GIII Monmouth Oaks.

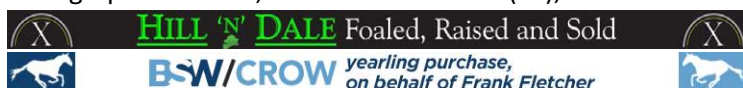

The \$2.1-million Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Sale topper **Inshallah** (**Flightline**), whose name translated from arabic means 'God willing,' had both the will and the way Saturday, rocketing out from the gate at Del Mar and opening up an insurmountable margin to win his debut in 'TDN Rising Star' fashion.

Purchased by bloodstock agent Pedro Lantz in May on behalf of KAS Stables, the racing operation owned by Saudi Arabia's King Abdullah bin Abdulaziz and his sons, Inshallah was bred in New York by Chester and Mary Broman and is the latest to the races out of their Breeders' Cup hero Bar of Gold.

The '**Insighted**' colt was bet down to 3-5 in this stacked maiden special weight field. The heavy favorite broke in a line but was pushed upon by jockey Joel Rosario to clear in the opening furlong and did so easily, going right out to the front and putting several lengths on the rest of the field by the time the opening quarter ticked by in :21.52.

Under a motionless Rosario, Inshallah turned for home looking very much like his undefeated sire and, while fellow firster Icanhelpmyself (Mo Town) did well to cut into the margin late, it was all for naught as the favorite was a clear, wrapped-up winner.

“We thought we had a good prospect,” trainer John Sadler told the *TDN* post race. “[He was] faster than I thought.”

Inshallah is the fifth winner for his freshman sire (by **Tapit**) and his second 'TDN Rising Star', joining Flight Command.

GISW Bar of Gold, who took down the 2017 Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint en route to earning more than \$1.5 million on the track, has seen plenty of success in her young broodmare career as well. Her first foal, 2019's Coinage (**Tapit**), won the GIII With Anticipation Stakes and she now has four winners from five to race. Bar of Gold, herself is a full-sister to MGISW Spirit of St Louis, lost her 2025 full-sibling to Inshallah but did produce a **Not This Time** filly this spring and was covered by **Mindframe** for 2027.

Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners' **DIGNIFY (Justify)**, a \$700,000 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga acquisition, is the first foal from Season Ticket (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), an unraced half-sister to the legendary Tepin (Bernstein), a two-time Eclipse Award winner whose half-dozen elite-level successes included a famous victory in the G1 Queen Anne Stakes at Royal Ascot in 2016 in addition to the G1 Breeders' Cup Mile the previous fall. Though Tepin sadly passed away in 2023, she has left her mark on the breed as the dam of dual Group 1 winner **Delacroix (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) and the top stayer Grateful (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). Tepin's year-old half-brother Vyjack (Into Mischief) was a dual graded winner on

both turf and dirt. BBA Ireland purchased Season Ticket with this colt in utero for \$450,000 at Keeneland November in 2023. The cross of **Justify** over Galileo is responsible for 10 stakes winners from 75 starters to date.

Real Restraint (Authentic) is a homebred half-brother to recent GII Caress Stakes heroine Movin' On Up (Accelerate) and was produced by a half-sister to Grade III winner and Classic-placed Gosger (**Nyquist**) and Harvey's Lil Goil (**American Pharoah**), victorious in the GI QE II Challenge Cup on the turf and a stakes winner and Grade I-placed on the dirt. Third dam Arch's Gal Edith (Arch) bred dual Classic winner and champion 3-year-old male I'll Have Another (Flower Alley) and MGSW Golden Award (Medaglia d'Oro).

Culpable (Street Sense), a half-brother to last year's GII Pilgrim Stakes third Let's Be Frank (**Liam's Map**), is a son of Proudly (Kor), a full-sister to GI Kentucky Oaks winner Serengeti Empress (Alternation), herself the dam of the SP & \$1.2-million Keeneland September yearling Invictus (Into Mischief). **TJCS PPs Cont.**

PERMANENT RECORD (GB) (New Bay {GB}), a 10th U.S. runner for his Ballylinch Stud-based stallion, was purchased by Oceanic Bloodstock for 180,000gns (\$252,327) on behalf of Seth Klarman's Klaravich Stables out of last year's Tattersalls October Sale and will have to overcome a high draw on debut. The Feb. 23 foal is the first produce from the winning Electress (GB) (Galileo {Ire}), whose dam Just the Judge (Ire) (Lawman {Fr}) won the 2013 G1 Irish 1000 Guineas and took the GI E.P. Taylor Stakes before finishing third in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf the following season. Just the Judge is the granddam of Venetian Lace (Ire) (Masar {Ire}), runner-up in the G1 Fillies' Mile last term and a longshot third in this year's G1 English 1000 Guineas.

After having to settle for third in her last two starts over this surface and distance, Cadenza finally broke through Saturday to win the Galway Stakes at Saratoga for trainer Brad Cox.

But confidently handled by Manny Franco, Cadenza settled nicely, saved her energy and unleashed it with a wide rally to circle the field at the furlong pole. Despite drifting in a bit close to home, she prevailed easily over Epic Lady Luck.

"Definitely wasn't the trip that we expected because she got left out of the gate," Franco said. "I'm in the back of the pack, but at the same time it worked out great. They were moving in front, so I was happy. By the three-eighths pole, I took her to the outside and she started eating up ground. I was happy with the way she was doing it."

Cox added: "She breezed awfully well [on the Oklahoma turf course] last week, so I had confidence she was going to run a big race, but, yeah, I guess there is always a concern [if] she would handle [yielding turf], but she took to it today."

One of seven stakes winners from **Charlatan**'s first crop, Cadenza has plenty of successful half-siblings out of her stakes-placed first dam. Maddie's Odyssey has a yearling **Olympiad** colt and a weanling colt by **Arabian Knight**. 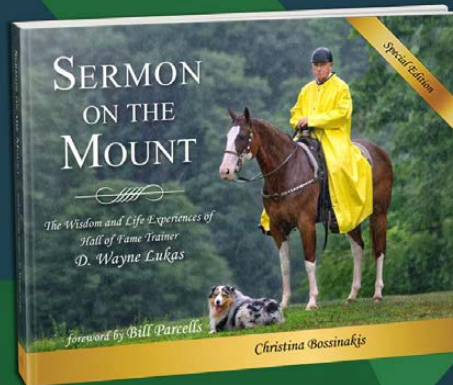

DEAUVILLE, France — It was in Deauville that Joie De Soir did all her best work as a racehorse, winning the Listed Grand Prix de Clairefontaine and Listed Prix du Carrousel, and the trend has continued for the eight-year-old daughter of Fastnet Rock, whose **Justify** colt brought the ring to life at Arqana when selling for €1.25m to Godolphin.

Bred by Rockhart Trading, the pseudonym of Eddie Irwin's Marlhill House Stud, the colt was bought in utero by the breeder for 750,000gns at the Tattersalls December Mares Sale.

Standing with Marlhill House Stud's manager Brian McConnon, Irwin said, "We've been upgrading our mares for the last four or five years, and she's the most expensive mare we've bought. It was more than I thought we were going to pay for her but I have to thank [the late] Clem Murphy. He pushed me into it and it was good advice. He said to me on the day, 'Of everything you're looking at, she's the one you shouldn't leave behind. She's by Fastnet Rock out of a Galileo mare, which is a fantastic cross. We've had a huge involvement with Fastnet Rock, we were involved in racing, and the Fastnet Rock-**Justify** cross was working well at the time.'" **Cont. p3**

"He's been a slow-maturing horse, but he's run better and better and improved again when he ran at Saint-Cloud," said racing manager Teddy Grimthorpe. "He went well in his last piece of work on Tuesday, which was really encouraging, and, as a Group 2 winner by **Frankel**, he is something special. The options are becoming more rarified, so we will focus on next year and, as he loves the fast ground, it probably won't be Longchamp."

Joie De Soir is herself out of the unraced mare Highest Ever (Galileo), a daughter of the G1 Prix Jean Romanet winner Alpine Rose (Linamix) who had been bought in the same ring 13 years ago by Coolmore for €1m.

The colt was consigned for Marlhill House Stud by Charles Briere of Fairway Consignment, which also offers a colt from the first crop of **Paddington** out of dual Listed winner Thai Haku (Oasis Dream) on Monday as lot 198.

McConnon said, "It's our first year with him and he runs a very professional operation, they've done a great job. I really have to thank them. And Shane McAleese, who led him up, he's been with us for 10 years now."

Irwin added, "We've sold a few nice horses here over the years. It depends on what we have from year to year, whether we have one that Brian is

happy that we can prep early enough for the August Sale.

"The horse behaved impeccably and all the guys have done a fantastic job, because getting them here with the long boat journey, they don't always arrive in perfect condition, but these

two that we brought this year have done. I was delighted that they travelled so well in the middle of a heatwave."

Anthony Stroud, who bought the colt on behalf of Godolphin – the same team which also combined in the buying and racing of **Justify's** 2,000 Guineas winner Ruling Court – was full of praise for the individual and for his sire.

"He's an extremely nice horse - beautiful conformation and from an excellent farm," Stroud said. "And of course, **Justify** is doing so well. He's a wonderful stallion and we're

He added, "I think you are going to find strong competition for any horse that you really want. When they have a good pedigree and the conformation to match, the competition can be strong. I thought the market so far looked good. It's very difficult to value these horses when they get to a certain level. It's really whether all of the principals [within Godolphin] have seen enough that they want to progress [with their bidding]. Ultimately, we want him to be a top-class horse – to be a Group horse, really. That is the intention no matter how much you spend. Whatever price a horse costs, the ultimate aim is for them to be a good horse. It is no different because of the price tag."

With two sessions still to come, the Arqana August Sale has got off to a positive start, with the first-day turnover of €13,966,000 being up 20 per cent on the equivalent session last year. The average of €249,393 represented a rise of 7 per cent, while the clearance rate of 79 per cent, for 56 horses sold from 71 offered, was up by 9 per cent. The median was €200,000.

Stall Perlen Digs Deep for Wootton Bassett Colt

Baroda Stud's largest-ever draft of horses for Arqana August included lot 43, a strong colt from the penultimate crop of the

late Wootton Bassett out of G3 1,000 Guineas Trial winner Just Pretending (Giant's Causeway) who had been widely tipped to play a prominent role on the first day of trade, and this it proved.

The half-brother to the stakes-placed winners Visage and Persia, both by Galileo, eventually went the way of Ross Doyle for €800,000 after a protracted bidding bout which included Jaber Abdullah. [Cont. p5](#)

Confirming that the colt had been bought for Magne Jordanger of Stall Perlen, one of the largest owners in Scandinavia, Doyle added, "I'm very lucky that I had a chance to buy him and I really appreciate it. Stall Perlen has moved into France now and they have horses with Pia Brandt and I imagine that's where he'll be going."

Baroda Stud's David Cox was delighted with the result for the colt he said had been "grabbing people's attention" since the day he arrived at Arqana.

"They are not making any more Wootton Bassetts," he added. "I had in my head that he might make €400,000 or €500,000. I knew Jaber Abdullah was interested and, when two buyers lock horns, that's what can happen."

Jaber Abdullah Strikes for Mehmas Filly

Jaber Abdullah may have filled the role as underbidder on the €800,000 Wootton Bassett but he did not leave empty-handed on day when as he secured a Mehmas filly from Haras de l'Hotellerie for €440,000.

Rabbah Bloodstock manager David Ryan commented, "This filly reminded Mr Jaber Abdullah of Queen's Logic [G1 Cheveley Park Stakes heroine], who he bought here himself in 2000. She is beautiful and a very good physical specimen. Let's hope she can run! Bassett (lot 43) while NBA star Tony Parker of Infinity Thoroughbreds was another recipient of a Golden Ticket when striking late in the sale for lot 79, a first-crop **Vadeni** filly from La Motteraye Consignment, who was knocked down at €105,000.

COPPULL TOO STRONG IN THE HUNGERFORD

Up to seven furlongs for the first time in Newbury's G2 Visit Malta Hungerford Stakes on Saturday, David Armstrong's **Coppull (Bated Breath)** successfully carried his speed to regain the winning thread.

Last seen mixing it with the best sprinters when fourth in the July Cup, last year's Richmond Stakes winner and Middle Park third who had also taken the Commonwealth Cup Trial in the spring enjoyed a lead initially before being taken wide by Hector Crouch to race on his own terms before halfway. Strong to the line, the 15-2 shot had 1 1/4 lengths to spare over **Prince Of**

India (Wootton Bassett) there, with the 5-2 favourite **Symbol Of Honour** (Havana Grey) 3/4 of a length away in third.

"That will give him a bit of confidence more than anything. The way he has won that, with such authority, was class," trainer Clive Cox said. "We won this race for the first time with Lethal Force back in 2012 and it was similar, as he made the running that day."

Coppull had been eighth in the Commonwealth Cup before finishing in the mix at Newmarket, where Cox believed he was a touch unlucky. "I was a little bit deflated as we were so near, yet so far in the July Cup and he didn't get the best run but these things happen in racing," he added. "Those top-quality sprinters have the ability to stay that little bit further and they need to for the speed of those six-furlong races. That was why I was drawn here and thankfully that will give us a whole load of confidence which puts us back in the fast lane where we want to be."

Future targets are plentiful now that the winner has proven his ability to stay this far, but his trainer is eyeing a return to six if things fall right. "I'm still not convinced he likes it really soft, but with the dry summer we have had we have the choice to run in the Sprint Cup at Haydock," he said. "We still have the Park Stakes over seven, but he'd have a penalty in that now." [Cont. p14](#)

Gaining overdue reward for his consistency, Victorious Forever's recent acquisition **Wimbledon Hawkeye** (Kameko) made it a third Stakes win in Saturday's G3 Prix Gontaut-Biron Hong Kong Jockey Club at Deauville.

Having collected the Royal Lodge at two and last year's **Nashville Derby**, the four-year-old had run his last race in the colours of his breeders the Gredley Family when second to **Map Of Stars (Sea The Stars)** in Royal Ascot's Wolferton Stakes. Third in Munich's Grosser Dallmayr-Preis after the switch from James Owen and George Scott, he lined up the 5-1 second favourite here and tracked the leaders under Christophe Soumillon before committing approaching the furlong pole. Chased to the line by Map Of Stars, he found extra reserves to ward off his old rival and reverse Ascot form with a neck verdict.

"We were hoping he'd improved from Germany and he was very relaxed today," Scott said. "We are thinking of taking him to the Kentucky Downs meeting, or he could go for the Irish Champion Stakes and the Champion Stakes later on. There's no reason not to go to the highest level, it was a very good race today so I'll talk to the team and work out our plan for the rest of the season."

WINE DARK SEA MELBOURNE CUP-BOUND AFTER MAKING BREAKTHROUGH IN NEWBURY'S GEOFFREY FREER

Harry Charlton trainee **Wine Dark Sea** (Ulysses) lowered the Carlisle track record when thundering to a 13-length tally in June's Cumberland Plate and, despite running below par in his latest start, is now G1 Melbourne Cup-bound after rebounding in style in Saturday's G3 Highclere Thoroughbred Racing Geoffrey Freer Stakes at Newbury.

The winner will enter quarantine Sept. 9, en route to a tilt at November's G1 Melbourne Cup.

"The intention was to finish third, which would help with the ballot qualification for the Melbourne Cup, and he has done more than that," Charlton explained. "The Aussies who I'm dealing with were saying finish third and they won't change his handicap mark. It is very different how they do it. He won on the bridle at Carlisle and broke the track record carrying top weight. You can't have an easy race, particularly travelling eight hours in a heatwave, and 10 days later we just saw a slightly flat horse. My brother [Tom] trains in Australia and has a Melbourne Cup runner as well. I have a team going down with the horse and you train out of the quarantine barn at Ballarat."

Breaking swiftest of five and in command throughout, the 7-2 third choice was nudged along with three furlongs remaining

and stayed on relentlessly under a drive in the latter stages to defeat **Tabletalk** ([Camelot](#)) and **Dubai Honour** (Pride Of Dubai) by 1 1/2 lengths and a neck for a career high.

Sent straight to the front by Billy Loughnane, the Charlie Appleby-trained 1-3 favourite was in command at every step and drew away in his sire's own relentless fashion to record a bloodless 8 1/2-length success. The Gosdens' **Waaqed (Frankel)** was next in line, three lengths ahead of **Al Qayed** (Baaed) from the William Haggas stable.

"He was very straightforward at home and being by Ghaiyyath he has that big stride so I let him use it," Loughnane said of the sire's fourth TDN Rising Star, with Opera Ballo chief among them at present. "He's a big, imposing horse and he clicked through the gears nicely. Whatever he does this year is a bonus and he's smart horse with a nice future. That was very easy work for him and with more pace to aim at you'll see a better horse."

Bin Jahwar is a son of the smart Tasaday (Nayef), who captured the Prix de la Nonette, Prix des Reservoirs and Prix de Psyche and was placed in the Poule d'Essai des Pouliches, Prix de l'Opera, Prix Vermeille and Yorkshire Oaks. Her first foal was the past TDN Rising Star Turgenev (Dubawi), who was runner-up in the Celebration Mile, with her second runner being the Prix Chaudenay and Nad Al Sheba Trophy scorer Manobo (**Sea The Stars**).

CHAMPION TRAWLERMAN RETIRED DUE TO INJURY

Star stayer **Trawlerman** has been retired after sustaining a tendon lesion, Godolphin announced on Saturday. The son of Golden Horn had been preparing for next week's G2 Lonsdale Cup at York.

A homebred in the royal blue, the gelding broke his maiden at three, and was third in the G2 British Champions Long Distance Cup a year later. During his 2023 campaign, Trawlerman managed a three-race winning sequence culminating in a victory in the British Champions Long Distance Cup. Winless in 2024, the gelding finished second to rival Kyprios (Galileo) in the G1 Gold Cup at Ascot and ran third to that foe in the British Champions Long Distance Cup. **Cont. p19**

Trawlerman Retired Cont.

In 2025, Trawlerman enjoyed his best year on the track, winning the G3 Henry II Stakes, the Gold Cup, the Lonsdale Cup, and the newly upgraded G1 British Champions Long Distance Cup in succession. Diagnosed with a rare eye condition that causes sensitivity to light, trainers John and Thady Gosden carefully managed his training in 2026, and Trawlerman finished runner-up in both the Gold Cup and the G1 Goodwood Cup Stakes behind new rival Scandinavia (**Justify**). The eight-year-old retires with a mark of 25-11-3-5 and earnings of \$2,766,071.

John Gosden said, "Trawlerman is happy and well, but unfortunately he came out of the Goodwood Cup with a leg issue and is now being retired.

"At eight years old, he has become part of the family here and won the Long Distance Cup twice and the Ascot Gold Cup in a very fast record time, which is unlikely to be equalled, as well as the Ebor.

"He has won over £2 million in prize-money and remained at the top of his game this year when second in the Ascot Gold Cup, beaten a head giving 1lb to the winner.

"He will be retired to Wood Ditton Stud, where Godolphin have wonderful facilities that he knows well having been there for holiday.

"For all of us at Clarehaven Stables, just like Stradivarius, Trawlerman has become a much-loved member of the family and there are a lot of people here who will miss him particularly Ben de Paiva, who looks after him and Richard Wilkinson, who rode him through most of his career."

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BACIO TAKES ON SOME OF EUROPE'S BEST SPRINTERS IN NUNTHORPE

American trainer Wesley Ward will send out **Bacio** (Maclean's Music) in Friday's G1 Coolmore **City of Troy** Nunthorpe Stakes at York on Friday.

One of 20 to have stood their ground, the three-old-old has won four-of-five starts, culminating in Royal Ascot's Palace of Holyroodhouse Handicap in June. His task will not be an easy one, as the globetrotting multiple Group 1 winner **Asfoora** (Flying Artie makes her career finale on Friday. She won the 2025 edition of the Nunthorpe on the Knavesmire.

Francis-Henri Graffard's **Rayevka** (Blue Point) will add some French flavour, and Noriyuki Hori's Japanese sprinter **Satono Reve** (Lord Kanaloa) continues his European campaign.

American Affair (Washington DC) enters fresh off of his G2 King George Stakes victory at Goodwood for Jim Goldie, and, as expected, exciting juvenile **Pershaada** (Persian Force) will face her elders on Friday for Richard Hannon. The filly won the G3 Molecomb Stakes at Goodwood. Aidan O'Brien fields G1 King

Charles III Stakes hero **Mission Central** (**No Nay Never**) and **Brussels** (Wootton Bassett).
